UNBRIDLED'S SONG BREEZES AT

GULFSTREAM Breeders' Cup Juvenile champ **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled) had his first breeze of the year at Gulfstream yesterday, going three-eighths in an easy :39 2/5 under exercise rider Barry Downes. "It was our initial, half-serious move," said trainer Jim Ryerson. "He went very easy, just galloped along. Normally, when he's in the swing of things, we want to slow him up because he works so fast. We hadn't done anything with him in seven weeks and our concern (yesterday) was that he would do too much. Barry was a little on the conservative side...but I'm happy he went too slow instead of too fast at this point. He came back well and we'll work him again in four or five days, depending on the weather and the track." The colt is scheduled to make his three-year-old debut in the GII Hutcheson S. going seven furlongs February 4.

PHIPPS FILLIES WORK AT PAYSON PARK

Champion **Heavenly Prize** (Seeking the Gold) and Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner **My Flag** (Easy Goer) both stretched their legs at Payson Park yesterday morning, and both will ship to Gulfstream today to prepare for their '96 campaigns. Five-year-old **Heavenly Prize**, who went three furlongs in :39, could meet **Cigar** in the GI Donn H. February 10. "She went real good," said trainer Shug McGaughey. "She is about a month away from her first race. She's got a big chance to run against the boys. Mostly we are thinking about the Gulfstream Park H. (March 2), because **Cigar** won't be in there. If that's the case, we'll try to run her one time before that. But, she may still go in the Donn." **My Flag** breezed a half in :52 and is set to make her three-year-old bow around the first of February; she is being pointed to the GII Bonnie Miss S. at Gulfstream, set for March 13.

RUSSELL BAZE EARNS SPECIAL ECLIPSE

AWARD Jockey Russell Baze has been awarded a Special Eclipse for becoming the first rider ever to win 400 races in four consecutive years. Baze was selected by a committee representing the three sponsoring organizations of the Eclipse Awards--the *Daily Racing Form*, National Turf Writers Association and Thoroughbred Racing Associations. The 37-year-old Canadian has led the U.S. in wins the last four years with 433 in 1992, 410 in '93, 415 in '94 and 448 in '95.

Dove Hunt (Danzig) makes his first start since a fourth-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. A winner of six of 12 '95 starts, the now five-year-old took a Gulfstream turf allowance at this distance last February. **Brazany** (Strawberry Road {Aus}), two-for-three over the Gulfstream grass, returns from a two-month break; he was seventh in the River City H. at Churchill in his latest November 12. **The Vid** (World Appeal) is two-for-two over this course and comes off a strong performance, winning the GIII Tropical Park H. at Calder by a widening six lengths.

PHILLY PARK BACK IN BUSINESS The members of the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association yesterday ratified the tentative agreement reached Thursday with their board and Philadelphia Park. Philadelphia Park President Bob Green said, "We have worked hard to arrive at a fair contract that will continue to strengthen our purse structure over the next two years. We are happy to resume our live racing program on Saturday, January 6." The track, which has not held live racing since December 27 when a strike by union employees caused racing to be cancelled, was forced to drop simulcasting programs as well when the horsemen's contract expired December 31. Negotiations continue with the striking workers.

SANDY HAWLEY SCHEDULED FOR SURGERY

Hall of Fame jockey Sandy Hawley, on the shelf since suffering a broken pelvis, fractured ribs, a separated shoulder and internal injuries when his mount reared and fell on him during a post parade at Woodbine August 2, is scheduled for major surgery at the Sunnybrook Medical Centre in Toronto January 10. "The laser surgery which I had a couple of months ago just didn't correct the problems," said Hawley, who will be hospitalized from eight-to-10 days, then take another month to recuperate before returning to the saddle. "I hope to be able to start getting back on horses by the end of February. I should be able to ride in a few races at Santa Anita before I come home, but I want to be 100 percent ready to go (at Woodbine) opening day (March 23)," said Hawley.

UNBRIDLED'S SONG TOPS CAESARS' DERBY

FUTURE BOOK The road to the 1996 Kentucky Derby has opened and Caesars Palace Olympiad Race Book has placed *Unbridled's Song* (Unbridled) as the 4-1 favorite to win this year's "Run for the Roses." The colt would become the first winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile to take the Derby. Co-second choices are *Cobra King* (Farma Way) and *Ide* (Forty Niner) at 6-1; *Hennessy* (Storm Cat) is being held at 11-1 and *Maria's Mon* (Wavering Monarch) at 12-1. The top fillies on the list at 45-1 are *Cara Rafaela* (Quiet American), *Golden Attraction* (Mr. Prospector) and *My Flag* (Easy Goer).

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

This would represent about a 16 percent increase, from \$274 million in 1995."
