AQUEDUCT CANCELS AFTER SUNDAY'S

SECOND RACE Racing was cancelled at Aqueduct yesterday after the running of the second race. Rain checks for admission, programs and parking were issued to patrons. "The jockeys felt the surface had become uneven," said Terry Meyocks, New York Racing Association vice president of operations. Live racing is expected to resume today with a first post of 12:30 p.m.

"THOROUGHBRED WORLD" RENEWED FOR

Wandesta, back-to-back winner of the GI Santa Ana H. and GI Santa Barbara H. over the Santa Anita turf last year, most recently raced Nov. 26, finishing third in the GI Matriarch S. at Hollywood Park. Rested from her two-month hiatus, the chestnut mare was rated between rivals past the wire the first time and on the first turn, continued inside but off the rail on the backside, launched a bid three-wide on the second turn, gained command outside pacesetter Yearly Tour in upper stretch and pulled clear under regular jockey Corey Nakatani for the victory. "She ran her race, that's for sure," said Nakatani. "She had trouble in the Matriarch, and that definitely cost her that race. Today, there weren't so many horses, and she was in the right place. She's one of the top grass mares in the country." The 3-2 bettors' choice ALPRIDE (IRE) (Alzao), seventh as the favorite in the Matriarch after winning the GI Yellow Ribbon Nov. 12, pressed the slow early fractions of :24 3/5 and :48 4/5 set by Yearly Tour, but weakened in the stretch to be fourth. "She just didn't fire today, and there was no apparent reason," said Alpride's jockey Chris McCarron. "She pulled up good. She got real washy and seemed upset about something in the post parade. I don't know if that contributed to her poor performance. All I know is she ran a subpar race."

A winner of back-to-back Calder allowances on dirt and turf in his two previous starts, the chestnut was sent off the third choice here and improved off his most recent effort, rolling down the stretch from the far outside to take the lead near the eighth pole and draw clear. The 9-5 favorite DARN THAT ERICA (Darn That Alarm), runner-up in the Tropical Park Derby, never got untracked and finished ninth.

RAW GOLD READY FOR THREE-YEAR-OLD

DEBUT Raw Gold (Rahy), who captured the GII Landaluce and Althea S. at Hollywood Park during her 1995 juvenile campaign, may make her three-year-old debut in the GIII \$100,000 Bay Meadows Oaks this Sunday, Jan. 21. "We're considering two races for her--the Santa Ynez here (at Santa Anita) and the race up there (at Bay Meadows)," said trainer David Hofmans Sunday morning. "I'm leaning toward the Oaks because I want to run this filly a route of ground. We'll have a decision Wednesday." The GIII \$100,000a Santa Ynez is a seven furlong dash that will be run Jan. 28. The Bay Meadows Oaks will be decided at 1 1/16-miles. Raw Gold has won three of five starts and \$115,375. Both the Landaluce and Althea were six-furlong affairs.

DON DRYER DEAD Don Dryer, a longtime owner and fan of Thoroughbred racing, died Wednesday in Portland, Oregon at the age of 84. Dryer, who raced under the nom de course Pine Creek Ranch, was involved in the sport for over 50 years and primarily used Southern California-based Mel Stute as his trainer. "Ever since I won a race for him in the late 1940's, I was the only trainer he ever had," Stute said. "He was just a fine man who absolutely loved the sport of Thoroughbred racing." **Cosmic Fire** (Caspote), second in the GII Sorrento S. and Bay Meadows Lassie S. in 1995, is one of the Pine Creek Ranch horses currently in training with Stute. Dryer is survived by a son, Don Jr., and a daughter, Jan.
