### LONG GONE BLUES TOPS KEENELAND

**WEDNESDAY Long Gone Blues** (Sovereign Dancer), a five-year-old broodmare prospect, brought a top price of \$175,000 during Wednesday's third session of the 1996 Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale. Nobuo Tsunoda of Hokkaido, Japan bought the bay mare, who won the Tropical Park Oaks at age two and earned \$109,159 during her racing career. Overall, 265 horses were sold Wednesday for a gross of \$3,743,700 and an average of \$14,127, up 19.66 percent from last year's third session average of \$11,806. Two stallion shares brought an additional \$6,500. The sale concludes today.

Chaposa Springs was an easy two-length winner of the GIII Virginia H. in her last outing, Dec. 23, and a winner of three other graded stakes last year. The filly dueled for the early lead, gained command on the turn and came home under a hand ride. The win gave jockey Jerry Baily his third straight victory on the Gulfstream program and his first stakes triumph of the 1996 Gulfstream meet. "The other riders took off me, hoping that I would have problems, but my filly doesn't stop. She was rolling at the end," Bailey said. According to trainer Marty Wolfson, Chaposa Springs should start next in the seven-furlong, GIII Shirley Jones H. at Gulfstream Feb. 3.

### Saturday, Santa Anita:

**SAN FERNANDO S.-GII**, \$200,000a, 4yo, 1 1/8m  
Jockey David Flores worked GI Malibu S. third-place finisher **High Stakes Player** (High Brite) five furlongs in a bullet :58 2/5 handily Tuesday morning at Santa Anita. Also working at Santa Anita were San Fernando probables **Gold and Steel (Fr)** (Shining Steel {GB}), who breezed a half-mile in :48 2/5 Tuesday; and GI Malibu S. runner-up **Score Quick** (Northern Score), who went seven furlongs in 1:29 Monday. Gold and Steel, a Group 3 winner in France last year, won the GII American Derby over the Arlington turf in July. The San Fernando will mark the bay colt's first start on the dirt. Also expected to run are: **Big Sky Jim** (Private Terms), **Helmsman** (El Gran Senor), **Mighty Magee** (Cormorant), **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister), **Pinfloron (Fr)** (Caerleon), **Tabor** (Tejano) and **The Key Rainbow (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest).

**BREEZE #2 FOR CIGAR** Trainer Bill Mott confirmed that Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Cigar** (Palace Music) breezed Friday at Payson Park. In his second work of the year, Cigar covered four furlongs in :50 1/5. The six-year-old had also worked a slow half-mile last Tuesday, January 2, and Mott indicated his charge will breeze once more at Payson Park before shipping to Gulfstream to continue preparations for the February 10 GI Donn H. "He went great," Mott said. "We put a horse in front of him, so he was a little more into the bridle. For what we are doing with him right now, it was ideal." According to Mott, Cigar has found a respite from the warpath at Payson Park. "He has a good environment where it is peaceful and laid back. He can enjoy a little vacation from the noise and the sounds of the races and the loud-speaker," the trainer said.

**SHARE IN GULCH TOPS STALLION ACCESS** A share in the 12-year-old stallion **Gulch** (Mr. Prospector) brought a final bid of \$251,000 to top Tuesday evening's Stallion Access January Sale of Selected Seasons and Shares, held at Fasig-Tipton's Newtown Paddocks in Lexington, Kentucky. Gulch, who has sired 14 stakes winners and the earners of over \$10 million in his first four crops, is the sire of Grade/Group 1 winners Thunder Gulch, Wallenda, Harayir, Great Navigator and Torrential. Overall, 11 stallion shares were sold for a gross of \$371,100. The highest price for a 1996 No Guarantee Season was \$67,000 paid for a season in **Nureyev** (Northern Dancer). There were 57 seasons sold for a gross of \$738,600 and an average of \$12,958. The total gross for the sale, including both seasons and shares, was \$1,109,700.

**NO INJURIES IN FAIR GROUNDS FIRE** No injuries to humans or horses were reported following a two-alarm fire Wednesday morning in barn 5 on the Fair Grounds backside. The fire, called in at 6:34 a.m. to the New Orleans Fire Department, was fought by a groom for trainer Merrill Scherer and trainer Buff Bradley until fire officials arrived. A tack room, belonging to Mark and Jennifer Grams, grooms for Scherer, and an area directly above the tack room, were destroyed. The horses were moved to safety and were returned later Wednesday to their stalls. Fire officials determined the cause of the fire to be "misuse of smoking material," which was surmised as a cigarette.

**EARLY DERBY FAVORITE WORKS** Unbridled's **Song** (Unbridled) breezed a half-mile in :48 4/5 Tuesday at Gulfstream Park and remains on target for the February 4 GI Hutcheson S. Trainer Jim Ryerson said he was happy with the work and talked about the difficulties in bringing the Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner back to the races after his winter off. "I think the break in the long run will be beneficial, but it takes a while to get back in the groove," Ryerson said. "My main concern in scheduling his races is that he doesn't peak too soon. I always have to keep in the back of my mind that it is a long year and to look at the big picture. The emphasis in Florida is to get him to do the one thing that he hasn't done--to go two turns." Ryerson is hoping his precocious three-year-old fulfills his early promise in the major races this spring. "Just looking at him, not only because he won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but the ability he showed early on and his appearance right now, we feel we have one of the better three-year-olds in the world," the trainer continued. "If we get a bit lucky and it goes all right physically, then hopefully through the course of the year we will have a chance to prove that."

**PURE GRAIN BACK HOME** Pure Grain (GB) (Polish Precedent), who suffered a fractured cannon bone while finishing tenth behind Lando in the Japan Cup last November, finally returned to her stall at Michael Stoute's Newmarket Stables. The four-year-old filly, winner of last year's Irish and Yorkshire Oaks, flew into Britain Wednesday morning. Owner Robert Barnett reported, "She's in good shape. Everything went smoothly on the flight and our own vet is going to assess her condition before we decide if she can be covered this season. The Japanese authorities have really been a tremendous help and it is great to have Pure Grain back safe and sound."

**ARC MAY LOSE SPONSOR** The Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe is in jeopardy of losing its sponsor of the last two years. According to a report in Wednesday's *Racing Post*, if the Forte hotel groups are taken over by Granada, the company would not seek to renew its sponsorship of one of Europe's most prestigious races. Granada just recently raised its offer for the company to 3.8 billion pounds (approximately \$5.9 billion), increasing the possibility of its acceptance. Forte is in the last year of a three-year contract to sponsor the race, so this year's race will be sponsored by the company regardless of the outcome of the takeover attempt. Forte has advised its shareholders to reject the increased bid.

**RAHY FILLIES BREEZE** Exotic Wood (Rahy) and Serena's Song (Rahy), headed for a possible showdown in the GI Santa Monica H. at seven furlongs Jan. 27, both worked at Santa Anita early this week. Undefeated Exotic Wood, winner of all five career starts including the GII La Brea S. at Santa Anita Dec. 30, breezed a half-mile in :49 2/5 Tuesday. Serena's Song, winner of 12 graded stakes for earnings of over \$2.1 million, was clocked in 1:01 3/5 for five furlongs Monday.

**WORK THE CROWD RETIRED** Harris Farms has announced that **Work The Crowd** (Political Ambition) has been retired from racing due to complications from her bout with pneumonia in November. The five-year-old mare won 14 of 22 starts, including 12 stakes, five of them graded, for earnings of \$594,549. Owned and bred by Harris Farms and the family of Sen. Ken Maddy, the California-bred mare was trained throughout her career by Greg Gilchrist. Breeding plans for the 1996 season have not been decided.

Leigh, breeder of 1994 Breeders' Cup Mile winner Baratheas, was a TBA Council member from 1982 to 1986.

**GARDEN STATE PARK SET TO OPEN** Garden State Park is scheduled to open Friday night, January 12. Officials at the Cherry Hill, New Jersey track are hoping the weather cooperates and the track can open on time. Track General Manager Richard Orbann is hoping for the best. "Everything is in pretty good shape and we're ready and anxious to go," he said. "But now we have to sweat out this storm forecast for Thursday night or Friday. We won't know for sure whether we can open until we see what it does to us." The track weathered Sunday's blizzard in fine shape. Track crews, supplemented by specially-hired outside work forces, accomplished the monumental task of clearing the 280-acre property, and the track is scheduled to be open for training Thursday.

### **STRUGGLER JOINS LLOYD WEBBER CAST**

**Struggler** (GB) (Night Shift), winner of the G3 Prix de Saint-Georges at Longchamp last May, has been purchased by Sir Andrew Lloyd Webber. The four-year-old colt, now in training with Newmarket-based David Loder, was bought for approximately \$200,000 at Newmarket's December Sales and will be aimed toward this year's top sprint races. Loder, also handler of Blue Duster, Europe's top juvenile filly of 1995, said, "Struggler is a very nice horse. He has been with me a month and a half and already has good form. So I will be trying to win as many races as possible with him." Struggler's last race was a 10th-place effort in the King George S. at Goodwood July 25, the only off-the-board finish so far in his seven-race career.

### **EMERALD DOWNS READY FOR OCCUPANCY**

The final beam of structural steel was put in place atop the grandstand during "Topping Off" ceremonies at Emerald Downs Racetrack in Auburn, Washington Tuesday. Opening Day for Emerald Downs' 100-day inaugural season is Thursday, June 20. Mayor Charles Booth of Auburn and Northwest Racing Associates President Ron Crockett were among those who signed the red, white and blue steel I-beam that was raised to the top of the grandstand by Sellen Construction Co. workmen. "It's been a long time in coming and there were doubts along the way, but Mr. Crockett's determination was the difference," said Mayor Booth. "It's an important day for both the city of Auburn and the entire region and congratulations to the Thoroughbred industry are in order." Construction at Emerald Downs began immediately after the April 17, 1995 ground breaking ceremony. The six-story, 330-foot long grandstand has become a Kent-Auburn valley landmark and the "Topping Off" beam was the last of 2,000 tons of structural steel framing the building.

**NEW CAREER FOR PRIZE FIGHT** Trainer James Keefer reported yesterday that **Prize Fight** (Fight Over), hero of the 1994 GII Razorback H., has been retired from flat racing. The seven-year-old will take on a new career as a jumper. "The old gelding just ran out of furlongs," said Keefer. "He had been a solid runner, but getting along in years, could no longer be competitive with the better horses. He had been too good for us to be hammering on him just for the sake of winning a few more purses." The Florida-bred leaves the flats having won 12 of 45 starts for earnings of \$423,826.

**EXETERA OUT OF DERBY PICTURE** Exetera (Forty Niner), third in both the 1995 GII Norfolk S. and GIII Hollywood Prevue Breeders' Cup S., has been turned out for three months following surgery to remove a chip from his right knee, trainer Ron McAnally told the *Daily Racing Form*. Owned by Verne Winchell, the recently-turned three-year-old colt last raced Dec. 17, finishing sixth in the GI Hollywood Futurity.

**PURPLE COMET TO VIRGINIA** The 15-year-old stallion **Purple Comet** (Kohoutek), who previously stood at Green Willow Farm in Maryland, is moving to Virginia for the 1996 breeding season in anticipation of the new breeders award program in the state. A multiple stakes-winner of \$234,614, Purple Comet has sired five winners from 13 starters to date. His best runner, Vallata Lane, was third in last year's GIII Roseben H. at Belmont and has won five of 21 starts for earnings of \$124,969. Owned by David Reynolds, Purple Comet will stand at Eagle Point Farm in Ashland, Virginia, which is managed by Donna G. Dennehy, for a 1996 fee of \$750 live foal.

**NEW INTERNET RACING SITE PLANNED** Thoroughbred Sports Network and the Spanner Group have announced plans for an on-line Internet site for central distribution of racing information. The Spanner/TSN World Wide Web site will provide racing and handicapping information for all North American tracks, according to an announcement from the two companies.
