AGA KHAN RETURNS TO BRITISH RACING

Changes in British racing's drug-testing procedures have led to the Aga Khan ending his boycott of the sport in Great Britain. The Aga Khan quit racing in Britain at the end of 1990 after his filly **Aliysa (IRE)** (Darshaan {GB}), an easy winner of the previous season's Epsom Oaks, was disqualified for failing a post-race drug test. He took the action because he claimed that procedures in British Jockey Club laboratories were unsatisfactory. Yesterday, however, the British Jockey Club announced the introduction of new drug testing procedures. Beginning next year, all positive samples will undergo counter analysis at a second laboratory, thus bringing the British system in line with those of France and Ireland. "I'm confident that any outstanding questions I may have will be satisfactorily addressed in a continuing atmosphere of mutual trust," said the Aga Khan. "I am extremely pleased to renew my family's long history of racing in Great Britain, which has extended over nearly eighty years." The Aga Khan has already entered 26 yearlings for the 1996 Vodafone Derby, to be held at Epsom Downs.

NEW BETS, FREE PARKING AT AQUEDUCT

Aqueduct Racetrack will offer a series of changes for the bettor beginning January 1, 1995. The New Year will mark the debut of an additional Pick Three and an additional triple on each day's racing card. The new Pick Three will be offered on Aqueduct's second through fourth races, and the extra triple will be offered on the fifth race each day. The current Pick Three, run on races 5-6-7, will be moved back to races 6-7-8 to conclude with the afternoon's feature, and the ninth race will continue to offer a triple. HOLY BULL TO BREEZE Holy Bull (Great Above) will breeze "an easy" three furlongs Sunday at Gulfstream Park, the colt's first effort faster than a gallop since being returned to training. Owner-trainer Jimmy Croll said his three-year-old star will be on the track shortly before 7 a.m. to begin preparations for his scheduled 1995 debut in the \$50,000 Olympic Handicap January 22. Holy Bull has won five Grade I stakes to date.

SOVIET PROBLEM WORKS IN JAPAN Soviet Problem (Moscow Ballet) will complete her brilliant 1994 campaign Sunday in Japan when she heads the field in the \$1.9 million Sprinters Stakes at Nakayama Racecourse. In Japan Wednesday, the four-year-old filly worked 800 meters (just less than four furlongs) in :52, which was uncharacteristically slow for her. Bay Meadows Chairman of the Board, John Harris, in Japan for the race, said of the work, "Exercise rider Mario Cisneros felt Soviet Problem was struggling with track orientation over the turf course. Remember, in Japan the races are run clockwise, and there is a gap on the inside rail about two furlongs from the gate which seemed to confuse her." An earner of \$713,168 from nine victories in 12 starts this year, Soviet Problem finished second in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint in her most recent outing.

GULFSTREAM GETS THREE MORE GRADED STAKES Gulfstream Park's graded stakes for the 63-day meeting opening January 4 have been increased from 24 to 27, it was announced yesterday by Director of Racing Robert D. Umphrey. The trio of added-money events elevated to Grade III status were the \$70,000 Spectacular Bid Breeders' Cup, the \$75,000-added Preview S. and the \$100,000 Fort Lauderdale H. Gulfstream will present a Florida record 39 stakes worth \$4,625,000--also an all-time high.

TWICE THE VICE SOLD Grade I Del Mar Oaks winner **Twice The Vice** (Vice Regent) has been sold for an undisclosed sum to Mr. and Mrs. Martin Wygod. "You hate to lose a horse like her," said trainer T.R. Bell II from his Santa Anita barn Thursday morning. "You don't fill a stall like hers very readily. But they made us an offer we couldn't refuse." Twice The Vice will be trained by Ron Ellis and reportedly will remain on course for Santa Anita's La Canada series this winter. The three-year-old filly had been owned by Robert and Beverly Lewis. "We paid \$130,000 for her as a two-year-old at Keeneland," Bell continued. "Horses are born to be sold and I hated to lose this one, but we made a considerable profit. In my opinion, she'll be one of the best four-year-old fillies on the West Coast next year." Twice The Vice won the GIII Linda Vista Breeders' Cup H. at Oak Tree Nov. 2 and has five wins, one second and earnings of \$269,416 from nine career starts.

CELTIC ARMS TO U.S. Celtic Arms (FR) (Comrade in Arms {GB}), winner of this year's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club and G1 Prix Lupin, is to continue his racing career in America. The three-year-old has been purchased by Rancho San Peasea and leaves France this week to join Southern California trainer Rodney Rash. His sale was brokered by Havana Horse Ltd., whose recent buys for the U.S. have included **Blues Traveller (IRE)** (Bluebird), **Oakmead (IRE)** (Lomond) and **User Friendly (GB)** (Slip Anchor {GB}).

LAUREL ANNOUNCES WINTER STAKES SCHEDULE Laurel Park Vice President of Racing Lenny Hale yesterday unveiled the Maryland track's 1995 Winter Meet stakes program, a 16-race slate which offers \$1,265,000 in purses. The highlight of the 52-day Winter Meet (January 1 through April 2) is the annual SprintFest, which consists of a pair of GII \$200,000 events: the Barbara Fritchie H. and the General George H. In addition, Laurel will present an overnight stakes schedule comprised of 14 races worth \$460,000.

CHURCHILL DOWNS DECLARES ANNUAL DIVIDEND The Churchill Downs Board of Directors yesterday declared its regular annual dividend of \$0.50 per share on the common stock of the Company.
