COREY NAKATANI SUSPENDED Jockey Corey Nakatani, who has been the subject of a California Horse Racing Board hearing since last Friday, was fined \$500 and suspended five days for violation of CHRB rule #1688 (b) (4) (Use of Whips) following the running of the sixth race December 29, 1995 at Santa Anita. In that race, Nakatani was aboard the 9-5 favorite **Tillie's Joy** (Native Prospector), who finished sixth and broke down while galloping back to be unsaddled. The two-year-old suffered a fractured cannon bone and was subsequently put down; testimony during the hearing indicated that Nakatani struck the horse several times as he returned to the unsaddling area. According to the CHRB ruling, "The evidence presented...showed that jockey Corey Nakatani used his whip on the horse Tillie's Joy after the horse had achieved its maximum placing in the race, in violation of Rule 1688." The Board of Stewards did add, however, that "the weight of evidence does not establish that Mr. Nakatani's use of the whip was the cause of the catastrophic injury to the horse." The CHRB has also recently published a Policy Statement which orders stewards to "increase their vigilance" in matters involving use of the whip. Nakatani's suspension runs from February 1-7.

CELTIC SWING OUT OF DUBAI CUP Celtic Swing (GB) (Damister), winner of last season's Prix du Jockey Club but off the course since his disappointing eighth in the Irish Derby last July, is ready to resume a full training schedule but will not be ready in time for the Dubai World Cup March 27. Said Nick Babington, racing manager for the colt's owner, Peter Savill, "It would have been a rush to get him ready and we want to give him plenty of time." Europe's 1994 champion juvenile is not expected to be seen in action until fall, and connections still stress the need for close monitoring by vets. "His latest veterinary reports are excellent and we are all hopeful of an autumn campaign. But no targets are to be set until we see how he progresses," said Babington.

Serena's Song (Rahy) (four-for-four) and undefeated **Exotic Wood** (Rahy) (three-for-three) are both perfect at Santa Anita; the other Rahy, **Morepheme**, is three-for-six at the track. The lightly raced five-year-old drops back a furlong after taking a mile allowance race December 28; she makes her stakes debut in her 13th career start. **Top Rung** (Seattle Slew) makes her first start since a seventh-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Distaff October 28. The winner of the GII La Brea S. at this track and distance just over a year ago, the five-year-old looks for her first victory since Santa Anita's Santa Lucia H. last March.

The Vid (World Appeal), a perfect three-for-three over this course, won the race last year by an impressive six lengths. He comes into the race looking for his third graded stakes win in a row with jockey Herb McCauley in the irons. **Gone For Real** (Gone West) came back from nearly 10 months on the sidelines to take a Gulfstream allowance race; the late-running five-year-old has won five-of-nine on the grass, including a dead-heat for the win in the GIII Royal Palm H. at Hialeah last March. **Wekiva Springs** (Runaway Groom), seven-for-14 on the dirt, makes his turf debut. The grey, who won the GII San Fernando at a mile and an eighth a year ago, drops five pounds off his second-place finish in the GIII Broward H. last time out.

MONMOUTH ANNOUNCES 1996 STAKES

SCHEDULE "Change is the name of the game this summer," said Michael P. Dempsey as Monmouth Park's director of racing and racing secretary unveiled the track's 1996 stakes schedule. "The biggest change is the higher purse for the Haskell Invitational, up to \$750,000 from \$500,000, making it the highest purse of any of the country's seven invitationals." Scheduled for Sunday, August 4, the Haskell was won by Eclipse Award-winner **Serena's Song** (Rahy) in 1995 and Horse of the Year **Holy Bull** (Great Above) in 1994. Monmouth has also raised the purses of six of its seven Grade III events to \$100,000. "In order to maintain the high quality of our stakes program and to make weekend racing more exciting, we have added \$25,000 to each one," said Dempsey. "The only exception is the \$75,000 GIII Eatontown H. (June 15) for fillies and mares on the turf." The Monmouth Park Budweiser Breeders' Cup, contested on the dirt and won by champion **Inside Information** (Private Account) last year, has been renamed the Eatontown and moved to the grass as part of a plan to expand the distaff turf stakes program. The GII \$100,000 Reeve Schley Jr., set for July 20, has also been moved from dirt to turf for '96. Breeders' Cup money has been added to the GII Monmouth Oaks, July 6, and GII Molly Pitcher H., July 4, and both will now be worth \$200,000. Another significant change has the GI \$300,000 Philip H. Iselin H., August 25, shortened from nine furlongs to a mile and a sixteenth. "Our thoughts were that the Iselin has become a first step in a late summer/fall campaign for fresh horses that are heading for the Breeders' Cup in early November," said Dempsey. "The shorter distance will better suit this scenario." Monmouth's meet begins Saturday, May 25 and runs through Labor Day, September 2.

VIRGINIA LEGISLATURE MODIFIES OTB BILL

According to a report in today's *Daily Racing Form*, the Virginia General Assembly is working on a bill which would allow Colonial Downs to open its off-track betting sites as scheduled, providing the racetrack is built and ready to open for racing by March 1, 1997. If the facility is not operational by that date, Colonial Downs would have to shut its off-track betting parlors. The legislature comes in response to an earlier bill, which would have kept the Virginia off-track betting sites closed until the track was open. The *Daily Racing Form* reported that Colonial Downs would also have to come to an agreement with the Virginia Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association by July 1, 1996 to retain its off-track licenses.

CHRB COOPERATES WITH BREEDERS' CUP

LIMITED The California Horse Racing Board agreed Friday that, regardless of which racetrack in California is selected to host the 1997 Breeders' Cup, that facility will be awarded the racing dates required for the championship event. In a letter to the CHRB, Breeders' Cup President James E. Bassett III wrote, "The November 8, 1997, date is contractually scheduled by NBC and is not subject to change, therefore it would be most helpful if the (CHRB) would officially advise the Breeders' Cup Limited which racetrack, Hollywood Park or Oak Tree Racing Association, would be assigned the November 8 racing date." After hearing from representatives of both tracks, the Board decided to leave Breeders' Cup officials free to award the 1997 event to the track of their choice.

CHRB ADOPTS NEW LICENSING PROGRAM

FOR OWNERS The California Horse Racing Board yesterday announced that, beginning February 1, racehorse owners in any of 11 other states that have the same fingerprinting requirements will now find it much easier to race their horses in California. "Whereas previously the owner had to submit two fingerprint cards and go through the entire licensing process, the new procedures allow owners to simply fill out a few short statements and forms," said CHRB Executive Director Roy Wood. "We are considering going even further with this program and possibly expanding it into even more racing jurisdictions, but that will require us to change our rules." The reciprocity program is currently limited to owners licensed in New York, Illinois, Connecticut, New Jersey, Kansas, Nebraska, Texas, Virginia, Wisconsin, Pennsylvania and Oklahoma. The normal fee for a California owner's license still applies.
