NATIONAL HBPA PROPOSES MEDICATION

POLICY The National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (NHBPA) has issued a blueprint for a national policy on therapeutic medications which would allow the racing industry full scope in maintaining the health and welfare of the horse while ensuring the integrity of racing. The primary goal of the NHBPA plan is to conduct rigorous and highly sensitive testing for performance-altering drugs. A secondary goal is to eliminate administrative actions based on findings of inactive or trace residues of legitimate therapeutic medications. In addition, the NHBPA has proposed the following regulation to state racing commissions and for possible adoption by the Association of Racing Commissioners International: When an official laboratory identifies a veterinary-approved medication, and the level of the medication is considered by expert scientific opinion not to be therapeutic or pharmacologically effective, it would be concluded that such an ineffective level does not constitute a violation of the rules of racing.

KEENELAND TEAMS WITH CHURCHILL FOR DERBY WEEK SALE

Keeneland has joined forces with Churchill Downs to conduct the horses-in-training sale in Louisville during Derby week. The sale was held for the first time in '95, but will be handled by Keeneland for the first time this year. The Keeneland at Churchill Downs Horses In Training Sale is set for Wednesday night, May 1, at the Sports Spectrum. The sale will follow the Kentucky Derby post position draw. "Derby week in Louisville is an excellent opportunity for us to expand our expertise into the horses in training market," said Keeneland President Bill Greely. The sale closes Friday, March 1; catalogues will be available three-to-four weeks before the auction. Horses for the sale will be stabled at Sports Spectrum.

LAUREL, TURFWAY CANCEL FRIDAY

Due to inclement weather conditions locally, live racing was canceled at both Turfway and Laurel yesterday, but the facilities at Laurel and Pimlico and Turfway's Race Book remained open for simulcast wagering. Turfway officials made the decision to scrap the evening's card early in the day as temperatures with the wind chill factored in were predicted to drop dangerously low. Live racing is expected to resume at both tracks today, with first post set for 12:45 p.m. at Laurel and 1:00 p.m. at Turfway. News cont. p2

Editor's Note (Forty Niner) makes his three-year-old debut; the Team Lukas colt just missed in the GIII Kentucky Jockey Club S. in his final start at two. He teams up with jockey Jerry Bailey, who steered him to a third-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Canadian champion **Gomtuu** (Hail the Ruckus), on the board in all seven dirt starts, rushed up after a slow start in the GIII Spectacular Bid S. at six furlongs in his seasonal bow, then weakened to finish third. The chestnut captured the GIIIC Grey S. at this distance by 6 1/2 lengths. **Cat On Tour** (Tour d'Or), four-for-five lifetime, has taken back-to-back Calder stakes at this distance; tries graded company for the first time.

MAKTOUM COLTS TO AUSTRALIA Last season's St. Leger third **Istidaad** (Chief's Crown) and **Munwar** (GB) (Kalaglow {Ire}), winner of Lingfield's Derby Trial, have been sent to Australia to continue their racing careers. The colts, owned by Hamdan al Maktoum and rated at 112 in the International Classifications, will be trained by Peter Hayes, who also handled the Sheikh's 1994 Melbourne Cup hero **Jeune** (GB) (Kalaglow {Ire}). Angus Gold, racing manager to Sheikh Hamdan, said, "They have been there only about three weeks, so there are still obviously no exact plans for them. But I should think they will be racing in Australia this season."

ALLIED FORCES TO U.S. **Allied Forces** (Miswaki), successful at the listed-race level while in training with Newmarket-based Henry Cecil last year, will continue his racing career in America. The colt, considered by Cecil to be a possible Classic candidate for 1996, is currently in Dubai; he has been purchased by businessman Ahmed Altayer and will ship to Belmont Park in April, where he will be trained by Kieran McLaughlin. The three-year-old, winner of last year's Superlative S. at Newmarket, finished a length the runner-up to Europe's top-rated juvenile **Alhaarth** in Goodwood's Lanson Champagne Vintage S. in his '95 finale.

Oaklawn Park, which kicked off its 1996 season Friday, Jan. 12, got off to a spectacular start in terms of mutuel handle, thanks primarily to simulcast support from around the country. Through the first three days of the meet, a total of \$12,981,313 was wagered on Oaklawn races, with records set for opening day, \$4,133,931, and opening Saturday, \$5,646,345. On the other hand, on-track attendance and handle dropped for the third straight year. On the opening two days of this year's meet, on-track attendance reached 32,541, compared to 37,381 in 1995 and 42,641 in 1994. Fans on-track wagered \$3,891,782, compared to 1995's \$4,643,929 and 1994's \$4,958,952.
