FINAL RESULTS FROM TATTERSALLS Despite a drop in both the gross and the average for the just-concluded Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale, Chairman Edmond Mahony said, "There have been a number of encouraging elements in the Sale. The clearance rate stood up well, prices have been satisfactory and the number of overseas buyers has been especially pleasing. We have seen a significant number of new faces at the Sale, and particularly keen interest from countries where racing is developing, such as in the Far East and Scandinavia. The renewed interest from North American buyers has further confirmed the Sale's international appeal." A total of 779 horses sold for 6,870,270 guineas in 1994, down less than 1 percent from last year when 675 lots went for 6,924,390 guineas; the '94 average of 6,419 guineas was down 37 percent from the '93 average of 10,258 guineas.

VINTAGE CROP OKAY FOR MELBOURNE CUP *Vintage Crop (Ire)* (Rousillon) now seems virtually certain to make the line-up for next Tuesday's \$2 million Melbourne Cup. The dual Irish St. Leger hero, hot favorite to score a second successive victory in Australia's biggest race until sustaining a foreleg injury Monday, appears to have escaped any infection and is recovering rapidly. "The overall picture is very good," said trainer Dermot Weld. "Fitness is not a major problem. The biggest worry is his health and how much the injury has taken out of him. But we plan to work him Sunday and that will be his final preparation for the race."

DESERT MIRAGE UNLIKELY TO RACE AGAIN Thursday's surgery on two-year-old *Desert Mirage* (Skywalker) revealed extensive ligament damage as well as a fractured right front sesamoid. "There's about a five or 10 percent chance he'll race again," said trainer Jim Buss of the colt, who was three times stakes-placed without breaking his maiden. "The sesamoid bone looks all right, they can fix that. But he detached some ligaments, and the prognosis just isn't very good." X-rays will be sent to specialists to determine if there is any chance of repairing the ligaments, but Buss added that the situation is not life-threatening.

Mile: Lazy Lane Farm's Ocean Crest (Storm Bird), winner of the Del Mar Derby, went an easy three-quarters in 1:19 Friday at Churchill with Shane Sellers in the irons. "We weren't looking for a blistering work," said trainer Frank Brothers. "He worked well within himself the whole way." Laffit Pincay Jr. will be in the saddle Breeders' Cup Day.

Sprint: American Chance (Cure the Blues) went six furlongs in 1:14 over the Louisville oval yesterday. "He seemed to get a good hold of the track," said his conditioner, David Carroll. "He finished up strong. Pat (Day) kept him off the rail a good ways so he could get a good feel for the track, and he punched home strong." Carroll added that the five-year-old would blow out for the race Thursday. "He's been feeling good," he remarked. "He seems to be getting stronger as the year's gone along, and his races seem to be getting better. Hopefully he can hold up for one more race." Winner of the GI Forego H. at Saratoga, American Chance was runner-up in the GI Vosburgh in his last start.
