TEAM CIGAR TOPS ECLIPSE AWARDS

Leaving no doubt as to who will be named Horse of the Year, **Cigar** (Palace Music) yesterday led his team to four Eclipse Awards for their outstanding achievements in 1995. Cigar, named the year's top Older Horse, was the only champion, equine or human, to receive every single vote in his category; his trainer, **Bill Mott**, and jockey, **Jerry Bailey**, both earned their first Eclipse Awards in tighter races. "To have come close before and not won makes it that much more special when you do," said Bailey, who had missed out to Pat Day in '91 and Mike Smith in '93. "There is no absolute criteria or parameters for the voting, so you're never too sure if you've done what it takes. So you work a little harder; it helps to have a horse like Cigar, and people like Allen Paulson and Bill Mott in your corner." Cigar's owner, **Allen Paulson**, champion breeder of 1993, picked up his second Eclipse as top Owner of '95. There were no real surprises in the rest of the categories; the 1995 Eclipse-winning horses are: **Golden Attraction** (Mr. Prospector), Two-Year-Old Filly; **Maria's Mon** (Wavering Monarch), Two-Year-Old Colt/Gelding; **Serena's Song** (Rahy), Three-Year-Old Filly; **Thunder Gulch** (Gulch), Three-Year-Old Colt/Gelding; **Inside Information** (Private Account), Older Filly/Mare; **Not Surprising** (Medieval Man), Sprinter; **Possibly Perfect** (Northern Baby), Turf Mare; **Northern Spur (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), Turf Horse; and **Lonesome Glory** (Transworld), Steeplechaser. Trainer Rick Schosberg reported on the condition of his champion, Maria's Mon. "He is due to start walking in the next day or two," he said. "He will be X-rayed again today or tomorrow, but based on the reports from Hart Farm, so far everything has been perfect. The post-operative X-rays were perfect; there was never any displacement. He should be back in light training by February. The Derby is out of the question unless a miracle occurs. He won't even get back to New York until April 1. It's more likely that we will have him ready for Belmont Day, and run him in the Riva Ridge at seven furlongs. That should set him up for Saratoga and the Travers." **Juddmonte Farms**, owned by Prince Khalid Abdullah, earned its second Eclipse; this year's outstanding breeder was also named top owner of 1992. Juddmonte bred 22 stakes winners last year, including six Grade I winners. **Ramon Perez** was named champion Apprentice Jockey for '95. The Eclipse Awards will be presented, and the Horse of the Year will be announced, Friday, February 9 at the Hotel del Coronado in San Diego.

KEENELAND JANUARY ENDS WITH HUGE INCREASES IN GROSS, AVERAGE

Keeneland's January Horses of All Ages Sale ended Thursday with huge increases in gross sales and average. Keeneland sold 996 horses during the four-day auction for a gross of \$30,268,100, a 56.2 percent increase from last year and the second highest in the 40-year history of the annual auction. In 1995, 1,032 horses were sold for a gross of \$19,383,600. This year's average was \$30,390, up 61.8 percent from last year's \$18,783. Three stallion shares brought an additional \$7,000. Contributing to the increases were two major dispersals. Howard B. Keck sold 16 horses for \$5,907,000, an average of \$369,188. Robert Brennan's Due Process Stable sold 19 horses for \$5,176,000, an average of \$272,421. Top price of the sale was \$1.8 million paid by Hugo Lascelles, agent, for **Lydara**, a daughter of Alydar in foal to Danzig. It was the fifth highest price in the history of the January Sale. Lydara was sold during Tuesday's session as part of the Keck dispersal. During Thursday's final session, Keeneland sold 219 horses for \$1,629,500, an average of \$7,441. P.F. McCarthy, as agent, paid the day's highest price of \$162,000 for the six-year-old broodmare **Alashir** (Alysheba). A stakes-winner in Peru, Alashir is in foal to Summer Squall.

News Continued.**CHURCHILL UNVEILS '96 STAKES SCHEDULE**

Headed by record purses for the Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks, Churchill Downs will offer the richest stakes schedule in track history for its 1996 Spring and Fall meets. A total of 26 stakes, worth a record \$4.05 million and highlighted by 12 graded events, will be offered during the 48-day Spring Meet, April 27-June 30; an additional \$1.5 million in stakes will be featured during the 30-day Fall Meet, October 27-November 30. Increases have moved the GI Kentucky Derby to a \$1 million guaranteed gross purse, and the GI Kentucky Oaks to \$500,000 guaranteed, making it the richest three-year-old filly race in the country. "From top to bottom, the 1996 stakes schedule ranks as one of the best in the country," said Vice President of Racing Don Richardson. "Our stakes schedule serves as the cornerstone for our entire racing program. The quality and success of our stakes will carry through and ensure the success of our overall racing." This year's Derby week will feature 12 events totaling \$1,775,000, including the Early Times Classic, which has earned GI status for the '96 running. Nine of the 11 stakes on the fall schedule are graded; the program is highlighted by the "Fall Meet Final Four," four stakes races held the last three days of the meet. The Final Four are the GIII \$200,000 Falls City, November 28; GIII \$200,000 Clark H., November 29; and GIII \$150,000 Golden Rod and GIII \$150,000 Brown & Williamson Kentucky Jockey Club November 30.

CIGAR ON PAYSON WORK TAB Continuing to prepare for his seasonal debut in the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park February 10, **Cigar** (Palace Music) worked five furlongs in 1:03 1/5 at Payson Park yesterday. Jockey Jerry Bailey was aboard for the breeze. "He was very aggressive, very eager," said Bailey. "He looks great." Tim Jones, assistant to trainer Bill Mott, added, "He came out of the work very well. The time was very good for this track; it's comparable to about 1:01 at Gulfstream or Belmont. There is a big track variance--this is a deep, sandy track." Jones added that plans to ship the champ to Gulfstream are still undecided.

JRA ANNOUNCES INTERNATIONAL RACES The Japan Racing Association yesterday released a list of seven Japanese races which will be open to foreign-bred horses with foreign racing experience. The list includes, for the first time, the G2 Mainichi Okan. The Mainichi Okan, a nine furlong turf event for ages three and up, will be run October 6, 1996 and will be worth \$1,303,310. The international race list includes three group one races, three group two races and one non-group race. Two of the races are invitationals--the Nov. 10 Fuji S., worth \$421,478; and the Nov. 24 G1 Japan Cup, worth \$3,415,319. The other four races are the May 11 G2 Keio Hai Spring Cup, worth \$1,218,245; the June 9 G1 Yasuda Kinen, worth \$1,916,282, the Sept. 15 G2 Sankei-Sho All Comers, worth \$1,303,310, and the December 15 G1 Sprinters S., worth \$1,916,282.

POSSIBLY PERFECT TO GONE WEST **Possibly Perfect** (Northern Baby), who was yesterday named the 1995 Eclipse Award winner as Champion Turf Mare, will be bred to Gone West this year, according to her owner Bob Witt. The six-year-old mare, who was retired in November after suffering a torn ligament, won 11 of 18 career starts, including six Grade I events, and earned \$1,377,273.

OAKLAWN OPENS TODAY Marking its earliest opening ever, Oaklawn Park in Hot Springs, Arkansas opens its gates today for the 64-day, 1996 live racing season. Oaklawn will start off with a four-day weekend, January 12-15, follow with three-days of racing the next two weekends, Jan. 19-21 and Jan. 26-28, then race five-day weeks from Jan. 31 to the close of action April 13. Today's opening day card is highlighted by the \$50,000-added Dixie Belle S. for three-year-old fillies at 5 1/2-furlongs. "I am very pleased with the opening day card," said Pat Pope, Oaklawn's racing secretary. "The supporting feature is a \$35,000 allowance race for fillies and mares. It drew a couple of stakes-winners, **Morning Meadow** (Meadowlake) and **Ruddy Eagle** (Beau's Leader)." Highlighting the track's stakes schedule are the \$750,000 Oaklawn H. for four-year-olds and up at 1 1/8-miles, to be run Saturday, April 6; the \$250,000 Fantasy S. for three-year-old fillies at 1 1/16-miles, to be run Friday, April 5; the \$500,000 Apple Blossom H. for fillies and mares ages four and up at 1 1/16-miles, to be run Friday, April 12; and the \$500,000 Arkansas Derby for three-year-olds at 1 1/8-miles, to be run Saturday, April 13.

McGAUGHEY FILLIES WORK Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold) and **My Flag** (Easy Goer) both worked Wednesday morning at Gulfstream Park. Heavenly Prize worked three furlongs in :37 3/5 and could be heading for the GI Donn H. (Feb 10). According to trainer Shug McGaughey, "If she gets ready in time, she'll go. Our objective is the Gulfstream Park H. (March 2). The Donn is a lot of money and prestige and is a good spot. We'll probably run her in there." Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner My Flag worked a half-mile in :51 and McGaughey reports her vacation at Payson Park has done her a world of good. "She has matured a lot physically and mentally," the trainer said. "She did so great up at Payson, I almost wanted to keep her there. She is not nearly as flighty as she was before we gave her the six weeks off."

TURFWAY CANCELS THURSDAY NIGHT CARD

Turfway Park canceled Thursday night's live racing card due to the weather forecast which predicted heavy snowfall for the region. The Florence, Kentucky track remained open during the day Thursday for simulcasting from out-of-state tracks. "With over 50 horses scheduled to ship from Louisville and Lexington for tonight's races, we decided to call the races early to avoid the problems of shipping in adverse weather conditions," said Turfway General Manager Greg Schmitz. This is the third weather-related cancellation Turfway has experienced this year. Live racing is scheduled to resume tonight at 7 p.m.

DEL MAR TO CONSTRUCT NEW BARN AND QUARTERS FOR 1996

The Del Mar Thoroughbred Club has announced plans to demolish one of its oldest barns and replace it with a new one that also will provide living quarters for stable help in time for the opening of the 1996 racing season this summer. The new building will rise on the footprint of the ancient Barn "E," a 76-stall adobe structure built for the track's opening in 1937. The barn will feature 32 individual rooms for stable personnel. "We've recently spent over \$80 million on our new grandstand facility and now it's time for us to concentrate on the barn area," said Del Mar's President and General Manager Joseph W. Harper. "The new barn will be a good step in that direction and one of the pluses for us when Del Mar is up for consideration again to host the Breeders' Cup." The \$500,000 needed for the new structure was approved by the state Race Track Authority. The 1996 Del Mar racing season will open for a 43-day run July 24.

SHIRLEY HEIGHTS RECOVERING Shirley Heights (GB) (Mill Reef), the Royal Stud's stallion who had 30 centimeters of gut removed last week after an attack of colic, is making a rapid recovery, with hopes rising that he can cover mares this year, according to a story in yesterday's *Racing Post*. The 1978 Horse of the Year in England and Champion Three-Year-Old Colt in Ireland is one of Britain's most successful sires, and even at the age of 21 was expected to receive more than 40 mares when the covering season begins in five weeks. Among Shirley Heights offspring are champions Shady Heights (GB), Slip Anchor (GB), Darshaan (GB), High Estate (GB) and High Hawk (Ire).

FHBPA REACHES PARTIAL SETTLEMENT The Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association has successfully concluded settlement negotiations with a significant number of off-track betting outlets in an effort to protect the interests of Florida horsemen during the upcoming 1996 racing meet at Hialeah. In June, 1995, the FHBPA filed an action in federal court in Miami against Hialeah and 75 casinos, racetracks and other off-track betting systems charging Hialeah with violation of its 1995 contract with the FHBPA and with underpayment of purses to horsemen during its 1995 racing meet. In December, the FHBPA reached an agreement with the eight Atlantic City casinos which take interstate wagers on races run at Hialeah. The casinos agreed not to take interstate wagers on Hialeah races without the consent of the FHBPA. FHBPA Executive Director Kent Stirling said, "You can rest assured the FHBPA will not give its consent to these wagers until it reaches a satisfactory written contract with Hialeah that pays money owed to horsemen for the 1995 meet, and protects the horsemen's rights in the upcoming 1996 meet." The FHBPA has similar settlements with other out-of-state racetracks and off-track systems being finalized. FHBPA President Scott Savin said negotiations with Hialeah for its upcoming 1996 meet are underway.

LAUREL BEGINS REOPENING PROCESS Laurel Park reopened for simulcast wagering Thursday and has scheduled a live racing program for this Saturday following a blizzard that forced the cancellation of four programs. A snowfall of more than 25 inches blanketed the mid-Atlantic area last Sunday and cost the Maryland track four live racing cards. With traffic at a virtual standstill in the area during the storm and afterward, Laurel management decided to hold off simulcast cards as well until Thursday. Simulcast betting will be offered again today, then Saturday, the Laurel racing strip is scheduled to come alive with a 10-race card headed by the \$50,000-added Northern Wolf S.

DELAWARE RELEASES STAKES SCHEDULE

The 1996 stakes calendar at Delaware Park is highlighted by a \$50,000 increase in the purse of the Delaware H., a \$465,000 purse enhancement in the overall stakes structure and the revival of several older stakes fixtures. The Delaware H. purse has been increased to \$200,000 and will remain a 1 1/4 mile race for fillies and mares. Fourteen stakes with minimum purses of \$50,000 are scheduled for 1996. The New Castle H. has been resurrected and added to the schedule carrying a purse of \$100,000. Three new stakes races have been added and five races will be run again after having been discontinued for several years. The purse increases come on the heels of Delaware's record 1995 season which saw a 61 percent increase in total handle as compared to 1994. The Wilmington, Delaware track will run from April 28 through Oct. 13, 1996, and offer \$950,000 in stakes purses.

NYRA HAS NEW BOARD MEMBERS The New York Racing Association has added two new members to its Board of Trustees. Dolph Rotfeld, the head of a Westchester County-based engineering consulting firm, and John Meriwether, the co-founder of a Greenwich, Connecticut-based private investment management firm, are the newest NYRA board members. Rotfeld is a long-time racing enthusiast and Meriwether owns a string of horses trained by Mike Freeman. Meriwether owned 1995 Dwyer winner Hoolie, in partnership.

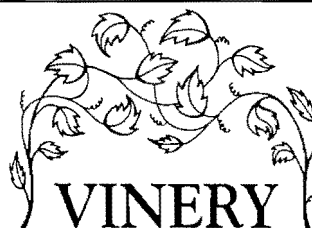

Gold Fever (Forty Niner) breezed five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 Thursday morning and is doing well, according to trainer Shug McGaughey. The three-year-old colt was scratched from the Spectacular Bid S. Sunday when the track came up muddy and is now being pointed for the GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 4 with an allowance prep if the timing works out. McGaughey's only concern about his charge is if he'll handle a distance. "My only hesitation is how far he wants to go," McGaughey said. "I'll give him a chance. If he is not good enough to run against the best sprinters here and he doesn't want to stretch out, I'll put him on the road. I hope he is good enough to run in the Florida Derby and beyond."

Scott C. Savin's five-year-old **Patton** (Lord at War {Arg}), off since finishing sixth in the Gulfstream Park Sprint H. in March of 1995, worked a half-mile from the gate in :47 flat at Gulfstream yesterday. A stakes-winner of \$119,000, Patton may return to the races in the \$50,000 Deputy Minister H., a six-furlong test to be run at Gulfstream Feb. 18.

Local News: England

The first foal by **Ezzoud (Ire)** (Last Tycoon {Ire}), a three-time Group 1 winner and England's highweight older horse from 9.5-11 furlongs in 1994, was born Tuesday at the Royal Stud in Norfolk. The filly, bred by Her Majesty the Queen, is out of the mare **Australia Fair (Aust)** (Without Fear {Fr}) and is a half-sister to stakes-winning sprinter Double Blue (GB) (Town and Country {GB}).

King's Theatre (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), winner of the 1994 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. but winless in five tries in America last year, is wintering in Dubai and will likely return to England to race in 1996. The five-year-old was twice third in the States, including a close finish in the GI Sword Dancer H. at Saratoga.

The number of horses in training in Britain last year increased by 5.5 percent, according to a story in yesterday's *Racing Post*. Figures produced by Weatherbys Wednesday cited 10,588 horses in Britain in 1995, up from the 1994 total of 10,032. However, the number of owners in Britain was down by 0.5 percent, to 8,202 from 8,244.
