ADDITIONAL DARK DAY AT AQUEDUCT The New York Racing Association's Board of Trustees has approved a five-day racing week, set to begin the first week of December. Starting December 5 dark days will fall on Mondays and Tuesdays, with holiday-related exceptions. The Board has also approved the 1995 Aqueduct winter/spring stakes schedule, which will feature 41 added-money races, 23 of them graded, worth more than \$3.5 million. The spring meet will be highlighted by the New York Road to the Triple Crown: the GIII Best Turn S. at six furlongs March 4, the GI Gotham at a mile March 25, and the GI Wood Memorial at a mile and an eighth April 15. The seven-furlong Bay Shore, traditionally a part of the series, has been moved to the Wood Memorial undercard.

FORMER GIANTS COACH TO HEAD NEW YORK CITY OTB Former New York Giants football coach Allie Sherman, 71, has been appointed the president of the New York City Off-Track Betting Corporation by New York Mayor Rudolph Giuliani. Sherman previously served as vice-president and senior advisor to Time-Warner Communications, the world's largest media company. Sherman's ties to the media giant were seen as a key to his appointment because of OTB's interest in expanding into the home betting market. "OTB is in need of reform," said Giuliani. "Although it has contributed \$25 million this year alone, it has the potential to contribute millions more. Allie Sherman is the best qualified to lead that reformation. The City's OTBs will also be exploring opportunities for privatization, but it is also necessary to secure that revenue collections are protected and improved. Mr. Sherman and the new OTB board are best equipped to ensure its future." Sherman will take over for Robert Palumbo, who had been serving as the acting president. Palumbo will stay on at OTB to serve as executive vice president.

GI Cowdin S. winner **Old Tascosa** (Gone West) goes for his second straight stakes win. The dark bay, on the board in five of his seven career starts, bested Nashua rival **Thunder Gulch** (Gulch) by two-and-a-half lengths in his last start. The two Kentucky-breds face New York-bred **Outlaw** (Criminal Type), who captured the restricted Sleepy Hollow S. in his most recent outing after finishing fifth in the GI Futurity. GI Hopeful winner **Wild Escapade** (Wild Again) tries to get back on track after two off-the-board efforts, in the GI Moet Champagne and the Cowdin on a muddy track last time out. "This might sound a little strange, but I suspect that my horse is afraid of the heavy rain," said trainer Leo O'Brien. "He's had two bad experiences in the wet weather and he hasn't run well either of those times. The first time was in his second start--he got very nervous going to the paddock, we couldn't get the tack on him, and he was very rough in the gate. Actually, Santos got hurt in the gate that day. The second time was in his last start, the Cowdin. He was very agitated and fired Santos off behind the gate. Some horses can be like that. He's just not himself when it rains hard, so we won't run him in the rain."

KEENELAND SALE TOPS \$100 MILLION Gross sales topped the \$100 million mark Thursday at the halfway point of Keeneland's annual November Breeding Stock Sale. With five days remaining, Keeneland has sold 1,267 horses for \$104,744,400, an average of \$82,671. Five stallion shares have been sold for an additional \$22,000. Last year, the November auction spanned seven days; sales totaled \$91,394,400 for 2,072 and 28 stallion shares. The '93 average was \$43,345. Top price during Thursday's session was \$375,000 paid by Patrick Barbe, agent, for Pointed Path (Kris {GB}). The 10-year-old English-bred mare, in foal to Personal Hope, is the dam of Fairy Path, a top European two-year-old this season; she was consigned by Albatroz Bloodstock Agency Inc. as agent. A total of 276 hips were sold Thursday for \$8,383,500, up 54 percent over last year's fifth session; the average of \$30,375 was up 80 percent over the fifth session in '93.

BREEDERS' CUP RUNNERS HEAD FOR

HOLLYWOOD *Serena's Song* (Rahy), game runner-up in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, is likely to make her next start in the GI Hollywood Starlet December 17. **Best Pal** (*Habitony), fifth in the Classic, will be pointed to the GI Hollywood Turf Cup December 11. "He came out of the Breeders' Cup fine and he's back at Hollywood," said trainer Richard Mandella. "He was second in a mile-and-a-quarter grass race here (behind Bien Bien in the '93 Hollywood Turf H.), so I'm going to try this one." **Unfinished Symph** (Aloha Prospector), third in the Mile, is probable for the GI Hollywood Derby November 20. "It's a quick turn-around, just two weeks, but he came out of the race great. He's leaping out of his stall, trying to get every horse that goes by him," said trainer Wesley Ward.

INTERNATIONAL FIELDS SET FOR HONG

KONG SERIES A contingent of eight British horses is expected to make the journey to Hong Kong's Sha Tin Race Course for the international series of races December 11. **Alflora** (Niniski) and **Emperor Jones** (Danzig) are set for the nine-furlong International Cup, which could also attract **Gothland** (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}) and **River Majesty** (Majestic Light) from the States. **Soviet Line** (Soviet Star) and **Young Ern** (Efisio {GB}) are likely for the International Bowl at seven furlongs; Americans **Megan's Interco** (Interco) and **Nijinsky's Gold** (Lot o'Gold) have also been invited. **Alriffa** (Danehill), **Double Trigger** (Ela-Mana-Mou) and **Urgent Request** (Rainbow Quest) are listed as probable for the 12-furlong International Vase; Canadian filly **Alywow** (Alysheba) is the North American invitee for the race.

CALIFORNIA TRACKS HOST HONG KONG

SIMULCASTS Hollywood Park and Bay Meadows will become the first U.S. racetracks to offer inter-track wagering on races from Hong Kong with the import of five cards during Hollywood's Autumn Festival. Wagering will be available at both tracks as well as the Hollywood Park Casino, pending final approval of the California Horse Racing Board. A special non-betting sneak preview will be simulcast from Sha Tin Race Course tonight; the simulcasts with wagering begin Friday, November 18. The programs from Hong Kong start at 9:30 p.m. Pacific Time, and run until approximately 1:30 a.m. The telecasts will be broadcast in English; past performances in English will also be available. "This has been very successful at Hastings Park in Canada," said Rick Baedeker, Hollywood's vice-president of marketing and public relations. "We think it will help us attract a segment of the market that hasn't been involved. It could also prove to be the first step in sending a return signal."

CASINOS DEFEATED IN FLORIDA

The Florida voters have spoken; there will be no casinos in the Sunshine State. An overwhelming majority, 62 percent, voted against the proposal which would have allowed the construction of 47 casinos in the state.
