SANTA ANITA, GULFSTREAM TO EXCHANGE

SIMULCASTS Santa Anita Park will begin exchanging races with Gulfstream Park when the Florida track opens Wednesday, Jan. 3. Santa Anita will import the feature race from Gulfstream Wednesdays, Saturdays, Sundays and holiday Mondays, while sending one race to the Florida track each racing day. The first Gulfstream race being imported to Santa Anita is the \$50,000 Hallandale H. Jan. 3. California state law requires races imported from other states to carry minimum purses of \$50,000. The simulcast agenda from Gulfstream to Santa Anita will therefore be expanded to include Thursdays and Fridays if the Florida track begins to card races of \$50,000 and up those days.

HENNESSY BREEZES Robert and Beverly Lewis's Hennessy (Storm Cat) breezed a half-mile in :51 handily over Santa Anita's fast main track Sunday morning. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas said the drill was for maintenance purposes only, and he won't get serious with the Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up until late January. "It was just a slow, easy half," Lukas said. "It's easier to give them a slow one every once in a while rather than crank them up all at once." Hennessy, a MGSW who took the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga in August, finished fourth as the 3-10 favorite in the GI Hollywood Futurity December 17. Meanwhile, Lukas trainee **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner), winner of the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile S. and third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, is in Florida preparing to make his three-year-old debut in the \$75,000 Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream Jan. 20.

STEVENS RETURN DELAYED Southern California-based jockey Gary Stevens won't resume riding until next week, his agent Ron Anderson said Saturday. "He just needs a few more days off," said Anderson. "It's only been 12 days since the (Dec. 18 arthroscopic knee surgery) and there's no sense in him rushing back. He'll start getting on horses late next week."

BEULAH PARK CANCELS LIVE RACING Beulah Park in Grove City, Ohio cancelled its live racing programs for Saturday and Sunday, December 30 and 31, due to conditions brought on by the recent winter weather. The track did offer simulcast wagering over the weekend on portions of the cards from Calder Race Course and the Fair Grounds. Live racing is scheduled to resume at Beulah Park Friday, January 5, 1996.

Hebert, who achieved a benchmark of 2,000 wins Friday at Turfway, ended the meet with 38 wins. The leading owner award went to W.T. Young's Overbrook Farm of Lexington, Kentucky, who appeared in the winner's circle nine times. D. Wayne Lukas was the recipient of the leading trainer award, saddling 55 starters for 21 wins. Racing resumes New Year's Day as Turfway kicks off its 1996 Winter/Spring Meet.
