PHONE CHATTER RETIRED Phone Chatter (Phone Trick), the 1993 Champion Two-year-old Filly and Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner, has been retired from racing. Now five, the mare won three graded races as a two-year-old but was unable to recapture her winning form in recent starts. Trainer Richard Mandella resignedly reported his filly's retirement. "She's going home and will be bred to Gone West." Mandella has been frustrated by Phone Chatter's inability to win a race in her last eight starts, and said, "I'm disappointed. I just couldn't get her back to where she was. You can't blame her. Blame me." Phone Chatter made her last start Saturday at Santa Anita, finishing fourth in an allowance race. She retires with five wins in 15 starts and earnings of \$838,741.

FASIG-TIPTON CATALOGUES TWO-YEAR-OLD SALE Fasig-Tipton has catalogued 357 entries for its Selected Two-year-olds in Training Sale at Calder, set for February 26-27. The two-year-olds will be offered in two sessions, with 100 scheduled for a 7:30 p.m. start Monday, February 26, and the balance Tuesday, February 27, from 12:00 noon. The under-tack show will be held on the Calder main track beginning at 10:00 a.m. Sunday, February 25. "We always like to say 'It's the best catalogue ever,' but, by pedigree standards, this is unquestionably our best," noted Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "Last year, we had 39 graded or group stakes winners under our first dams. In 1996, we have 49. The sire power is comparable and we are looking forward to a strong sale." Catalogues will be mailed January 19. They will also be available from all Fasig-Tipton offices, from Regent Company in Tokyo, from Hyperion Promotions in England and from racing secretaries' offices at major tracks running in North America.

HORSE KILLED IN BELMONT BARN FIRE A fire which was contained almost entirely to one stall in Belmont Park's Barn 57 yesterday afternoon resulted in the death of one Thoroughbred, the unraced three-year-old colt **What An Evening** (Festin {Arg}). The fire, which broke out at approximately 1:15 p.m., was believed to have been started when the colt reared up and hit his head on the stall's heating lamp, breaking the bulb and causing sparks and the lamp's hot filament to drop and ignite the straw. The fire was kept from spreading by the barn's sprinkler system. The colt killed was trained by Del Carroll II; there were no other serious injuries.

EL ENCINO S.-GII, \$125,000a, 4yo, f, 8.5f
Undeclared **Exotic Wood** (Rahy) is now listed as probable for the El Encino. The filly had also been considered for the GI Santa Monica January 27, but trainer Ron Ellis said yesterday that owner Martin Wygod wants to run Saturday. "We'll discuss it some more, but it looks like Marty wants to run this weekend," said Ellis. The four-year-old will be making her two-turn debut. She worked six furlongs in 1:13 3/5 Monday. Also expected for the race are **Evil's Pic** (Piccolino), **Jewel Princess** (Key to the Mint), **Privity** (Private Account), **Sleep Easy** (Seattle Slew) and **Urbane** (Citidancer). **Sharp Point** (GB) (Keen {GB}) is also possible.

EL CAMINO REAL DERBY-GIII, \$200,000, 3yo, 8.5f
GI Hollywood Starlet winner **Cara Rafaela** (Quiet American) may take on the colts in the El Camino Real Derby. "I'm leaning towards running the filly," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "But I'm going to do some research. I want to weigh all of the pros and cons. I've got some options, and I just want to do what's right." The three-year-old, who would become the first of her sex to run in the El Camino Real Derby, has won three of her nine starts, including the Starlet and the GI Alcibiades at Keeneland, for earnings of \$546,962; she is scheduled to breeze today. Definite for the race, **Air Bag** (Devil's Bag) worked six furlongs in 1:13 at Bay Meadows yesterday. The gelding will make his third career start Saturday after breaking his maiden by 6 1/2 lengths going a mile at the Northern California oval January 6. **Cavonnier** (Batonnier), recently named champion Cal-bred two-year-old of 1995, also drilled six furlongs yesterday, going the distance in 1:12 4/5 at Santa Anita. Also pointing for the race are **E C's Dream** (Incinderator), **Jazzmanian Devil** (Jazzing Around), **Mateo** (Lil Tyler), **Mountain Skier** (Baldski) and **Stormy Diplomat** (Deputy Minister); possible are **Prince Of Thieves** (Hansel), **Sergeant Stroh** (Desert Wine) and **Sociallyunencumber** (Hansel).

UNBRIDLED'S SONG SHARP AT GULFSTREAM

Unbridled's Song (Unbridled), prepping for his three-year-old debut in the GII Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream February 4, worked five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 yesterday. "He worked very well and very comfortably," said trainer Jim Ryerson. "He may have gone a little bit faster than what we were looking for, but there was another horse out there breezing that contributed to it. The main thing we are trying to do is get him back to where we left off. This work definitely gets him closer to where we want to be."

FLANDERS TO SEATTLE SLEW The 1994 Champion Two-year-old Filly **Flanders** (Seeking the Gold) is scheduled to be bred to Seattle Slew this year. The filly won four of her five career starts, her only loss coming via a disqualification. She earned four Grade I victories, culminating with her game nose win over Serena's Song in the 1994 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She was forced into retirement after suffering a fractured cannon bone and lateral sesamoid of her right front leg in that race; she goes to the breeding shed with earnings of \$805,000.

TURFWAY POSTS RECORD HANDLE FOR '95

Spurred by full-card simulcast wagering and a rich racing program, Turfway Park's total wagering climbed 32.5 percent to a record \$85,737,350 in 1995. Kentucky intertrack and off-track wagering during Turfway's three 1995 meets rose by approximately one-quarter, and Turfway's races proved popular with out-of-state outlets; wagering on the track's programs at out-of-state, full-card simulcasting facilities more than doubled to \$95.1 million last year. The wagering increases resulted in a 30-percent increase in Turfway's purses over the year, which swelled to a record average of \$196,044 daily. "With the arrival of full-card simulcasting in Kentucky, we renewed our commitment to our fans to provide the finest racing in the finest facilities, and The Race Book at Turfway Park was the most tangible part of that commitment," said President Mark Simendinger. "The wagering levels are clear evidence that our fans have embraced the choices of live racing and full-card simulcasting signals that we offer. In 1996, we will strive to continue to provide our fans with a high-quality racing product." Of the record \$85.7 million wagered at Turfway last year, the most dramatic increase was in full-card simulcasting, which rose nine-fold from 1994 levels to \$41,478,166 in '95. Total wagering at Turfway, in three live meets and two simulcast meets in the summer and fall, was \$150,799,514, up 43.2 percent from 1994.

HOLY BULL S.-GIII, \$75,000, 3yo, 8.5f

Cobra King (Farma Way) worked five-eighths in 1:00 2/5 at Gulfstream Monday morning and will make his seasonal bow in the Holy Bull. "He worked great," said trainer Mike Puype. "He blew a little bit after the work--he obviously needed it. It was a good tightener." Jockey Mike Smith was aboard for the move, but Chris McCarron is scheduled to fly in from California for the race. The three-year-old has had to overcome one distraction as he prepares for the Holy Bull. Stabled in Gulfstream's Barn 32, he is right behind the track's seven-furlong chute where the morning gate schooling takes place. "We keep his radio on very loud," said Susie Puype, Mike's wife. "That bell rings all morning and he was going nuts when he first got here. The radio helps, and he is getting used to it here."

"He didn't have any excuse that I could tell," said jockey Chris McCarron. "He felt great...he just wasn't there when I asked him."

The eight-year-old gelding, who was trained by Michelle's father, Wally Dollase, was retired after he fractured a sesamoid in his final start, the Cal Cup Mile November 11.

Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms), pointing for the GI Strub S. February 4, worked a mile in 1:38 3/5, handily, at Hollywood Park Monday.

The well-regarded three-year-old **Dr. Caton** (Seattle Slew), who is expected to make his first career start next month, worked six furlongs in a bullet 1:12 1/5 under jockey Gary Stevens Monday. Trained by D. Wayne Lukas, the colt was purchased for \$325,000 as a yearling from the Keeneland July sale.

When asked what's next for Mighty Magee, trainer Leon Blusiewicz responded, "Either the General George (at Laurel) February 9th or the Strub in California February 4th."
