**STRIKE CONTROVERSY CONTINUES** The Jockeys' Guild may face legal action from the State of Florida should it attempt to stage an organized boycott, according to an article in Thursday's Miami Herald. In a letter sent to Jockeys' Guild National Manager John Giovanni, Florida Attorney General Bob Butterworth said the Guild could be found in violation of anti-trust laws because it falls under the heading of a trade association, not a labor union, due to the fact that jockeys are independent contractors. "Any effort to organize such a boycott by jockeys and to threaten to expel jockeys who are members of your association if they ride would likely violate the antitrust laws," said Butterworth. "We have an obligation to protect the state's interest, its parimutuel industry and the tax revenues it produces from unlawful and anticompetitive activity." Meanwhile, several prominent jockeys have declared their intentions to ride, strike or no strike. Heading the list of those who have declared their intention to cross the picket line Jan. 1 in Southern California is Patrick Valenzuela. Calder Race Course also issued a list of riders willing to accept mounts after the strike deadline. The most prominent riders on the Calder list were Herb Castillo, Jesus Bracho and George Martens. The New York Racing Association said that it would not publish such a list, but Vice President of Racing Terry Meyocks said that he knew of 20-25 riders willing to accept mounts. New York-based riders Julio Pezua and Diane Nelson both said that they would be willing to cross the picket line to ride. Richard Migliore said he would not be willing to commit one way or another, but hinted that he, too, may ride. "I want to do the right thing and right now I think I know what the right thing is," he said, "but I want to see what develops."

### TABASCO CAT TO SKIP SAN FERNANDO

Preakness and Belmont winner **Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat) will skip his scheduled start in the Jan. 14 GII San Fernando S. according to his trainer, D. Wayne Lukas. "The race is coming up a little too quickly," said Lukas. "He's only had a couple of half-mile works. I would say it's extremely doubtful he will run." The colt's main objectives: the Feb. 5 Strub S. and the March 11 Santa Anita H. Lukas also said **Timber Country** (Woodman) was a "possible" starter in the Jan. 14 El Camino Real Derby at Bay Meadows.

**Saturday, Calder Race Course:**  
**VIRGINIA H.-GIII, \$100,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 7f**  
Ogden Mills Phipps' four-year-old **Educated Risk** (Mr. Prospector) is expected to be odds-on under topweight of 122 pounds. Trained by Shug McGaughey, **Educated Risk** comes into the Virginia H. off victories in the GII Churchill Downs Budweiser Breeders' Cup and the GI Top Flight H. at Aqueduct, scoring by margins of six and eight lengths, respectively. An earner of \$923,717 to date, **Educated Risk**, who will be piloted by regular rider Mike Smith, will concede from seven to 12 pounds to her rivals. Scheduled to line up against the favorite are **Aly's Conquest** (Alydar), Santos; **Imah** (Gate Dancer), Maple; **Floramera** (Seattle Slew), Peck; **Clever Act** (Gulch), Penna; **Goldarama** (Fountain of Gold), Boulanger; **Star Jolie** (John Alden), Douglas. Phillips Racing Partnership's **Floramera**, a half-sister to 1988 Florida Derby winner Brian's Time, is undefeated in three career starts. The Carl Nafzger-trainee won allowance races at Keeneland and Churchill Downs this fall, but will be taking a big jump up in class for the Virginia.

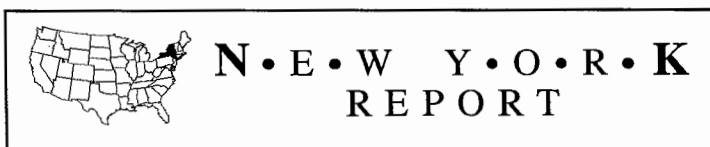

**LIBUTTI TRIAL POSTPONED** The trial pitting the Internal Revenue Service against Edith LiButti over the ownership of Devil His Due has been postponed. Originally scheduled to begin Dec. 27, the trial was moved to Feb. 6 in Watertown, New York when Judge Thomas J. McAvoy, Chief Judge of the Northern District, U.S. District Court became ill with the flu. In August, the IRS filed a lien against any ownership interest Robert LiButti may have in Devil His Due, alleging that he was the "beneficial owner" of the horse. LiButti's daughter Edith sued the IRS, challenging their order of seizure and levy and won a restraining order. At stake now: the 1995 breeding season. Devil His Due was scheduled to stand at stud at Buck Pond Farm, but the later trial date may now threaten that schedule and force the colt back to the races. "We're working on that right now," said Edith LiButti. "It's so ridiculous I can't even comprehend it, but we will know more on Monday."

**CONCERN BACK IN ACTION** Concern (Broad Brush), off since his triumph in the Nov. 5 Breeders' Cup Classic, has had two workouts at the Fair Grounds this month. He breezed three furlongs in :38 Dec. 14, then went a half-mile in :50 4/5 Wednesday. Trainer Richard Small said he's still not certain about the three-year-old's next start. The GII San Fernando S. at Santa Anita January 14 is a possibility, as is the GI Strub S. at Santa Anita February 5. "I won't ship Concern to California unless he's tight," said Small. "Right now, Concern's at Fair Grounds, and California would mean a long journey. The race we're really pointing towards is the GI Pimlico Special, which is 1 3/16-miles and is run at our home track, in Maryland, in mid-May."
