JEUNE TAKES MELBOURNE CUP **Jeune (GB)** (Kalaglow), a 20-1 shot owned by Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum and trained by David Hayes, proved a convincing winner of the G1 Foster's Melbourne Cup at Flemington, Australia Tuesday. The British-bred led one and a half furlongs from home and comfortably held off the challenge of **Paris Lane** (Persian Heights). The official margin of victory was a length and three-quarters. **Oompala** (Kampala) finished third, beaten a further short neck, but last year's hero **Vintage Crop** (Rousillon) faded in the final straight and could manage no better than seventh. Hayes, who saddled three others in the field of 24, said, "It's very exciting. The winner has hit form at just the right time." Jeune took part in the two-mile event only after it was learned he was not on the short-list of invitations for the Japan Cup November 27. However, Hayes is hoping that, following this latest win, he may gain promotion from the substitute nominations.

EUROPEANS ARRIVE FOR BREEDERS' CUP The charter flight from Beauvais Airport, near Paris, carrying 13 Breeders' Cup hopefuls, touched down in Louisville Monday afternoon after an 11 1/2-hour flight. The French runners were expected to clear quarantine late Tuesday. **Millkom (GB)** (Cyrano de Bergerac) (Classic), who suffered his first defeat in 11 starts in the Arc last out, was accompanied on the flight by his trainer, Jean-Claude Rouget, and travelled alone in a three-horse box. "That's not unusual for a horse who can be difficult or is a bad traveller," said John Shortell, general manager of the shipping company, Mersant Int'l. "He travelled well, just like all of them." A flight from Stansted Airport near Newmarket was expected in Louisville Tuesday evening; it is carrying 10 Breeders' Cup runners from England including sprinter **Lochsong (GB)** (Song {GB}).

HOLLYWOOD AUTUMN FESTIVAL TO FEATURE FRIDAY NIGHT RACING Friday night racing, featured at Hollywood Park's spring/summer meetings, will be a fixture at the 1994 Autumn Festival meeting. The 34-day stand begins Wednesday, Nov. 9 and continues through Sat., Dec. 24. First post time Fridays will be 6:45 p.m., with gates opening at 4:45 p.m. The lone exception is Friday, Nov. 25, the day after Thanksgiving, when post time is 4 p.m.

Correction: It was reported in yesterday's TDN that jockey Donna Barton, set to ride Cat Appeal in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Saturday, would become the second woman to ride in the event. In fact, she will be the third. Julie Krone became the first, guiding Darby Shuffle to a second-place finish in the 1988 Juvenile Fillies. She has had a total of seven Breeders' Cup mounts. Francine Villeneuve was, in fact, the second; Villeneuve was aboard Wilderness Song when she finished seventh in the '91 Distaff.

CLASSIC: Molson Million winner **Dramatic Gold** (Slew o' Gold) worked six furlongs from the five-eighths to the seven-eighths pole yesterday, getting the distance in 1:14. Classic colt **Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat) also had his final prep for the big event, going five furlongs in 1:00 with Pat Day up. "We use a target with him every time he works because he has not been a real stellar work horse and he has a tendency once he gets by the work mate to kind of lighten up a little bit," said Day. "But today, the work horse and a couple of other horses got with us coming off the turn; (Tabasco Cat) went by them inside the eighth pole and it was just like he was looking at the wire. He never slowed down, never hesitated. He went right on about his business. That shows how he has matured."

The Scoop: Encouraged by the victory of 133-1 shot Arcangues in last year's Classic, five European runners are set to challenge the Americans in this year's edition, the largest foreign contingent for the race ever. A total of 11 Classic runners have had their final prep for the race in Europe, with one win, one second and one third, an on-the-board average of 27 percent. The average odds for a European invader in the Classic: 72-1. The English colt Rodrigo De Triano was the most fancied of the group, but finished 14th and last in 1992 at 6-1.

JUVENILE: R.L. Sanford's unbeaten **Evansville Slew** (Slew City Slew) put in his final prep for the Juvenile yesterday at Churchill Downs, going three-eighths in :37 and galloping out the half in :49 1/5. Regular jockey Perry Compton was up. Evansville Slew ran his record to five-for-five with a 4-length victory in the Oct. 23 Remington Futurity. "We wanted to run that race without going to the bottom of the tank, because this race was in a couple of weeks," said trainer Donnie Von Hemel. "He (Compton) didn't have to ask him for his life to win that race. His blood count was the same coming out of the race as it was going in." Mike Smith will replace Robert Landry as the rider of **Talkin Man** (With Approval) on Breeders' Cup Day. "Actually, that was the plan all along," said trainer Roger Attfield. **Western Echo** (Eastern Echo) stepped on the Churchill racing strip for the first time Tues. morning, galloping 1 5/8-miles. "He handled it well. The exercise rider said he was smooth as silk," said trainer Bud Delp. **Cinch** (Temperence Hill) clocked 1:02 4/5 for five furlongs yesterday. Craig Perret, who will ride Sat., was in the irons. "He worked good," said trainer Carl Nafzger. "He finished good. He did just what we wanted."

JUVENILE FILLIES: Trainer Scotty Schulhofer, bidding for his third Breeders' Cup win, sent out **Stormy Blues** (Cure the Blues) for a five-furlong breeze in 1:00 4/5 yesterday at Churchill. The early favorite for the race, **Flanders** (Seeking the Gold) went the same distance in 1:01 2/5 with jockey Pat Day aboard. "She worked well and got over the ground a little better this morning than she did last week," said Day. The other undefeated filly in the field, **Honky Tonk Tune** (Cure the Blues) also worked five furlongs, going in 1:03 with stablemate King Ruckus. Fellow Canadian **Bo Cheryl** (Beau Genius) arrived Tuesday, while Florida-bred **Fortune Pending** (Fortunate Prospect) was scheduled to ship in later in the day. **Lilly Capote** (Capote), part of the four-horse Team Lukas entry, worked a half-mile in :48 2/5; stablemate **Serena's Song** (Rahy) went a sharp five-eighths in 1:00. **The Scoop:** Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who has won more Breeders' Cup races than any other conditioner with 10 victories, has been absent from the winner's circle on racing's championship day since Steinlen's Mile triumph in 1989. Lukas had just two runners last year, finishing fifth with Stellar Cat in the Juvenile Fillies and third with Tabasco Cat in the Juvenile. But he had confidence in his ability to bounce back. "I think you'll see us back next year with the two-year-olds like we had in the mid-80's. We're down this year, but I feel positive about turning it around," said Lukas before the '93 Breeders' Cup. The words have proved prophetic; Team Lukas will have the favorites for both the Juvenile (Timber Country) and the Juvenile Fillies (Flanders, part of that four-horse entry); in all, they will be represented by eight runners Saturday.

SPRINT: **Meritocrat** (On to Glory), winner of five of six lifetime starts including a wire-to-wire score in the Gill Boojum H. at Belmont in his last, breezed five furlongs in 1:01 3/5 Tuesday at Churchill Downs in his final preparation for the Sprint. "The work was beautiful," said trainer Ben Perkins Sr. "He's coming up to the race real good and we couldn't ask for anything more." With Shane Sellers up, **King Ruckus** (Bold Ruckus) went five furlongs in 1:03 yesterday. The four-year-old gelding will be shooting for his fourth straight stakes victory. "Shane said he liked the track and felt good under him," said assistant trainer Ken Barber. **The Scoop:** Trainer Mark Casse said yesterday that "everything is in line now" with his Sprint contender **End Sweep** (Forty Niner). That was in reference to the fact the three-year-old has bitten one of the hands that feeds him. "He almost bit my thumb off just before the Kentucky Cup Sprint (which he won), and bit (groom) Mitch Downs' hand before he won the Highlander (at Woodbine)," said Casse. "He got (hot walker) John Cox Sunday, so we've found our sacrificial lamb for the Breeders' Cup."

MILE: **Megan's Interco** (Interco) blew out for the race in :36 4/5 over the main track yesterday. He is set to school in the paddock today. **Dominant Prospect** (Fortunate Prospect) went a half-mile around the dogs on the Churchill turf in :49 3/5. "We got him the last eighth in :11 1/5," said trainer Gary Sciacca. "I think he'll like this course and that's why we decided to take a shot at Lure. He's got a little gas to him and he'll be one-two-three on the lead. The turns here are tight. If he can have a good position turning for home, he'll be tough." **The Scoop:** Trainer Luca Cumani has done everything possible to insure that **Barathea (IRE)** (Sadler's Wells) will negotiate the first turn at Churchill better than he did the bend at Santa Anita a year ago. Peter Amos, who manages the 90 miles of gallops at Newmarket, called the Louisville oval and got the exact dimensions of the first turn, then constructed one exactly like it at Newmarket. "We've had Barathea go around that bend several times and he handled it quite well," said Cumani. The trainer added that a major factor in the bearing-out problem last year was, "he was up on the bridle as they came in to the turn. We want him to relax this year; we don't want to send him." Frankie Dettori will ride the colt for the first time this year Saturday.

DISTAFF: Sky Beauty (Blushing Groom {Fr}), undefeated this year, schooled in the gate Tuesday. The four-year-old was fifth in last year's running. **Link River** (Gone West) worked five furlongs in 1:00 3/5 Tuesday. The filly scored her first stakes win in the GI John A. Morris H. in the slop at Saratoga this past August. "I felt, bringing her here, if it came up muddy, it would increase her chances," said trainer Bill Mott.

The Angle: Favorites have dominated the Distaff. There have been eight favorites at less than even-money in the 10 runnings of the race, and six have won. The chalk has won seven of 10 editions, including **Hollywood Wildcat's** (Kris S.) popular score last year.

TURF: White Muzzle (GB) (Dancing Brave) breezed six furlongs over the Churchill turf yesterday, going in 1:18 3/5. "He felt real good," said exercise rider Angy Guarnieri. "He prefers softer ground, and the course here is pretty firm. We were hoping to get some of that rain they promised us, but it never happened." **Fraise** (Strawberry Road {Aus}) worked five furlongs on the grass Tuesday in 1:04 2/5; stablemate and favorite **Paradise Creek** (Irish River {Fr}) went the same distance in 1:02 1/5. Rothmans International winner **Raintrap** (GB) (Rainbow Quest) had his first-ever dirt workout yesterday, going five furlongs in 1:02 4/5. He will make his first start for trainer Bobby Frankel in the race.

The Scoop: Paradise Creek is making a bid for the Eclipse Award as champion turf horse and Horse of the Year. The winner of this race has been named tops in the division five out of 10 times—including two distaffers named champion turf mare. Last year, Kotashaan became the first Turf winner to be awarded Horse of the Year honors.

ECLIPSE MAY GO TO HOMEISTER Two years ago, Rosemary Homeister was runner-up in the balloting for the 1992 Eclipse Award as the nation's top apprentice, and she may be "put up" via disqualification after all. About a week and a half ago, Jesus Bracho, the winner of the Eclipse that year, relinquished his award to resolve a dispute that originated when it was discovered that he had ridden professionally in Venezuela and did not qualify to ride as an apprentice in the States. A final decision on whether the New Jersey-based Homeister will be given the award is expected as early as this week. If it is granted to her, it will be the first time the Eclipse Award for an Outstanding Apprentice is won by a female. "She could have enjoyed phenomenal success. After accomplishing so much in one year, it (the Eclipse Award) could have helped," said Homeister's agent Joe Didario.

CALIFORNIA FLIGHT ARRIVES SAFELY Four Breeders' Cup candidates, including Classic contenders **Best Pal** (*Habitony) and **Soul of the Matter** (Private Terms), were on a flight that arrived in Louisville from California yesterday. The horses arrived at Churchill Downs at 1 p.m. "Everybody shipped well," said Mike Hargrave, stall superintendent at the Downs. Distaff-bound **Exchange** (Explodent), trained by Bill Spawr, and Mile candidate **Blues Traveller** (IRE) (Bluebird), trained by Rodney Rash, were also on the flight.
