DEA INDICTS ALEX HARTHILL According to a report in Saturday's *Lexington Herald-Leader*, Louisville-based veterinarian Dr. Alex Harthill, under investigation by the Drug Enforcement Agency, has been named in a 102-count civil suit which has been filed by the U.S. attorney's office. The suit claims that Harthill falsified reports to the DEA, and that there were drugs missing from his office. As a doctor licensed to dispense controlled medications, the 70-year-old veterinarian was required by law to keep an inventory off his drug supplies and submit them to the DEA twice annually. Harthill has been involved in controversy in the past; Dancer's Image was under his care when the colt came up positive for Bute after the 1968 Kentucky Derby and became the only winner to be disqualified.

UNBRIDLED'S SONG TOPS GULFSTREAM TAB With jockey Mike Smith in the saddle again for the first time since the two teamed up to take the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled) worked six furlongs in a bullet 1:13 1/5 at Gulfstream yesterday morning. "We felt it was time to get a good work into him and to reacquaint him with Mr. Smith," said trainer Jim Ryerson. "We were real happy with his work. He finished good and he came back good." The colt, runner-up in the voting for last year's champion two-year-old colt, will make his seasonal debut in the GI Hutcheson S. February 4. "We're on schedule," said Ryerson. "It's mostly maintenance from here."

GONCALINO ALMEIDA OUT THREE MONTHS Jockey Goncalino Almeida, who was thrown from **Rue Du Fraise** (Strawberry Road {Aust}) when the horse broke down during Saturday's second race at Santa Anita, suffered two broken legs in the spill and will be out of action for a minimum of two-and-a-half to three months. Almeida, 39, fractured the tibia and fibula of his right leg, and the fibula of his left leg; his left leg was put in a cast and his right leg was placed in an "external fixator," which attending physician Dr. Jean Ding said is used in severe breaks to "maintain the fracture alignment." Almeida was off to the best start of his career at Santa Anita and stood tied for fifth in the jockey standings; he was scheduled to ride Saturday's GI El Encino S. winner **Jewel Princess** (Key to the Mint). Almeida was listed in stable condition at Arcadia Methodist Hospital; he is expected to be released today. **News cont. p2**

Urgent Request, who hadn't hit the board in four tries since taking last year's GI Santa Anita H. over a track labelled wet-fast, returned to the site of his greatest triumph and found Mother Nature on his side once again. Rains turned the track into a sea of slop and the San Marcos was moved from the grass to the main oval; sent off the crowd's second choice under new jockey Chris Antley, the grey sprinted to a clear lead right out of the gate and was never headed, cruising away from the field down the lane to win in hand. It was his first start since finishing unplaced in three stakes this summer. "My own belief is that he needed a rest; he runs well fresh," said trainer Rodney Rash. "I'd like to turn him out right now and not run him again until another big race, but I'll have to talk that over with Mr. Aitken." Rash did not rule out the possibility of another try at the Big Cap March 2. Winning jockey Chris Antley said, "He relished the off-track and so did I. This horse got some time off, put on a lot of weight, and he was just full of run." The bettors' choice **EL FLORISTA (ARG)** (El Basco), sent off at 7-5, was in contention early but had nothing left for the drive and finished sixth. "It just wasn't his day," said his rider, Kent Desormeaux. "He's much better than that."

FLORIDA THREE-YEAR-OLDS HIT TRIPLE

CROWN TRAIL Cobra King (Farma Way), who proved he could handle a distance with his victory in Saturday's mile-and-a-sixteenth Holy Bull S., came out of the race in good order and will now head for the Florida Derby March 16. "He is a little tired," said trainer Mike Puype. "I think the humidity was a bigger factor than the race. We're going to take it one day at a time until we choose his next spot. It all depends on how he is doing and how strong he is. He is the type of horse who leaves a lot of himself behind when he runs--he tries so hard. I want to be patient. We came here to run in the Florida Derby and we don't want to miss it. If we have to skip the Fountain of Youth, we will." **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner), runner-up in the Holy Bull, will be back for the Fountain of Youth February 24. "Racing should help him," said Dallas Stewart, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He is a high-strung horse. There is room for improvement." Another highly regarded three-year-old who made his '96 bow yesterday, **Diligence** (Miswaki) came back from his Gulfstream allowance victory in fine fettle. "If I have ever had a sweet horse to train, it is this one," said Nick Zito. "He is very professional. As far as what is next, I have to wait and see. Maybe the Fountain of Youth, but I doubt it. Maybe the Swale (March 16); maybe the Florida Derby. I have to handle him with care. He is not a rugged horse."

LONESOME GLORY FOURTH AT HAYDOCK

Three-time Eclipse Award winner **Lonesome Glory** (Transworld) finished fourth as the favorite in Saturday's Peter Marsh Chase at Haydock Park and is unlikely to remain in England to contest the Cheltenham Gold Cup, according to today's *Daily Racing Form*. Beaten some 14 lengths by winner **Scotton Banks (Ire)** (Le Moss {Ire}), the eight-year-old never threatened while carrying 164 pounds over the rain-softened ground.

TRAINER RAY BELL SR. DEAD AT 96

Veteran horseman Ray Bell Sr. died at his home in Arcadia, California Saturday as a result of complications from a broken hip suffered in November. He was 96. Born in Iowa, Bell broke horses for the British and French armies on his father's ranch, and served in World War I. He went on to become a world champion rodeo cowboy and roper, and was inducted into the Cowboy Hall of Fame in 1985. He began training race horses in the 1930s, working for owners like Bing Crosby and Louis B. Mayer. He raced three champions: Windy City II, The Pie King and Getaway II, as well as stakes horses like Rumbo, Barberstown, and Silver Eagle. Funeral services will be held in Sierra Madre Wednesday, January 24.

My Flag (Easy Goer) breezed a half-mile in an easy :50 3/5 at Gulfstream Saturday. She will return to action in either the GIII Davona Dale S. Feb. 11 or an allowance race before pointing to the GII Bonnie Miss March 13.

Champion **Heavenly Prize** (Seeking the Gold), getting ready to take on Cigar in the GI Donn H. February 10, breezed five furlongs in 1:01 Saturday.

Jockey Pat Valenzuela has been suspended after the results of a drug test taken Friday proved inconclusive, the *Daily Racing Form* reported in today's edition. Valenzuela, who called in sick last Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, has not ridden since last Sunday; he will not be allowed to return until the stewards are satisfied with a negative drug test. Steward Walter Blum told the *DRF* that, even if he does test negative, the troubled rider will be required to take part in the backstretch rehabilitation program, and he will be tested regularly.

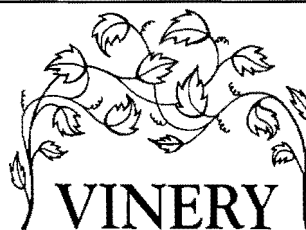
