### UPWARD TREND CONTINUES AT

**KEENELAND** The trend of increases in both gross and average at Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale continued during the fourth session. The 280 horses sold Wednesday brought in a total of \$11,834,700, an increase of 54 percent over the fourth-session gross a year ago. The '94 average for the session, \$42,267, was up 65 percent over 1993. Two broodmares each brought \$250,000 to top Wednesday's bidding. Olin B. Gentry, agent, purchased My Turbulent Miss (My Dad George), an 18-year-old in foal to Kris S. Sold by Meadowbrook Farms, Inc, she is the dam of multimillionaire Prized. Windfields Farm bought the four-year-old Play All Day (Steady Growth), in foal to Alydeed, for the same price; she was consigned by Anderson Farms, agent. The sale continues through Tuesday.

**SNURGE TO STAND IN FRANCE** Snurge (Ela-Mana-Mou), the highest-earning European-based horse in history, has been retired and will stand stud at the Haras du Val Henry in France next year. The stud fee for the winner of the 1990 St. Leger and the 1992 Rothmans International has been set at 25,000 French francs (approximately \$4,900). Snurge's former trainer, Paul Cole, said, "He won seven races and placed 19 times from his 32 starts. His record speaks for itself. Everyone here will really miss him, but I am sure he will be a great success at stud."

### BARATHEA'S STUD FEE ANNOUNCED

**Barathea** (Sadler's Wells), set to take up stallion duties at the Rathbarry Stud in Ireland's County Cork next year, will stand at a fee of 16,000 Irish pounds (about \$25,000). The Breeders' Cup Mile hero is also to be employed as a stallion at Widden Stud in Australia for the '95, '96 and '97 southern hemisphere breeding seasons. Ten of 42 shares in Barathea have been bought by breeders from the southern hemisphere but, because of the stallion's dual duties, each of the 32 northern hemisphere shareholders will receive a bonus nomination for the first three seasons. Joe O'Flynn, assistant to Rathbarry's owner Liam Cashman, said, "Barathea's American victory was marvelous. Before it he had 30 mares booked and now the figure is beyond 45." News cont. p2

**GII \$100,000a Hollywood Prevue, 2yo, 7f**

Burt Bacharach's **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms), maiden winner by a neck in 1:08 4/5 at Oak Tree in his only start for trainer Dick Mandella, heads the list of starters. He will be ridden by Kent Desormeaux. Also confirmed for the race are **Southern Tempo** (Dixieland Band), who broke his maiden at Del Mar and since has two stakes placings to his credit; **Strategist** (Pirate's Bounty), a maiden winner last time out after finishing second his first two outings; and **Valid Wager** (Valid Appeal), who followed his maiden victory with a second in the GII Arlington-Washington Futurity, then came back to take a Santa Anita allowance in his most recent start.

### Sunday, Camden, South Carolina

**\$100,000 Carolina Cup Steeplechase, 4yo/up, abt. 22ft**

Three of the best American 'chasers, **Warm Spell** (Northern Baby), **Mistico (Chi)** (Balconaje {Arg}) and **Lonesome Glory** (Transworld), will renew their rivalry in the 25th running of the Marion duPont Scott Colonial Cup. Sponsored by the NationsBank, the race could decide the year's Eclipse Award winner. Warm Spell comes into the race off victory in the Breeders' Cup Grand National at Far Hills. Lonesome Glory, the defending two-time champion, was third in that race, while Mistico, who earlier in the campaign defeated both adversaries in the Iroquois Steeplechase at Nashville and the New York Turf Writers Cup at Saratoga, was fifth. The trio will face European **Crystal Spirit** (Kris {GB}), a top hurdler in England owned by Paul Mellon who captured Cheltenham's Howard E. Perry H. by 10 lengths in October; and the sport's all-time leading money earner and '94 SW **Victorian Hill** (Dickens Hill {Ire}). Completing the expected field are **Declare Your Wish** (Lyphard's Wish {Fr}), fourth in the Breeders' Cup Grand National; **Arctic Circle (Ire)** (Northern Baby); and **Isaiah** (\*Grey Dawn 2nd).

**HOLLYWOOD WILDCAT, FONDLY REMEMBERED POSSIBLE FOR MATRIARCH** Last year's champion three-year-old filly **Hollywood Wildcat** (Kris S.), who finished sixth as the favorite when trying to win her second straight Breeders' Cup Distaff last Saturday, is a possible starter in the GI Matriarch S. November 27. "We'll see how the trip affected her and if everything is right, we'll look at the Matriarch," said her trainer Neil Drysdale. Yellow Ribbon runner-up **Fondly Remembered** (Skywalker), who would have to be supplemented at a cost of \$15,000, could also make her next start in the Matriarch. "She should have won the Yellow Ribbon," said trainer Barry Abrams. "She had at least five lengths worth of trouble and she ended up having to run right over Wende to get through in the stretch. We'll either run her in the Matriarch or the Falls City H. at Churchill."

**NO RACING FOR CHARLES TOWN IN '95** The Charles Town Races Board of Directors announced yesterday that it will not apply for 1995 racing dates, and is actively seeking a buyer for the troubled Thoroughbred track. The decision came a day after the rejection by Jefferson County voters of a proposal which would have allowed the installation of video lottery terminals at the track. Track officials sought approval of the terminals in an effort to reverse declining attendance and revenue figures. Charles Town is projecting a \$1.3 million negative cash flow for 1994. "We intend to actively seek a buyer in an effort to keep the track open and preserve the thousands of jobs which directly and indirectly depend on the track," said President D. Keith Wagner. Wagner also indicated that the track will finish out the '94 schedule as long as the horse population and purse structure permits. Charles Town, which conducted its inaugural meeting in 1933, will conclude the '94 Fall Meet December 11.

**RIVER SPECIAL TO VINERY** **River Special** (Riverman) ranked second behind champion Gilded Time on the 1992 Experimental Free Handicap, will stand the 1995 season at Mr. and Mrs. Ben P. Walden Jr.'s Vinery in Midway, Kentucky for a fee of \$7,500, live foal. The colt, winner of the GI Hollywood Futurity and GI Norfolk S. as a two-year-old, retires with earnings of \$717,999. Mr. and Mrs. John C. Mabee will retain two-thirds interest in the River Special, while Vinery has purchased the remaining third.

### RECORD FALLS AT PORTLAND MEADOWS

The handle for Saturday's Breeders' Cup card at Oregon's Portland Meadows set a single-day record of \$1,055,852. It was the first time in the track's history that the daily handle exceeded \$1 million. Officials are predicting a record handle for the meet.
