MANAGEMENT According to a report in yesterday's edition of the *New York Post*, a number of key New York Racing Association executives will be fired or will announce their retirements at a press conference scheduled for Wednesday at Aqueduct Racetrack. The *Post* reported that Vice President/Marketing Allen Gutterman and Racing Secretary Bruce Lombardi have been fired; Track Superintendent Joe King, Vice President/Operations John Keenan and Senior Vice President and General Counsel Martin Lieberman will announce their retirements. "It's nothing personal with Allen," NYRA President/General Manager Kenny Noe Jr. told the *Post*. "I felt that we need to look in another direction in regards to that part of the operation." The latest house cleaning comes on the heels of the resignation of former President Gerard McKeon; former Executive Vice President Gerald Lawrence resigned in August. When Noe was brought in to replace McKeon, he was given a mandate to trim the fat from the NYRA budget. Rumors about sweeping changes have been rampant since his hiring. There were no reports of any hirings to fill the many vacant positions.
