### ALYWOW IS CANADIAN HORSE OF THE YEAR

Winners of the 20th annual Sovereign Awards, recognizing outstanding achievements in Canadian racing and breeding, were announced at an awards dinner last night. Taking top honors as Horse of the Year was Kinghaven Farms' three-year-old turf filly **Alywow** (Alysheba). Winner of six of 15 career starts for earnings of \$558,403, the Roger Attfield-trainee was victorious in three stakes this year, including the Gill Nijana S. at Saratoga and the GIC Canadian Breeders' Cup H. at Woodbine. Alywow also finished second in two Grade I events--the Rothmans International and the Flower Bowl Handicap. The Sovereign Award winners are as follows:

Even-money choice Major Pots, second in this race last year, won a 1 1/4-mile allowance at Woodbine in his most recent outing. Sitting just behind pacesetter and former claimer Movietone early, he took the lead after the first mile and never relinquished it, widening his advantage to 6 1/2 under the wire for his first stakes victory. Krisanova, making his stakes debut, was third, while the 5-2 second choice in the betting RAGNAROK (Temperence Hill), close to the leaders early on, tired to finish 6th. The winner is 1/2 to Majority (SW, \$171,912, by Bold Ruckus).

### News Continued.

**DEHERE TO STUD** Dehere (Deputy Minister), the 1993 Eclipse Award-winning two-year-old colt, arrived at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Ky. yesterday to begin his career at stud. He was retired after showing soreness following a workout Sunday at the Palm Beach Downs Training Center. The soreness was in the area of his original injury, a broken cannon bone in his left hind leg, which occurred while he was preparing for the 1993 Florida Derby. Owner Robert Brennan reported yesterday that a half interest in the colt had been sold to Ashford prior to the injury. Dehere will stand for \$25,000 live foal and has already been booked to 40 mares. "At first, we were quite optimistic about his comeback," said Brennan. "After the work he was ouchy in one leg and we reached our decision. If he were just a normal horse, we would have given him more time and gone on with it. The only reason we wanted to bring him back was to have him compete at the highest level. When it was obvious that we were not going to reach that goal due to his physical condition, it was an easy decision." Dehere, a highly regarded 2-year-old full brother to Dehere, has resumed training following injuries and is expected to make his first start in the late spring.

### INTERACTIVE WAGERING TEST

**PLANNED** The Maryland Jockey Club, parent company of Laurel and Pimlico race tracks, and ODS (On Demand Services) Technologies have announced plans to test the technical feasibility of an in-home wagering system. The initial phase of the test, subject to approval by the Maryland Racing Commission, is planned for January 15 to February 15 and will involve 25 homes in the Baltimore area. Participants will be able to wager on races from Laurel via their televisions through software designed by ODS Technologies. The system will provide on-screen displays with a series of menus which will allow the bettor to make a wagering transaction that is transmitted into an AmTote computer. The customer's pre-established account is then checked for approval and the wager is entered into the appropriate race pool. The system's integrity is assured by a proprietary authorization card which maintains security and account privacy. "We see in-home wagering as a logical extension of our efforts to provide customers with convenient ways to access our product," said MJC President Joe De Francis. "While no system can replace the on-track experience, we like what we've seen of the ODS approach because it offers an easy-to-use, entertaining vehicle for people who can't get to the track. This technology represents a means to reach both current and potential customers in a society where home entertainment, through television, computers and other video media, is becoming increasingly important." The Maryland Jockey Club/ODS test will be conducted in three phases.

### SYMPOSIUM ON RACING CONTINUES

Attendees at the second day of the 1994 Symposium on Racing conducted by the University of Arizona's Race Track Industry Program heard racing executives and officials call for a better deal for the racing fan and more realistic testing levels for permissive medication. "We're overpricing our product," insisted Doug Donn, president of Gulfstream Park. "The high price of our product is a major reason for racing's decline. Lower takeout means more dollars going back to the patron." Gulfstream will open its 1995 meet January 4 with a takeout structure offering a more lucrative return to the bettor on exotic wagers, which now represent the most popular form of betting at all tracks. Continuing with the theme of giving the horseplayer a break, Kip Keefer, marketing director of Birmingham Race Course, called for the abolition of admission and parking charges. "We are charging our fans a luxury tax just to come to the track," he said. The recent rash of positive test results for non-performance enhancing drugs was the subject of a panel entitled, "Are You Positive You're Negative?" Thomas Lomangino, director of the Maryland Racing Commission Laboratory said, "There needs to be a certain level of permissible medication for therapeutic purposes." Tony Chamblin, president of the Association of Racing Commissioners International, suggested, "Some jurisdictions need to take a look at their medication rules. Innocent people should not be punished." In a closed afternoon session, the Thoroughbred Racing Association Board of Directors debated negotiating tactics and alternatives as they head toward a showdown with the Jockeys' Guild over health and insurance costs.

**REMINGTON PARK WRAP-UP** Rebounding from a slow start at the beginning of its 1994 fall meeting, Remington Park in Oklahoma City closed out its season on a positive note Sun. with the help of record-setting numbers from off-site simulcasting outlets. Total on-track attendance for the 54-day fall meet, which began Sept. 16, was 351,852 for a daily average of 6,516. On-track handle was \$49,146,922 for an average of \$910,128. However, because of full-card simulcasting to sites in seven states, total handle for the meet came to \$58,362,357, bringing the daily average up to \$1,080,785, an increase of 0.65 percent from last fall. Jack Van Berg won his first Remington Park training title, while jockey Tim Doocy led the riders' standings for the second straight year.

New York Thoroughbred Breeders' President Dr. Douglas B. Koch announced yesterday that NYRA President and General Manager Kenny Noe and VP of Racing Terry Meyocks have made a commitment of \$25,000 from the NYRA purse account to each division of The New York Stallion Stakes Series to be run in 1995. The addition of these monies to the Times Square Park Avenue divisions of the 1994-95 series (for 3-year-olds of 1995 at a mile Sunday, April 23) and to the Great White Way and Fifth Avenue of the 1995-96 series (for 2-year-olds of 1995 at six furlongs in the Fall) is expected to bring the value of each race to an estimated \$100,000. "This is an unprecedented and very welcome move by NYRA," said Dr. Koch, "because it underscores the racing association's oft-stated commitment to work closely with the breeders and horsemen to improve the industry for everyone."
