BREEDERS' CUP JOCKEYS WILL ABIDE BY RULING

Although visibly angered by the stewards' decision to ban the "47" patches recognizing the permanently disabled riders supported by the organization, leaders of the Jockeys' Guild said yesterday that the Breeders' Cup riders would comply with the edict. "We are very disappointed," said John Giovanni, national manager of the Guild. "We had intended this to be a tribute...not a protest or confrontation. But I have recommended to the jockeys that they don't challenge the ruling." Stewards in some other racing jurisdictions, including New York, will allow the patches to be worn on their riders' boots. The Thoroughbred Racing Association issued a brief statement from Commissioner Brian McGrath. "The TRA shares the concerns of the Jockeys' Guild for disabled jockeys, as do all members of the racing community. We should not, however, allow benefit negotiations to distract from the Breeders' Cup."

JAMES J. MURPHY RETURNS TO ATLANTIC CITY

Atlantic City Race Course Chairman of the Board Robert P. Levy announced Thursday that James J. Murphy will return as President and Chief Operating Officer of the southern New Jersey Thoroughbred racing facility. Murphy, who served in that capacity prior to his 1994 leave of absence to assist in the start-up operation of Sam Houston Race Park in Texas, is expected to resume his full-time duties effective January 1, 1995. Murphy officially resigned as General Manager of Sam Houston Race Park November 2. "We're thrilled to have him back full-time," said Levy. "There was always the expectation of Jim returning to Atlantic City at some point. Not only has Jim been instrumental in developing and improving the quality of Atlantic City's racing and simulcasting, he's also acknowledged as a respected industry leader in New Jersey and throughout the U.S."

Ogden Mills Phipps' **Dispute** (Danzig) was declared from the Distaff early Friday morning due to the abscess in her right front foot. "The swelling didn't go down from yesterday," said trainer Shug McGaughey. "She's pretty sore." Gil E.P. Taylor S. winner **Truly A Dream** (IRE) (Darshaan), attempting to become the first European-based horse to win the Distaff, breezed three furlongs in :37 3/5 yesterday. She will be joined in the gate by fellow foreigner **Erin Bird** (FR) (Bluebird), winner of four of her seven starts and looking for her fourth in a row. The three-year-old schooled in the starting gate yesterday. **Exchange** (Explodent) worked three-eighths in :36 Friday, galloping out the half-mile in :49 2/5 with exercise rider Hector Molina in the saddle.

Jerry Brown's Thorograph Analysis:

The Distaff is being touted as a three-filly race, but when **Hollywood Wildcat** (Kris S.) won last year, she beat a much weaker field and had the big California home-court edge. **Sky Beauty** (Blushing Groom {Fr}) was behind her that day, but Sky Beauty has improved her Thorograph figures dramatically while Hollywood Wildcat has not, and at this point she's just not fast enough to win. Sky Beauty's competition will come from **Heavenly Prize** (Seeking the Gold), who also suffered from the Breeders' Cup being in California last year but has now developed into one of the best three-year-old fillies of recent years.
