**DONN WEIGHTS ANNOUNCED** Cigar (Palace Music) has been assigned highweight of 128 pounds for his eagerly awaited 1996 debut in next Saturday's GI Donn H. at Gulfstream. The six-year-old is weighted from eight to 22 pounds higher than the 19 others nominated to the nine-furlong event. "I think everybody is getting a big break in the weights," said trainer Bill Mott. "But I don't want to give back any of the money that Cigar won last year. Less is better, but we'll take what they give us." **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms), who will skip the race in favor of today's GI Strub S., was rated second at 120, followed by **Halo's Image** (Halo), **L'Carriere** (Carr de Naskra) and **Wekiva Springs** (Runaway Groom) at 117; the filly **Heavenly Prize** (Seeking the Gold), 115; **Flying Chevron** (Carson City), 114; and **Star Standard** (Risen Star), 114.

**WINTER CANCELLATIONS** Racing was called off at Aqueduct, Beulah, Blue Ribbon Downs, Charles Town, Garden State, Laurel, Oaklawn, Penn National, Philadelphia Park, Remington, Suffolk Downs, Trinity Meadows and Turfway yesterday after yet another winter storm brought snow and arctic temperatures to states from Texas across the Midwest and up to Massachusetts Friday and Saturday. Blue Ribbon, Oaklawn, Remington, Trinity Meadows and Turfway have also canceled their cards for Sunday.

**SHIRLEY HEIGHTS BACK AT HOME** Shirley Heights (GB) (Mill Reef), winner of the 1978 Epsom Derby, is on the mend after suffering two serious bouts of colic last month and has returned to the Royal Studs in Norfolk, England. The 21-year-old stallion, who survived two emergency surgeries, was greeted by Queen Elizabeth II herself when he arrived back at the Royal Studs. It is hoped he will be fit enough to return to stud duty by April. Stud Manager Michael Oswald said, "He looks a different horse now from last week. He seems bright and well and has eaten up since his return." **News cont. p2**

Bidding for his third consecutive graded stakes victory after teaming up with jockey Chris Antley two starts back, Alphabet Soup came into this race with a perfect one-for-one record over wet tracks. Handling the muddy going here, the roan sat off the leaders to the far turn, then made his move from the far outside to grab the lead near the eighth pole and outduel favored Soul Of The Matter in the drive to the wire to take the photo in a head-bobbing finish. "Boy, this colt is game," said Antley. "The last 70 yards, he pinned his ears and dug back in the very last three strides. He's got me excited." Trainer David Hofmans said, "Believe it or not, I don't think he really cared for the mud. He likes a faster, wetter surface. Today, it was sticky and heavy. He only won because he's a pure racehorse." Soul Of The Matter was making his first start since running fourth in the Breeders' Cup Classic. "My horse hung a little the last 50 yards," said his rider, Gary Stevens. "But he had every right to get tired...he should benefit from the race." The winner and the third-place finisher, Dare and Go, will be back for the Santa Anita H. March 2; runner-up Soul Of The Matter heads to Dubai for the Dubai World Cup March 27.

Trainer Billy Turner wasn't surprised by his filly's winning effort. "Her record showed that she had run very well against these fillies. I figured she would run better at seven furlongs and she really didn't have to improve that much," Turner said. "We'll wait a little while, then run back here in the next stakes for fillies sprinting." Even-money favorite CAT APPEAL (Storm Cat) was fractious in the gate, up close early, but tired to finish fourth.
