Tony Leonard was awarded the Eclipse Award for outstanding photography for a photo depicting a snowy racing scene in Keeneland which ran in the Thoroughbred Times. The award for best local television broadcast was given to WGNO-TV, New Orleans producer Ronnie Virgets, for a documentary on the fire and reopening of Fair Grounds Race Course.

GULFSTREAM LOWERS TAKEOUT Gulfstream Park announced yesterday that the takeout will be lowered for the duration of the '95 meet, scheduled for January 4 through March 16. It is the second consecutive year the take has been decreased on win, place, show and perfecta pools. The takeout will be reduced as follows: win, place and show pools, from 18 percent to 17 percent; perfectas and daily doubles, from 20 percent to 19 percent; the Bet 3, from 25 percent to 20 percent; and trifectas, from 25 percent to 24 percent. "The lower takeout is a continuation of Gulfstream's policy of being customer oriented," said Douglas Donn, Gulfstream president and CEO. "Our patrons will be receiving a greater return on their winning wagers. Gulfstream's experiment with a lower takeout last year produced a record handle. BREEDERS' CUP ENTRIES FROM EUROPE EXPECTED TO DECLINE

A significant drop in Breeders' Cup runners from the U.K. is predicted if proposed changes to the entry requirements get the go-ahead. British-based breeders, owners and trainers are certain that, if a deal outlined Tuesday is ratified in the New Year, far fewer horses will make the trip to the U.S. They say meeting increased entry charges will prohibit the development of what has proved to be a popular event. Luca Cumani, whose **Barathea (IRE)** (Sadler's Wells) won this year's Breeders' Cup Mile, suggested that had a big supplementary fee been required, his colt might not have been entered in the Cup. "I have some sympathy with the Americans, but I do not think this is the right way to solve the problem," he said. "It is sad, but it may mean the end of the Breeders' Cup as we know it." Jeff Smith, the owner of **Lochsong (GB)** (Song {GB}), who competed in this year's Sprint, agreed with the Newmarket trainer. "It's a big gamble taking a horse to the Breeders' Cup," said Smith. "Paying around \$100,000 is just too much. If these changes go through it will unquestionably reduce the number of European runners."

GULFSTREAM TO RECEIVE AQUEDUCT FEATURE DAILY

One of the highlights of Gulfstream Park's 1995 racing season will be the daily reception of the feature race simulcast from New York's Aqueduct Race Track. For this race daily, Gulfstream's betting pools will be commingled with New York's, offering win, place, show and exacta wagering, said Milt Roth, Gulfstream's director of corporate development.

NOEL O'CALLAGHAN RETIRES One of the best-known figures in the bloodstock industry, Noel O'Callaghan, is to retire as chairman of B.B.A. (Ireland) Ltd. However, because of his considerable experience in the bloodstock industry, he has been asked to continue as non-executive director of the main board of British Bloodstock Agency. "Horsemanship is not an exact science," said O'Callaghan. "It takes a lot of hard work, a good deal of luck and, in the case of an agent, a good client! When it works it is just about the most satisfying experience in the world and it allows you to work closely with some of the best characters and most genuine people around." O'Callaghan has made the science a little more exact in recent years by buying three champions in a row: **Lindo Shaver** (Alydar), Champion Two-Year-Old Colt in Japan in 1991; **Kooyonga (IRE)** (Persian Bold {IRE}), Champion Three-Year-Old Filly in Europe in 1992; and **A.P. Indy** (Seattle Slew), Champion Three-Year-Old Colt and Horse of the Year in the U.S. in 1993.

HUBBARD ACQUIRES 50 PERCENT OF

FERRARA Hollywood Park Chairman of the Board and CEO R.D. Hubbard has acquired a 50 percent interest in the promising three-year-old colt **Ferrara** (Capote) from L'Aquila Ltd. The Kentucky-bred is expected to be one of the favorites in Monday's GII Malibu S. at Santa Anita. Trainer Gary Jones said no sales price was disclosed. "Mr. Hubbard bought 50 percent of the horse, and L'Aquila Ltd. (Don Ameche Jr.) retained the other 50 percent," Jones said. The transaction was engineered by John T.L. Jones of Walmac Int'l. Ferrara is undefeated in two starts this fall including a 6 1/2-furlong allowance in which he equaled Hollywood's track record of 1:13 4/5. Malibu probables Ferrara and **Timbalier** (Sovereign Dancer) both worked five furlongs Wed. at Santa Anita, with Ferrara timed in 1:00 3/5 and Timbalier in 1:00 1/5.

HOLY BULL BREEZES AGAIN

Holy Bull (Great Above) breezed an easy three furlongs in :36 1/5 and galloped out a half-mile in :49 2/5 with the dogs up and the track listed as good Thursday at Gulfstream. The breeze was the second of the winter for the colt, who is scheduled to make his four-year-old debut Jan. 22 in the \$50,000 Olympic H. Owned and trained by Jimmy Croll, Holy Bull, the leading candidate for Horse of the Year, has won 12 of 14 lifetime starts, including six Grade I events, for earnings to date of \$2,430,760. In his first serious exercise of the winter last Sun., he went three-eighths in :37 2/5.
