TRA EXTENDS DEADLINE The Jockeys' Guild informed the Thoroughbred Racing Associations yesterday that it was not prepared at this time to accept the TRA's final offer, which was presented last Friday, but asked for additional time to review specific provisions of the proposal. According to the Guild's National Manager John Giovanni, the TRA plan contained several promising elements but was incomplete on several issues. "Since this proposal has only been on the table for a week, many questions remain unanswered," he said. "At this point, this is not a proposal we can accept." The main sticking point is in the area of health insurance and other benefits; while the TRA has offered \$1.7 million in media rights compensation to fund the benefits--the same figure paid the last three years--the Guild has stated that it would require approximately \$9 million to meet their goals. In the interest of working to a positive resolution prior to the December 31 contract expiration, the TRA agreed to extend discussions with the understanding it would receive a definitive response to its proposal well before the end of the year. "If I tried to characterize where we are today, I'd just be guessing, so there's no real point in it," said TRA Executive Vice President Chris Scherf Friday. The TRA proposal doubles the accident policy medical coverage, with an accompanying rise in accidental death and dismemberment coverage from \$5,000 to \$25,000. In states where medical and disability costs are covered by workers' compensation, jockeys would continue to be covered by a catastrophic policy providing additional benefits to severely injured riders. The TRA will have the accident policy in effect January 1, regardless of the status of the contract with the Jockeys' Guild; the Guild has indicated that this element of the plan is acceptable, pending board approval.

JULIE KRONE BACK ON TRACK Jockey Julie Krone, who had the hardware removed from her reconstructed right ankle during the second week of November, was back in the saddle for the first time yesterday. Krone breezed the two-year-old Cossack Fighter for trainer Mohammed Moubarak at Gulfstream, where she was leading rider in 1992 and 1993.
