JOCKEY STRIKE AVERTED Thanks to a last-minute agreement in principle between the Thoroughbred Racing Associations and the Jockeys' Guild, a strike by the majority of the nation's jockeys has been called off. The three-year agreement, which was announced late Friday, doubles the accident insurance benefits, continues catastrophic injury insurance in the states where jockeys receive workers' compensation, and increases the approximate \$1.7 million in per-mount fees paid to the Jockeys' Guild by \$150,000, with the additional funds earmarked for permanently disabled riders. Said TRA Commissioner Brian McGrath, "The member tracks are extremely pleased to reach this agreement. Thoroughbred racing is blessed with many ardent fans, whose enjoyment...should not be tarnished by a labor strike. We also value the role the jockeys play in our sport and believe this agreement reflects the entire industry's concern for their well-being."

ELIZA RETIRED Allen E. Paulson's **Eliza** (Mt. Livermore), the Eclipse Award-winning Two-Year-Old Filly of 1992, has been retired. Eliza finished fourth in the Market Basket S. Wed. at Santa Anita in her final start. Winner of the '92 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and the '93 GI Santa Anita Oaks, she retires with earnings of \$1,095,316. Eliza will be shipped to Paulson's Brookside Farm in Kentucky. "I discussed it with Mr. Paulson and we just felt it was the right time to retire her," said her trainer, Alex Hassinger. "Gary Stevens got off her after the race Wed. and said that physically she felt 100 percent, but that she just didn't quite have the same kick in the stretch. She's been a real special filly for me and Mr. Paulson."

CANADIAN HORSEMAN JEAN-LOUIS LEVESQUE DEAD Jean-Louis Levesque, a prominent Quebec financier and racehorse owner, died last weekend in Montreal after a long battle with cancer. He was 83. Levesque raced Canadian Horses of the Year Fanfreluche, who was also champion three-year-old filly in the U.S.; La Prevoyante, also champion two-year-old filly in the U.S.; L'Enjoleur, voted Canada's top honor in 1974 and '75; and L'Alezane. Levesque was a director of the Ontario Jockey Club and an honorary trustee at the time of his death.

CHANGES FOR THE BETTOR IN NEW YORK

The New York State Racing and Wagering Board has given approval for the following changes in New York's wagering rules, beginning Sunday, January 1: seven betting interests must be entered, and six must actually start, to conduct triple wagering--previously, triple races had required 10 betting interests and seven actual starters; five betting interests and four actual starters will be required for exacta and quinella betting; coupled entries will be allowed in all triple races; the fifth race each day will feature triple wagering; and there will be an additional Pick 3 on the second, third and fourth races daily.
