## McKEON RESIGNS AS NYRA

**PRESIDENT** Jerry McKeon, who has served the longest term as President of the New York Racing Association in its history, announced his resignation yesterday. A native of Brooklyn, New York, McKeon joined NYRA in 1971 as internal auditor and held a variety of positions at NYRA until being elected president Feb. 22, 1982. "This is something I've been thinking about for some time," said McKeon in a press conference yesterday. "There have been a number of changes in my life in recent years. I have a number of interests outside of racing I would like to pursue and now I'll be able to do that." McKeon, 52, will continue on until a successor is found. "Jerry is the most knowledgeable racing executive in the country and has spent more than two decades giving his best to NYRA," said NYRA Chairman Allan Dragone, who emphasized that McKeon's decision was strictly his own.

**FLOODS CANCEL HOUSTON CARD** Wednesday night racing at Sam Houston Race Park in Houston was cancelled due to area flooding. "Our Wednesday night program had 71 horses scheduled to race, but many of the horses were 'ship-ins,'" said General Manager Jim Murphy. "We realized that horsemen were going to have a difficult time getting to the track, so naturally, we were concerned for the safety of the horsemen and horses getting here." Despite the violent rains that have pounded southeast Texas for four days killing at least eight people and driving 10,000 to area shelters, the facility and racing surfaces have been virtually unaffected, said Murphy.

## FLAWLESSLY TO SKIP YELLOW RIBBON

Trainer Charlie Whittingham seemed certain yesterday that **Aube Indienne (FR)** (Bluebird) and not **Flawlessly (Affirmed)** will represent him in the GI Yellow Ribbon Stakes November 6 at Santa Anita. "Flawlessly doesn't like this racetrack too well and I don't want to take a chance with her," said Whittingham. "I think I will skip the Yellow Ribbon because this turf doesn't suit her and I don't want her going out on a bad note if I can help it. She loves to run at Hollywood Park and she hasn't got too many more races to run in." News Continued, p.2

**ALCIBIADES S.-GII, \$100,000a, 2yo, f, 8.5f**  
Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who has won the Alcibiades a record four times, is expected to send off the strong twosome of **Cat Appeal** (Storm Cat) and **Lilly Capote** (Capote). Cat Appeal, who worked a half-mile in :49 4/5 at Churchill Downs Tuesday, won the Kentucky Cup Juvenile Fillies at Turfway Park Sept. 24. Lilly Capote took last Wednesday's Indian Summer S. at Keeneland by 10 lengths. Pat Day will ride Cat Appeal, while Jerry Bailey will have the mount on Lilly Capote. Alcibiades candidate **Morris Code** (Lost Code), third in the Kentucky Cup Juvenile Fillies, will be ridden by Shane Sellers.

## Sunday, Keeneland:

**BREEDERS' FUTURITY-GII, \$100,000a, 2yo, 8 1/2f**  
A field of at least 10 is shaping up. Pat Day is slated to ride **Lord Carson** (Carson City), four-length winner of the Fort Springs S. last Thursday at Keeneland. Jockey Willie Martinez will be aboard Nick Zito-trainee **Star Standard** (Risen Star), and Shane Sellers has the call on **Middle Man** (Meadowlake). **Mighty Magee** (Cormorant), trained by Leon Blusiewicz, won a seven-furlong maiden race in his second career start at Keeneland Saturday. "I think he's an exceptionally nice horse," said Blusiewicz. Undefeated **Bushwacker** (Gulch), winner of an Oct. 8 allowance at Keeneland, will not run in the Breeders' Futurity as expected, said trainer Larry Kelly. The colt has a shin problem. "I don't think it'd be fair to him to run Sunday," Kelly said. "I'm going to give him a little time."

## SOVIET PROBLEM, VAUDEVILLE TO

**BREEDERS' CUP** Northern California will have two representatives in the Nov. 5 Breeders' Cup at Churchill Downs. **Soviet Problem** (Moscow Ballet), who overcame a troubled start to win Saturday's \$200,000 Laurel Dash by 1 1/4-lengths, will be supplemented to the Sprint at a cost of \$120,000, exactly what she earned in the Laurel Dash. The four-year-old filly will attempt to become the first California-bred to win a Breeders' Cup event. Chris McCarron has the mount. **Vaudeville** (Theatrical {IRE}), beaten a neck in the GI \$500,000 Turf Classic at Belmont Oct. 8, arrived at Churchill Downs Monday to prepare for the Breeders' Cup Turf. "Right now, it looks like we're running," said trainer Fordell Fierce. "We have to pay the \$20,000 (pre-entry fee) Monday, so we're going to work him Monday morning." Regular rider Gary Stevens is scheduled to ride.

## GRAND LODGE JOINS CUP TEAM

**Grand Lodge** (Chief's Crown), narrowly beaten in Saturday's Champion S. at Newmarket, has emerged as a surprise possible for the Breeders' Cup. Connections of the colt, expected to retire to stud after his short-head defeat by Dernier Empereur, are now talking about preparing him for a crack at the Classic. Grand Lodge is among approximately 30 European-based horses whose handlers are hoping for spots in Breeders' Cup events. Joining him on the latecomer's list is **East of the Moon** (Private Account), the second foal out of two-time Breeders' Cup Mile champion Miesque. Francois Boutin, trainer of the dual classic-winning three-year-old filly, said, "Mr. Niarchos (her owner) will decide whether she runs in America when I speak to him this weekend. But she is very well and I would like to go." Meanwhile, Jeff Smith, owner/breeder of the Sprint-bound **Lochsong** (GB) (Song {GB}), has announced that the six-year-old mare will not run on medication in what could easily be her final start before being mated with Danzig.

## FURIOUSLY ARRIVES AT VINERY

Mr. and Mrs. Ben P. Walden Jr.'s Vinery announced yesterday the arrival of **Furiously** (Danzig) at their Midway, Kentucky farm. The Shug McGaughey trainee took his first three starts by a combined 31 lengths, and went on to win the GI Jerome H. and establish a new course record of 1:39 3/5 for 1 1/16-miles on the turf while taking the GIII Oceanport H. at Monmouth. "This is a very exciting day for us," said Walden. "Furiously represents a very dynamic stallion prospect and having him arrive here today makes all the hard work involved in securing him worth the effort." Furiously, who retires with earnings of \$457,228, was acquired by a partnership headed by the Waldens, which includes the Brady family's Mill House Stable, Edward P. Evans, W.T. Young, John D. Stuart and John R. Gaines. The horse will stand for a fee of \$7,500 live foal.

**TURTLE ISLAND RETIRED** Turtle Island (Fairy King), runaway winner of this year's Irish 2000 Guineas, has been retired to Coolmore Stud. The three-year-old colt, successful in six of his 13 career outings, has been plagued by a viral infection in recent weeks and owner Robert Sangster has decided not to risk racing him again.

**C.T.H.S. SALE SHOWS GAINS** The Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society, British Columbia Division, held its Fall Mixed Sale in Vancouver Oct. 17. Topping the bidding at \$12,500 was a weanling chestnut colt by Gallant Best--Crimsonator (Decimator). Named Canhebe Gallant, the colt, a half-brother to current three-time stakes-winning two-year-old A.J. Jett (Jett Sett Joe), was consigned to the sale by Hank Feenstra and purchased by Jim Whyte of Vancouver. Overall, 82 horses were sold for a total of \$214,400 and an average of \$2,614.63, up from last year's average of \$2,598.
