CHURCHILL STEWARDS RULE AGAINST JOCKEY EMBLEMS The Churchill Downs Board of Stewards met yesterday morning with representatives of The Jockey's Guild, Churchill Downs Inc. and the Breeders' Cup. The subject of the meeting was to discuss jockey's apparel, specifically an emblem to be worn on Breeders' Cup Day. The meeting was called after The Jockey's Guild announced Wednesday that this Saturday, November 5, jockeys throughout the nation will wear the number 47 on their silks in honor of America's 47 permanently disabled jockeys. After deliberating yesterday, the Churchill Downs stewards concluded that Kentucky Administrative Regulations would be traditionally enforced, and jockeys who individually elect to wear the emblem at the Louisville track may be subject to disciplinary action. The reason for wearing the emblem is that The Jockeys' Guild insurance fund, part of a contractual agreement between the Guild and the Thoroughbred Racing Association, expires December 31, 1994. The Guild has offered a proposal to the TRA that would assure continued adequate insurance coverage for jockeys, but no agreement has yet been reached.

RICK MOORE NAMED EXECUTIVE VP AND GENERAL MANAGER OF HOOSIER PARK Rick Moore has been named Executive Vice President and General Manager of Hoosier Park, L.P., according to Jeffrey M. Smith, president of Anderson Park Inc. Moore has served as interim General Manager of Hoosier Park at Anderson since Sept. 10. Moore will oversee operations at Hoosier Park, Indiana's first pari-mutuel racetrack which opened September 1, 1994, as well as the state's four off-site wagering facilities which are being developed in conjunction with Hoosier Park.

CLASSIC: Derby winner **Go for Gin** (Cormorant), winless since victory on the first Saturday in May, will try to run his record at Churchill to two-for-two. The three-year-old schooled in the paddock Thursday. "Don't leave him out of your triples," said trainer Nick Zito. **Flag Down** (Deputy Minister), looking for his first dirt win after finishing third in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in his main track debut, blew out down the Churchill stretch Thursday morning. "I let him run down the lane for two furlongs," said Helen Scoriah, who was aboard for the move. "He was pretty sharp, but I had him in hand. I wanted to keep some gas in the tank." **Concern** (Broad Brush), the only Classic contender not yet on the grounds, was scheduled to leave Pimlico yesterday for a 12-hour van ride. **Devil His Due** (Devil's Bag) breezed a half-mile in :48 yesterday morning. Trainer Allen Jerkens commented on his competitor's post position, 14. "The one good thing about it is that he won't be standing in the starting gate as long as some of the others. He's actually got a good run to the first turn to get in good position, and Mike Smith is an experienced rider." **The Angle:** Derby winners have competed in the Classic a total of eight times, with a record of four wins, a second and a third. The only Derby winner who did not hit the board in the Classic was **Strike the Gold**, trained by Nick Zito, who was fifth as a three-year-old and eighth as a four-year-old. Two Derby winners have taken the Classic the same year: **Sunday Silence** ('89) and **Unbridled** ('90).

TURF: **Celtic Arms** (Comrade in Arms) worked an easy five furlongs in 1:06 3/5 around the dogs in company with Mile runner **Bigstone** yesterday. **Paradise Creek** (Irish River {Fr}), **Fraise** (Strawberry Road {Aust}) and **Vaudeville** (Theatrical {Ire}), three of the four American runners schooled in the paddock Wednesday afternoon; the fourth, **Dahlia's Dreamer** (Theatrical {Ire}) was scheduled to do the same yesterday afternoon.

The Scoop: There are only four American representatives in this year's Turf, and all four are by foreign-bred sires. The only American-breds sired by American-breds in this year's edition have all been running in Europe; they are **Dernier Empereur** (Tremolino), **Only Royale** (Caerleon) and **Tikkanen** (Cozzene). DISTAFF: Dispute (Danzig), part of the Shug McGaughey entry, has developed an abscess in her right front foot and may have to be scratched. "We have taken x-rays and they don't indicate there is any major problem," said McGaughey. "I'm hoping that it is just a bruise or a pus pocket and that it can be cleaned up by (Friday). If it isn't, of course, she comes out." Stablemate **Heavenly Prize** (Seeking the Gold) worked a bullet half-mile in :47 Thursday. **One Dreamer** (Relaunch) blew out three furlongs in :35. **Link River** (Gone West) schooled in the gate yesterday morning. "I wanted to make sure she's okay in there," said trainer Bill Mott. "She was bad at one time, but she's not any more."

The Angle: Only two Distaff winners have tried for a second consecutive victory in the race. Bayakoa pulled off the double in '89 and '90; Paseana had to settle for second, beaten just a nose last year after winning in '92. **Hollywood Wildcat** (Kris S.), the spoiler in '93, will try for the repeat this year.

JUVENILE: Tejano Run (Tejano) has been stabled at Churchill since June, but has yet to start at the track. Trainer Kenny McPeck is looking forward to taking the home court advantage. "I think that's a big edge," he said. "He's not a good shipper, and every time he's run, we've had to put him on a van. He's a tough horse to load...he gets pretty rowdy. I'm glad we don't have to ship." Trainer Mark Hennig is a bit concerned about his colt's post position draw; Moet Champagne runner-up **Sierra Diablo** (Conquistador Cielo) will break from post 13. "He's going to need some good fortune to have a good trip," said Hennig. "He's never been two turns, and he might get confused out there. But nobody is better than Eddie (Delahoussaye) at being patient and knowing where to drop in. I'm happy I've got him in this situation." **Piney Patty** (County Pine) developed a fever Wednesday and will not start Saturday. Laurel Futurity winner **Western Echo** (Eastern Echo) blew out for the race yesterday, going three-eighths in :36 3/5. NBC Breeders' Cup analyst and former jockey Greg McCarron was aboard for the breeze.

The Angle: Timber Country (Woodman) will try to become the second Champagne S. winner to take the Juvenile; the only colt to score the double to date was Fly So Free, who won both races when the Breeders' Cup was held at Belmont in 1990. Two colts have come back from finishing second in the Champagne to win at the Breeders' Cup, including Team Lukas runner Is It True ('88). Lukas has won three of the 10 runnings of the Juvenile, but considers Timber Country his best bet yet. "It is always hard to compare a horse that hasn't won to ones that have," said Lukas, "but I feel better about (Timber Country) than any I have ever run in the Juvenile. I think he is the best horse I have ever run there. I like this horse a lot; this horse has got more potential than any of the others."

MILE: Two-time defending champ **Lure** (Danzig) breezed a half-mile on the turf yesterday, going in :49 2/5. "The turf course is hard and I was happy with the work," said trainer Shug McGaughey. He does like the surface at Churchill Downs. **Barathea** (Sadler's Wells) worked an easy five furlongs in 1:04 3/5 yesterday. **Dominant Prospect** (Fortunate Prospect) schooled in the gate yesterday morning and in the paddock yesterday afternoon. "I just want to make sure we have all the bases covered," said trainer Gary Sciacca. **Blues Traveller** (Bluebird) blew out on the turf yesterday, clocked in :38 4/5 for three furlongs around the dogs. **Alice Springs** (Val de l'Orne {Fr}) went five furlongs Thursday on the turf gallop at her home base in Pennsylvania; she was set to get on a van yesterday evening for the trip to Louisville. **Bigstone** (Last Tycoon {Ire}) cruised through five furlongs in 1:06 4/5 in company with Turf runner Celtic Arms yesterday. **East Of The Moon** (Private Account) breezed five-eighths in 1:02 3/5. **Distant View** (Mr. Prospector) popped out of the starting gate Thursday morning. "He broke very well," said his rider, Pat Eddery. "It was a good experience for him. He's not used to being held by a starter in the gate, and it was good for him to hear the bell go off." **The Scoop:** Should **Unfinished Symph** (Aloha Prospector) win the Mile, his trainer, Wesley Ward, 26, would become the youngest conditioner ever to saddle a Breeders' Cup winner. Phil Hauswald currently holds that distinction; Hauswald was 28 when he sent out Epitome to win the '87 Juvenile Fillies.

JUVENILE FILLIES: Call Now (Wild Again) will not start Saturday after coming down the a fever and a slight case of colic Wednesday night. "She's okay, but I don't want to take any chances," said trainer Ron McAnally. "We're sending her to Lexington (Thursday) morning to a clinic where they'll monitor her 24 hours a day. I just can't run her." **Mirielle** (Greinton) arrived from Hawthorne early Thursday morning. **Post It** (Notebook) schooled in the paddock Thursday morning. **Bo Cheryl** (Beau Genius) breezed a half-mile in :48 Thursday morning. "If that doesn't tighten the screw, then I spent 50 years in this business for nothing," said trainer Donald Drake.

SPRINT: Lochsong (Song {GB}) zipped through three furlongs in :33 2/5 from the half-mile pole to the eighth-pole with jockey Frankie Dettori in the irons yesterday morning; the mare galloped out a half-mile in :46. "She's fast from the first stride," said Dettori. "We were pleased she handled the dirt well, and she shows no signs of jet lag." **American Chance** (Cure the Blues) blew out three-eighths in :35 4/5. The Sprint will be the career finale for the five-year-old. **Meritocrat** (On to Glory), recently purchased for a reported \$1 million, will race in the colors of Sheikh Mohammed al Maktoum's Godolphin Racing for the first time Saturday. The Florida-bred will spend this winter in Dubai.

HONG KONG'S QUEEN ELIZABETH II CUP OPEN TO OVERSEAS ENTRIES With an eye towards promoting international interest in their racing, stewards of the Royal Hong Kong Jockey Club announced Thursday that the Queen Elizabeth II Cup, an 11-furlong event for three-year-olds and up worth approximately \$517,000, will for the first time be opened to overseas entries. A maximum of seven starters will be drawn from Australia, Dubai, Europe, Malaysia and Singapore, New Zealand, North America and Turkey. The race, scheduled for April 1, 1995, is restricted to horses that have not won a Grade I event; a selection committee comprising the Deputy Chairman, Chief Executive, Director of Racing and the Senior Handicapper of the Royal Hong Kong Jockey Club will decide on the list of invitees from both overseas and Hong Kong.

NOEL HICKEY BACK AT THE TRACK Owner/trainer Noel Hickey, who was suspended six months by stewards at Arlington International Racecourse after six of his horses tested positive for the prohibited bleeder medication albuterol, then had that suspension extended to a year when he appealed, was back at his Hawthorne Race Course barn Thursday after Cook County Circuit Court Judge Edwin Berman issued a stay of the suspension. The stay was just the latest chapter in the Hickey story. Last week, Judge Berman issued a ruling against the Illinois Racing Board, which had sought to stop Hickey from leasing out his horses during his suspension. After that decision, the Board ordered Hawthorne stewards to summon for questioning those leasing Hickey's horses. When one of the lessees, Mike Winston, failed to appear before the stewards due to a misunderstanding as to the date of the interview, the Board Wednesday ordered his suspension and refused his entry for Saturday's Carey Memorial H., Bantan. Jewel Klein, an attorney for Hickey, went back to court to ask that the Board be held in contempt; while Judge Berman has no power to act on the Winston ruling, he was disturbed by the Board's action and ordered the immediate stay of Hickey's suspension pending a final decision in December.

NEW YORK TO OFFER NATIONAL BEST SEVEN The New York Racing Association, the New York HBPA and the Thoroughbred Racing Association signed an agreement yesterday which should bring the National Best Seven wager to New York racing fans. The NYRA and the NY-HBPA have applied to the New York State Racing and Wagering Board for authorization to offer the Best Seven for wagering in New York. Assuming the Board approves, it is anticipated that the Best Seven will be available at New York outlets beginning Saturday, Nov. 12. The expected base wager will be \$1.00 at New York OTB's and 50 cents at NYRA tracks.

CHIEF HONCHO TO WINTERGREEN FARM MGSW Chief Honcho (Chief's Crown) has been moved to John J. Greely III's Wintergreen Farm in Midway, Kentucky. The seven-year-old, a who entered stud in 1994, earned \$1,265,000 during his career while winning from a mile to a mile and three-eighths.
