KEENELAND BREEDING STOCK SALE

CONCLUDES Keeneland's 10-day November Breeding Stock Sale ended Tuesday with substantial increases in both gross sales and average price. Sales totaled \$121,088,500, an increase of 34.8 percent from \$89,810,500 last year. Six stallion shares brought an additional \$26,200. The average price, \$48,591, jumped 12.1 percent from 1993's average of \$43,345. The higher average was achieved despite the fact that Keeneland sold 20 percent more horses--2,492 compared to 2,072 in 1993. It was the highest average in November since 1989. Five broodmares, the most since 1989, brought \$1 million or more. Top price was \$2.7 million paid by Osamu Yasuda for **Maplejinsky** (Nijinsky II). The dam of millionaire Sky Beauty, Maplejinsky is in foal to A.P. Indy. The highest price of Tuesday's final session was \$50,000 paid by Anderson Acres for **Demidoff**, a four-year-old stallion prospect by Mr. Prospector--Secrettame (Secretariat). Consigned to the sale by Jane C. Hinkle, agent for Richard C. Colton Jr., Demidoff is a full brother to MGSW's Gone West and Lion Cavern. Keeneland sold 214 horses Tuesday for \$1,235,000. The average was \$5,771.

KEENELAND'S JANUARY SALE TO INCLUDE

PAULSON REDUCTION More than 100 horses owned by Allen Paulson will be among 1,275 catalogued for Keeneland's January 9-12 Horses of All Ages Sale, sales officials announced yesterday. Paulson, who established a successful racing and breeding operation in the early 1980's, will sell 65 broodmares and broodmare prospects and 42 soon-to-be yearlings. Farm manager Ted Carr described the sale of Paulson's horses as a "major reduction. We're trying to get the numbers under control." After the reduction, Paulson will retain approximately 100 mares and 75 yearlings (of 1995), according to Carr. Paulson, a record-setting aviator, owns several farms, including Brookside in Versailles, Kentucky. He has owned many outstanding horses singly or in partnership, including Eclipse Award-winners Theatrical (IRE), Estrapade, Blushing John, Eliza and Arazi. Theatrical will be represented in the reduction by several yearlings and mares carrying his foals.

HOLLYWOOD DERBY-GI, \$400,000, 3yo, 9fT
New York-based jockey Mike Smith has been named to ride Gainesborough Farm's **Lahint** (Woodman) for trainer Bill Mott. **Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat), runner-up in the Breeders' Cup Classic in his last effort, worked a half-mile Tuesday morning over Santa Anita's fast main track in preparation for his grass debut. He was clocked in :48 4/5 handily. **Dare And Go** (Alydar) and **Exalto** (White Mischief) both drilled six furlongs over Hollywood's firm turf course (dogs up) yesterday. Dare And Go went in 1:18, while Exalto worked in a bullet 1:17 1/5. Late nomination **Marvin's Faith** (Sharp Victor) covered a half-mile on the turf in :50 2/5, while **Mighty Forum** (Presidium {GB}), working on the main track, breezed five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 for trainer Mark Hennig.

CITATION H.-GII, \$250,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/4mT

Trainer Derek Meredith said yesterday that Paulette Thompson's **Captain Cook** (NZ) (Wham {AUST}) will be entered in the Citation. The six-year-old gelding showed speed but faded to fifth behind Brazilian sensation Romarin in his U.S. debut at Oak Tree Oct. 19. The probable field also includes **Beneficial** (GB) (Top Ville {IRE}), Delahoussaye; **Blues Traveller** (IRE) (Bluebird), Stevens; **Jeune Homme** (Nureyev), no rider; **Shandon Lake** (IRE) (Darshaan {GB}), McCarron; **Southern Wish** (Lyphard's Wish {FR}), Nakatani; **Square Cut** (Assert {IRE}), no rider; and **Wharf** (Storm Bird), Day.

NYRA PURSE DISTRIBUTION REVISED The New York Racing Association's purse distribution schedule has been revised in order to pay back to fifth place, it was announced yesterday by NYRA VP of Racing Terry Meyocks. The new schedule, to take effect with the beginning of a five-day race week Wednesday, December 7, is as follows: 1st place--60%, 2nd place--20%, 3rd place--11%, 4th place--6%, 5th place--3%. "This schedule will help horsemen with purse money paid to a greater number of participants," said Meyocks. "We also hope that field size will increase with more runners earning checks. It's a step we can take to help the horsemen and, hopefully, the fans as well." Previously, the shares for second and third were 22% and 12% respectively.

JOCKEYS' GUILD REJECTS TRA OFFER The Jockeys' Guild officially rejected the latest proposal from the Thoroughbred Racing Associations yesterday during a meeting in Chicago. The proposal was aimed at solving the ongoing dispute over the funding of insurance premiums for Guild members. The TRA initially made the proposal at Churchill Downs Nov. 6 and, according to the TRA, it called for a 25% increase in accident benefits as well as other improvements in the benefit packages. The Jockeys' Guild is seeking a new payment structure funded by 1/10th of one percent of the total nationwide racing handle. The two sides are set to meet next either Nov. 21 or 22 in Cincinnati. Churchill Downs President Tom Meeker met with the Louisville media yesterday and made it clear that he and his fellow TRA members are not about to give in to pressure to settle the dispute. Meeker said that it would be impossible to make a wholesale change in the takeout structure by Jan. 1 and that the tracks could not possibly deliver the Guild's demands. "If that's the deal-breaker, the jockeys can pack their tack and do individually whatever they want to do," said Meeker. When asked how a track should respond to a possible walkout, he replied, "I'd find jockeys. I'd go to Panama if I had to."

MEMO RETIRED TO STUD Stud Panter's **Memo (CHI)** (Mocito Guapo {ARG}), a seven-year-old horse who owns the Hollywood Park track record for seven furlongs, has been retired to stud, trainer Dick Mandella said yesterday. "He's going home to Chile," said Mandella. "He had bowed a tendon when he came here four years ago, and it's starting to bother him. We don't want to push our luck. We want to retire him as a winner." The Champion Three-Year-Old Colt in Chile, Memo won five stakes in North America, three of them graded, for earnings of \$692,288. In his last career start, he was a two-length winner of the September 27 Governor's Cup H. at Fairplex Park.

SIXTEEN TO CONTEST JAPAN CUP The field for the G1 Japan Cup, to be run Sunday, November 27 at Tokyo Racecourse includes six North American-based runners: **Fraise** (Strawberry Road {AUST}), **Grand Flotilla** (Caro {IRE}), **Johann Quatz** (FR) (Sadler's Wells), **Paradise Creek** (Irish River {FR}), **Raintrap** (GB) (Rainbow Quest) and **Sandpit** (BRAZ) (Baynoun {IRE}). Europe will be represented by two runners, **Apple Tree** (FR) (Bikala {IRE}) and **Hernando** (FR) (Niniski), while Oceania will send three postward: **Jeune** (GB) (Kalaglow {IRE}), **Redding** (NZ) (Nassipour) and **Rough Habit** (NZ) (Roughcast). The field of 16 will be rounded out by five Japanese-based horses: **Marvelous Crown** (Miswaki), **Matikanetannhauser** (Northern Taste), **Nice Nature** (Nice Dancer), **Royce and Royce** (Tony Bin) and **Sekitei Ryu O** (Tosho Boy). Japan's **Fujiyama Kenzan** (Lucky Cast) is listed as an also eligible. The closing entry time for the race is Friday, November 25 at 10 a.m.

GODOLPHIN SETS SIGHTS ON U.S. Godolphin Racing, the Dubai arm of the Maktoum empire, is aiming to conquer America. The Maktoums, hugely successful in Britain this season with horses wintered in the Middle East, have launched a campaign to persuade U.S. authorities to change their rules concerning quarantine. American officials have already visited Dubai to assess facilities and prepare a report on action to prevent the spread of equine diseases. Current regulations require a 60-day quarantine period for animals travelling between the two countries. But if the Maktoums' lobbying is successful, that will be changed and there will be a significant increase in the number of Godolphin-owned horses being raced State-side. Simon Crisford, manager of the Dubai operation, said, "If the door is opened, we have many horses here who would be suited by racing in the U.S., where there are good prizes to be won. The Kentucky Derby would be the number one goal."

FASIG-TIPTON HORSES OF RACING AGE RESULTS Fasig-Tipton New York held its 1994 Horses of Racing Age Sale at Belmont Park Monday. There were 103 horses sold for a gross of \$1,175,400 and an average of \$11,412, down three percent from last year's average of \$11,766. The two highest prices were paid for a pair of horses consigned by Rokeby Stables. **Scoop The Gold**, a four-year-old filly by Forty Niner--Leap Lively (Nijinsky II), was purchased by Michael Brown, agent, for \$185,000. Scoop The Gold is a half-sister to Forest Flower (Green Forest), the Champion Two-Year-Old Filly in England in 1986. Commanding the second highest price of \$170,000 was MGSP **Key Contender**, by Fit to Fight--Key Witness (Key to the Mint). Purchased by Flying Zee Stable, the six-year-old chestnut horse finished second in the October 15 GII Fayette S. at Keeneland in his most recent outing.

JUDGE SMELLS, IL EST GRAN TO STAND IN PENNSYLVANIA

Tea Party Stable, Inc. announced yesterday the purchase and relocation of stallions **Judge Smells** (In Reality) and **Il Est Gran** (The Minstrel) to Xanthus Farm in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. Eleven-year-old Judge Smells, who formerly stood at Donerail Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, will stand in 1995 for a fee of \$3,500 live foal, with special consideration given to mares foaling in Pennsylvania. Il Est Gran, formerly at The Equine Gambit in Warwick Maryland, will stand for \$750 live foal.

'RINGER' DISCOVERED IN IRELAND

Irish racing has been hit by a 'ringer' scandal involving a horse once trained by Vincent O'Brien. Owner P.J. Tynan has been banned from racing until January 1 of the year 2000 following the discovery that Cushie King VI, winner of a maiden hurdle event at Dundalk Sept. 15, was in fact the former O'Brien-trained **Passer-By (IRE)** (Lomond), a three-time winner on the flat during 1990. Michael Hourigan, registered as Cushie King VI's handler at the Dundalk meeting, has been fined Ir£500 but exonerated from any knowing participation in the fraud.
