CHARITIES SHARE THE WEALTH IN

CALIFORNIA The California Horse Racing Board has approved the distribution of \$508,500 in charity day proceeds from the Santa Anita Foundation. Among the beneficiaries are the United Way (Los Angeles), which received \$300,000; the Don MacBeth Memorial Fund, \$10,000; the Shoemaker Foundation, \$5,000; and the Winners Foundation, \$20,000. The Board also approved \$263,000 in contributions from the Oak Tree Foundation, including \$3,800 to the Racetrack Chaplaincy of America and \$8,300 to the California Thoroughbred Horsemen's Foundation. A total of 120 charities benefitted from the donations by the two companies.

CHBPA/TOC TO DIVIDE ASSETS Ed Friendly, the president of the California Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association who will resign the post December 31 in order to serve solely as president of the Thoroughbred Owners of California, announced that the TOC and the CHBPA directors and membership have approved a plan to divide CHBPA cash assets with two-thirds going to the TOC and one-third being retained by the CHBPA. These assets include a \$337,000 reserve and possibly another \$200,000, depending on the final resolution of a legal matter.

LADY BEAVERBROOK DIES IN ENGLAND

The Dowager Lady Beaverbrook, one of Britain's most successful owner/breeders, has died. She was 84. Among the horses to have carried her colours were Bustino, winner of the '74 St. Leger; Minister Son, who captured the '88 edition of that race; Mystiko, victorious in the '91 2000 Guineas; and MSW Terimon, who was second in the Epsom Derby at 500-1. Clive Brittain, who has trained the Lady B string for many years, said, "She will be a big loss to racing. We spoke at least once a day about her horses; she was a marvelous lady."

CLASSIC: Three-year-old **Concern** (Broad Brush) worked a mile at Pimlico yesterday morning; trainer Richard Small timed his colt in 1:38 4/5 and was pleased with the breeze. "He's looking very good right now; he couldn't be doing any better," said Small. "He's been getting stronger all year long. He's just getting into stride." Multi-millionaire **Best Pal** (Habitony) went a sharp half-mile at Santa Anita Monday in :46 3/5. He is scheduled to be flown to Louisville today.

The Angle: A total of 14 horses have taken a second crack at the Breeders' Cup Classic after losing in their first attempt, but only one has been successful. Alysheba was second in the '87 edition, and the winner in '88. Three definite starters for 1994 were in the gate last year: **Bertrando** (Skywalker), 2nd; **Devil His Due** (Devil's Bag), 8th; and **Best Pal** (Habitony), 10th; sixth alternate **Kissin Kris** (Kris S.), was 3rd in '93.

TURF: **River North** (Lomond), winner of the GI Arak Pokal in Germany in August, will miss the race after suffering a training injury. "He's knocked himself and, while it is nothing serious, it has happened too close to the race," said his trainer, Lady Herries. "We will put him away for next season." The colt, who had replaced the injured Bright Moon in the line-up, will himself be replaced by Epsom Oaks winner **Intrepidity** (Sadler's Wells). The regally bred filly **Dahlia's Dreamer** (Theatrical {Ire}), part of the three-horse Bill Mott entry with favorite **Paradise Creek** (Irish River {Fr}) and '92 winner **Fraise** (Strawberry Road {Aus}), worked six furlongs in 1:14 over the Churchill turf yesterday. Turf Classic runner-up **Vaudeville** (Theatrical {Ire}) went five furlongs over the same course in 1:03 2/5. "Just what we wanted," said trainer Fordell Fierce. "I got him in :11 1/5 for the final eighth."

The Angle: Trainer Bill Mott is set to saddle three runners this year; nine trainers have sent out entries of two or more horses in the previous 10 runnings of the race, with two visiting the winner's circle afterwards, but the two Turf entries comprised of more than two horses--Charlie Whittingham's three-horse team in '87 and Andre Fabre's five-horse squad last year--failed to hit the board entirely. DISTAFF: **Miss Dominique** (Private Account) had her final workout yesterday, going five furlongs in 1:02. The five-year-old has been at Churchill for seven weeks. "She loves it here," said trainer Alex Hassinger.

The Scoop: Four-year-olds have won four of the 10 runnings of the Distaff; three-year-olds have taken three; five-year-olds have won twice; and one six-year-old has been victorious--but all of the winning older mares have been Argentine-breds trained by Ron McAnally--Bayakoa ('89, '90); and Paseana ('92). Neither McAnally nor Argentina will be represented in this year's running.

JUVENILE: **Tejano Run** (Tejano) worked three furlongs in :37 1/5 Monday. **Western Echo** (Eastern Echo) arrived at Churchill yesterday. The colt is looking for his third straight win; he took the Laurel Futurity with blinkers added last time out. "I know we're a longshot, but I feel we have a chance," said trainer Buddy Delp. "I wouldn't be coming if we didn't." **Sierra Diablo** (Conquistador Cielo) breezed five furlongs in 1:01 yesterday. The colt will have Eddie Delahoussaye in the saddle for the second time in the Juvenile, his third different rider in his last three starts. Delahoussaye rode the two-year-old to victory in his career debut. **Pineing Patty** (Country Pine) worked five furlongs in 1:02 1/5 for new connections Lynn Whiting and W. Cal Partee. Moet Champagne winner **Timber Country** (Woodman) went a solid six furlongs in 1:13 with jockey Pat Day aboard yesterday. "I wanted to give him something to keep his attention early, and then let him finish up," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "I was really pleased." **Strong Ally** (Tremolino) also went three-quarters; he was timed in 1:13 1/5. "He is improving fast; I think he's going to run a big race here," said trainer Dick Mulhall. "He's got such a big, powerful stride. I think he's going to love this track."

The Angle: Only two of the 10 Juvenile winners have won with blinkers on; Tasso ('85, 5-1) and Is It True ('88, 9-1); the last five have all been hoodless. Thirteen colts went postward in 1987, but not one was equipped with blinkers.

MILE: **Lure** (Danzig) would make history with a third victory here. "I like the way he is coming up to the Mile," said trainer Shug McGaughey. "Don't let the fact that he lost the Kelso bother you too much. Sure, we wanted to win that race, but two years ago he lost the Kelso before he won his first Mile at Gulfstream Park."

The Scoop: Jenine Sahadi, who will saddle **Megan's Interco** (Interco) Saturday, could become the first woman trainer to take a Breeders' Cup event. This will be Sahadi's second Breeders' Cup starter; her Juvenile runner **Creston** finished 11th and last in 1993.

JUVENILE FILLIES: Overbrook Farm's **Cat Appeal** (Storm Cat) worked five-eighths in 1:02 4/5 with jockey Donna Barton in the irons Monday; Barton will be aboard the filly Saturday, becoming the second woman to ride in the Breeders' Cup. **Miss Golden Circle** (Crafty Prospector) will not run, and instead will point for a stake at Aqueduct. **Noraquilon** (Deputy Minister) will also miss the race, due to a bruised left front foot. Trainer Mike Orman has been working overtime at the barn; Orman has been acting as his Juvenile Fillies hopeful **Mama Mucci's** (Regal Classic) groom because her regular caretaker missed his flight from California. "I figured I would be able to find a groom here, but everyone is busy," said the conditioner. "But I don't mind. It's nothing I haven't done before."

The Scoop: When **Bo Cheryl** (Beau Genius) captured the Princess Elizabeth S. at Woodbine at 47-1, she gave her trainer, Donald Drake, his first stakes win in 35 years. "I won five or so in '59 and '60, but haven't won any since. I guess I just haven't had the right stock," said Drake.

SPRINT: Vosburgh winner **Harlan** (Storm Cat) worked five furlongs Monday in 1:00, while stablemate **Chimes Band** (Dixieland Band) went the same distance in :59 4/5. **Prenup** (Smarten) worked a half-mile in :48 for trainer Mark Hennig. **End Sweep** (Forty Niner), recent dead-heat winner of the Highlander S. at Woodbine, went a sharp half in :47 1/5 yesterday. Richard Migliore will be up on the three-year-old Saturday. "Richard is an excellent gate rider, and this horse is a little sluggish away from the gate," said trainer Mark Casse. "(Migliore) is also a great finisher, and (End Sweep) needs a strong finisher on him. He tends to do just what he has to do to win."

The Angle: The Vosburgh is the only race to have produced more than one winner of the race; two sprinters have prepped in Belmont's GI event, but neither won it. Gulch was second in 1988; Dancing Spree was fourth in 1989. The first four finishers in this year's edition will all start in the Sprint; they are, from the top down, **Harlan**, **American Chance** (Cure the Blues), **Cherokee Run** (Runaway Groom) and **Birdonthewire** (Proud Birdie).
