Clement L. Hirsch's **Magical Maiden** (Lord Avie), who made her turf debut a winning one in last Sunday's Louis R. Rowan H. at Oak Tree, is expected to wheel back in seven days and run in the Yellow Ribbon. Gary Stevens, her regular rider, is already committed to La Presle Farm's **Corrazona** (El Gran Senor), but trainer Mel Stute has named Alex Solis to ride **Magical Maiden**. A full field is expected, including as many as three provisional invitees: **Fondly Remembered** (Skywalker) and possibly **Chesa Plana** (GB) (Niniski), **Mz. Zill Bear** (Salutely) and French invader **Freckling Shadows** (IRE) (Lomond). HOLY BULL ARRIVES AT GULFSTREAM Holy Bull (Great Above) arrived Wednesday at Gulfstream Park. The six-time Grade I winner was vanned without incident from Keeneland. Holy Bull will be walked twice a day until he goes to the track between Nov. 15 and Nov. 20 to resume training for his return as a four-year-old. "His first big race will be in the Donn Handicap Feb. 11, but he will make his first start in the new year in the \$50,000 Olympic H. (seven furlongs) January 22," said owner-trainer Jimmy Croll.

RETAMA INSTALLS TURF COURSE Retama Park added the color green to its track this week as over one-half million square feet of "Zoyboy" zoysia grass sod is being unrolled to form the seven-eighths mile turf course and an eighth-mile chute. Retama Park, the \$79 million racetrack under construction in San Antonio, Texas, selected the new type of grass at the recommendation of landscape architect Larry Clark and track consultant Bob Miles, retired track superintendent of Garden State Park.

Salerno's Questroyal Farm and Sheikh Maktoum al Maktoum's Gainsborough Farm. **Comet Shine**, by Fappiano--Hangin' On A Star (Vice Regent), was the Champion Two-Year-Old Colt in Canada in 1993. The three-year-old will stand at Contemporary Stallions, Inc. for a fee of \$3,500. New York-bred star **Thunder Rumble**, by Thunder Puddles--Lyphette (Lyphard), is now standing at James F. Edwards' Stallion Park in Millbrook, NY. The five-year-old, who won the Gil Jim Dandy, GI Travers S. and the 1994 Saratoga Cup for earnings of \$1,047,552, will stand for \$5,000. **Tank's Number**, by Tank's Prospect--Margaret's Number, joins the stallion ranks at Highcliff Farm. Bred by Bright View Farm and Eugene V. Klein, the two-time stakes-winner's stud fee is \$2,000.
