BEST PAL RETIRED California-bred **Best Pal** (*Habitony), the third leading money-winning Thoroughbred of all time in North America, has been retired by John and Betty Mabee, the owners and breeders for whom the popular bay gelding had raced since the spring of 1990. Best Pal will make a farewell public appearance at Santa Anita Park March 2, Santa Anita Handicap day. He won the \$1,000,000 race in 1992 and finished a close second last year. Foaled February 12, 1988, Best Pal made his first start May 18, 1990, winning a five-furlong maiden special weight at Hollywood Park, and his final start January 15, 1996 in the GII San Pasqual H. at Santa Anita, in which he finished eighth. Following that race, the Mabees decided the time had come to retire the eight-year-old, even though he is sound and in good health. After making his farewell appearance at Santa Anita he will be sent to Golden Eagle Farm in Ramona, California, where he was foaled and raised. A trust fund for his lifetime care and maintenance will be set up by the Mabees to ensure he lives out his life well cared for. Best Pal won 18 of 47 career starts, including six Grade I events. He earned \$5,668,245, behind only Alysheba (\$6,679,242) and John Henry (\$6,597,947). As a two-year-old in 1990, Best Pal became only the second horse to sweep the Del Mar Futurity, Norfolk S. and Hollywood Futurity. During his three-year-old campaign, he finished second in the Santa Anita Derby and then second to Strike the Gold in the 117th Kentucky Derby. Later he won the Swaps S. at Hollywood Park and defeated such older rivals as Farma Way, Unbridled, Festin and Twilight Agenda in the inaugural running of the \$1,000,000 Pacific Classic at Del Mar. As an older competitor, Best Pal's most important victories came in the '92 Santa Anita H., '93 Hollywood Gold Cup, '92 Strub S. and '92 Oaklawn H. Over the course of his six-year career, Best Pal was trained by Richard Mandella, Ian Jory and Gary Jones. He was named California Horse of the Year in 1990, 1991, 1992 and 1994. He will receive a special honor at the California Thoroughbred Breeders' Association annual awards luncheon February 4, in Arcadia, California.

Lindsay Frolic won three straight stakes at Calder this summer and fall and won her last start, a Jan. 14 Gulfstream allowance, by 1 1/2 lengths, despite a troubled trip. The filly was up close early here, made a six wide move leaving the backstretch and dueled with favored Investalot to just edge that rival at the wire. Pat Day, winning his second stakes at the Gulfstream meet, said, "I broke from post eight and the way the race was run it just didn't make any sense to tuck her in back of horses and to try and make a quick run for the lead, so we were parked outside the whole trip. She is a small thing and I wanted to wait as long as possible before making my move." Winning trainer Marty Wolfson was appreciative of Day's patented patient ride, saying, "Pat knows what he is doing. He timed it perfectly. Those kind of races get your adrenalin going." Wolfson added, "We'll run her back at the end of the month here (in the Feb. 28 Heather H. at six furlongs).

TIME FOR A CHANGE DEAD Time for a Change (Damascus), winner of both the GI Flamingo S. and GIII Everglades S. at Hialeah in 1984, was found dead in his stall at Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky yesterday morning. The cause of death has not yet been determined. The 15-year-old stallion, who earned \$313,896 on the racetrack, sired 24 stakes winners and the earners of \$12,243,155 from his first seven crops to race. Among his progeny are two champions--Fly So Free, the Champion Two-Year-Old Colt of 1990; and Term Limits, the Champion Two-Year-Old Filly in Canada in 1993. Time for a Change also sired graded stakes-winners Technology, Iron Gavel, Living Vicariously, Jodi's Sweetie, Thirst For Peace, Transient Trend, New Deal, Tamise, Changing Ways, Arrival Time and Roi De Rome.

MOTT PAIR WORKS FOR DONN Trainer Bill Mott watched his charges **Cigar** (Palace Music) and **Wekiva Springs** (Runaway Groom) work at Gulfstream Park Wednesday morning before dashing off to Arkansas to accept his Trainer of the Year Award from the United Thoroughbred Trainers of America. Both horses are preparing for the February 10 GI Donn H. Cigar breezed seven furlongs in 1:29 under jockey Jerry Bailey. Assistant trainer Ralph Nicks commented, "He is not the fastest work horse in the morning. I wouldn't say he is lazy, just on the conservative side -- unless you put a horse out there with him. Jerry had a smile on his face, so he must have been pleased, too." Wekiva Springs, a close second in the GIII Broward H. in his last start, also worked seven furlongs. The 1995 GII San Fernando winner was clocked in 1:27 3/5 with Judy Nicks aboard. "He started off good and picked it up through the stretch," Nicks said. "Wekiva obviously hasn't proven himself to the extent that Cigar has, but hopefully he will get a big piece of it." Mike Smith is scheduled to ride the five-year-old in the Donn.

WILD GALE TO GLENCREST FARM Wild Gale (Wild Again) has been retired and will stand the 1996 season at stud at Glencrest Farm in Midway, Kentucky. On the board in 11 of 22 career starts, Wild Gale won the \$150,000 Kentucky Jockey Club S. (GIII) at two, and placed in the GI Kentucky Derby, GI Belmont S., GII Remsen S. and GIII Grey S. His earnings total \$404,214. The six-year-old stallion is from a strong blacktype family with over 30 stakes horses under his first three dams. Wild Gale stands as the property of Little Fish Stable for a fee of \$1,500 live foal.

DE MOUSSAC TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF FRENCH THOROUGHBRED BREEDERS Charles Henri de Moussac has been elected temporary president of the French Thoroughbred Breeders' Association, replacing Michel Henochsberg, who resigned last week. According to a story in yesterday's *The Sporting Life*, Alec Head declined a unanimous invitation to take the post and de Moussac, whose late father Paul bred Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winners Trempolino and Subotica, was elected instead. He received 26 of the 31 votes.

STRUB S.-GI, \$500,000, 4yo, 1 1/4m

Score Quick (Northern Score) is still without a rider for Sunday's nationally televised Strub S. Trainer Mel Stute said he has mulled over several potential riders for the winner of last year's GIII Lazaro S. Barrera H., but is going to wait to make a decision. "I'm just going to wait it out and keep my options open," Stute said. "If someone doesn't enter because of the rain, maybe we can get a rider that way." Score Quick's regular rider Goncalino Almeida suffered two broken legs in a Jan. 20 spill at Santa Anita and is expected to be sidelined at least 10 more weeks. Score Quick will be the only horse to run in all three legs of the Strub Series. He finished second in the Dec. 26 Malibu S. and seventh in the Jan. 13 San Fernando S. Strub probable **Mighty Magee** (Cormorant) arrived at Santa Anita from New York at 5 p.m. Tuesday. Eddie Delahoussaye will ride the GIII Aqueduct H. winner. Chris Antley, who has won three of the last four stakes run at Santa Anita, has the mount on longshot **Oncefortheroad** (Falstaff). Also pointing to the GI event are **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms), Desormeaux; **Flying Chevron** (Carson City), Davis; **Helmsman** (El Gran Senor), McCarron; **Gold And Steel (Fr)** (Shining Steel {GB}), Nakatani; **The Key Rainbow (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest), Stevens; **Pinfloron (Fr)** (Caerleon), Baze; **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister), Solis; and **Big Sky Jim** (Private Terms), Blanc.

The chestnut filly, benefiting from the added distance here, was in contention from the onset, took the lead on the final turn and drew off under a hand ride. Local News, Gulfstream:

Trainer Frank Passero Jr. sent out **Night Moves** (Nasty and Bold) to win the second race at Gulfstream Wednesday. It had been announced that with **Night Moves'** victory, Passero would equal the national record of saddling nine consecutive winners. However, due to a statistical error, the victory was actually Passero's eighth in a row. The trainer will saddle two horses today at Gulfstream--**Apple Of My Eye** (State Dinner) in the fifth race and **Satin Sunrise** (Mr. Leader) in the sixth race--and both are the morning line favorites. "I think my chances (of winning both races) are excellent," Passero said. If only **Apple Of My Eye** should win today, Passero would tie three other trainers for the record of nine consecutive wins. If both horses win, he alone will hold the new record of 10 straight victories.

Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies champion **My Flag** (Easy Goer) worked five furlongs Wednesday morning in 1:02 3/5. The filly is preparing for the \$100,000 GIII Davona Dale, to be run at a mile and 70 yards Feb. 11.

Skip Away (Skip Trial), second in both the GII Remsen and GII Cowdin S. last year, breezed six furlongs Wed. in 1:14 1/5. The colt bled in his three-year-old debut at Gulfstream Jan. 10 when he finished last as the even money choice. "This morning was the second time we worked him on Lasix and we scoped him both times," reported trainer Sonny Hine. "Fortunately, he has been absolutely clean." Hine worked **Skip Away** in blinkers for the first time yesterday at the suggestion of Jerry Bailey, "Jerry recommended putting them on. He is shy of horses out there. Even in the morning, it seems to take his attention away from his business." Hine is pointing **Skip Away** for the Mar. 16 Florida Derby.
