KEENELAND JANUARY SALE STARTS TODAY

Keeneland's annual January Horses of All Ages Sale begins today, and three dispersals--Howard B. Keck, Due Process Stable and the Estate of J.B.W. Carmichael--are among the 1,380 lots catalogued for the four-day auction. The three dispersals are all set for Tuesday. Keck, breeder of 1986 Kentucky Derby winner and 1987 Horse of the Year Ferdinand, will sell 17 horses with Claiborne Farm as agent. Keck is retiring from racing after more than 50 years in the sport. Due Process, with Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency as agent, sells 19 horses including **Sister Dot** (Secretariat), dam of 1993 two-year-old champion Dehere. A yearling half-sister to Dehere by Danzig will also be sold. The Estate of J.B.W. Carmichael, with Fred Seitz/Brookdale Farm as agent, will disperse 13 horses. Carmichael, a Canadian businessman who raced 1981 Queen's Plate winner Fiddle Dancer Boy, died in 1993. In addition to the dispersals, Spinster S. runner-up **Jade Flush** (Jade Hunter) and **Triple Wow** (Coastal), dam of Canadian Horse of the Year Alywow, will also sell Tuesday. Jade Flush, a broodmare prospect, sells for the partnership of Allen Paulson, William Condren and Joseph Cornacchia. Triple Wow, in foal to Gone West, sells for Fred Sietz' Brookdale Farm as agent for Kinghaven Farms. The sale includes 670 broodmares, 438 yearlings, 54 two-year-olds, seven stallions, four stallion shares and 207 horses of other ages, including several stallion prospects. Bidding starts at 10:00 a.m. daily.

GOLDEN KLAIR TOPS FASIG-TIPTON

JANUARY Multiple graded-stakes winner **Golden Klair (GB)** (Damister) brought a bid of \$230,000 to top yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Winter Mixed Sale in Lexington. Consigned by Chance Farm, agent for No Problem and Sido Stables, the six-year-old broodmare prospect was sold to Ben P. Walden Jr. The second-highest price came in for multiple-stakes winner **Mixed Appeal** (Mighty Appealing), who was also purchased by Walden for \$85,000; she was consigned by Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services, Inc., agent for the Estate of Israel Cohen. A total of 144 horses sold Sunday for \$1,258,900; the gross was down 28 percent from the '95 sale, when 178 head sold for \$1,756,100. This year's average of \$8,742 was down 11 percent, from \$9,866 in 1994. *(Top seven, p5)*

Seacliff, who was outrun in the mud at Belmont when 10th in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile in his '95 finale, made his three-year-old debut in the slop but with much better results. Last early after a slow start, the bay made his way past the field to put his head in front midstretch and edged clear as the bettors' 3-5 choice. Said winning jockey Rene Douglas, "The horse alongside of him was very nervous, and when the gate opened my colt jumped up. I lost all that ground, so I just let him settle. I gave away that early ground and then let him make that big move--he really picked it up." Trainer Bill Kaplan said the colt could make his next start in the Hutcheson February 4.

MYSTERY STORM TO HART FARM Dr. and Mrs. E. C. Hart have purchased an interest in multiple graded-stakes winner **Mystery Storm** (Storm Bird) from owner/breeder David Beard. The four-year-old, a winner of seven of his 15 career starts and \$325,580, will stand the 1996 breeding season at Hart Farm in Morriston, Florida for a fee of \$3,500, live foal. "Bringing a horse with Mystery Storm's pedigree, looks, speed and racing class to Florida is an exciting move for our entire industry," said Dr. Hart. "Usually horses like this go straight to Kentucky."

SNOWSTORM KO'S EAST-COAST RACING Four tracks on the East Coast and two more in the Midwest were forced to cancel their cards Sunday due to the blizzard which blanketed some areas with as much as two feet of snow. Aqueduct, Penn National, Philadelphia Park and Laurel Park called off racing Sunday morning; Turfway and Beulah Parks had already issued cancellation notices Saturday. Beulah canceled Saturday's card after a horse slipped and fell during the post parade of the first race.

FRENCH CHAMPION DISLOCATES SHOULDER

Multiple French champion jockey Thierry Jarnet, the young rider who tasted English Classic success for the first time when partnering the Andre Fabre-trained **Pennekamp** (Bering {GB}) to win last May's 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, enjoyed a sweet and sour day at Sha-Tin in Hong Kong Saturday. After riding a winner, **Equine Supremo**, a possible Hong Kong Derby hope, for local trainer Steve Leung, Jarnet dislocated his right shoulder when his mount, **Be My Friend**, bumped another runner and fell at the rear of the field in the very next race. Jarnet had injured the same shoulder last year in a race accident in France and he is now expected to be out of action for two-to-three weeks.

Alpride (Ire) (Alzao), winner of the GI Yellow Ribbon Invitational and GI Beverly Hills H. last year, worked a mile in 1:39 4/5 over a fast main track at Santa Anita yesterday; she will make her next start in this Sunday's GI San Geronio H. Her trainer, Ron McAnally, won the race last year with **Queens Court Queen**.

Jockey Gary Stevens returned to action and to the winner's circle yesterday, winning three races on his first day back after knee surgery.

GI La Brea S. winner **Exotic Wood** (Rahy) could face multi-millionaire **Serena's Song** (Rahy) in the GI Santa Monica H. January 27. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas is considering the Santa Monica or the GI El Encino S. January 20 for **Serena's Song's** four-year-old bow. Trainer Ron Ellis said undefeated **Exotic Wood** would start against the champ "provided she gets about 10 pounds from **Serena's Song**. I feel that's fair. At this point in their careers, their accomplishments aren't even close."

GI Hollywood Futurity winner **Matty G** (Capote) worked six furlongs in 1:16 1/5 yesterday, getting ready for his next appearance, the Santa Catalina February 4.

Last for three-eighths of a mile, the grey came flying on the far turn, sweeping to the lead and rolling to the wire to win in track-record time under jockey Corey Nakatani. "It was the first time I really let him run the entire race," said Nakatani. "Normally, I'll ease up on him and let him coast to the wire. But I wanted to make sure he would extend himself past the wire because he's been pulling himself up before the wire."
