HEAVENLY PRIZE SHARP AT GULFSTREAM

Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold) breezed six furlongs in 1:14 1/5 at Gulfstream yesterday morning and is on schedule to make her first start of the New Year in Saturday's GI Donn H. "I thought she worked excellent," said her trainer, Shug McGaughey. "She actually worked five-eighths in 1:01 and galloped out in 1:14 1/5. She finished up real well." As for her chances in the Donn, McGaughey said, "I'm not in there to run second. I know it is a tough, tough assignment. It looks like there could be plenty of speed in there. Hopefully...we'll get a fast pace. She'll be finishing up and maybe **Cigar** (Palace Music) will be slowing down."

ALICE SPRINGS RETIRED Trainer Jonathan Sheppard said yesterday that **Alice Springs** (Val de l'Orne {Fr}) has been retired from racing and will be bred to Seeking the Gold this season. The six-year-old goes to the breeding shed with nine wins, including three GI victories, and earnings of \$767,441. She finished third in the GIII Joe Namath H. at Gulfstream January 17 in her final start, and had been nominated to Wednesday's Suwanee River H. "Her owner told me that if she got in with more than 118 in this next handicap, that she didn't want to run her again," said Sheppard. "She got in at 119--so finito. I think we're doing the right thing."

FRANK PASSERO'S STREAK ENDS Trainer Frank Passero Jr.'s record-winning streak is over. Currently based at Gulfstream Park, Passero won 14 consecutive races during a two-week period before falling three-quarters of a length short with 3-5 **Looksgreat Incourt** (Court Trial) in yesterday's fifth race. The Gulfstream mutuel department calculated that if a bettor had made a 14-horse parlay during the streak, a \$2 investment would have netted \$7,088,342. **Northern Claim** (Secret Claim), who won the second race January 29, paid the highest price during the streak at \$25; **Apple of My Eye** (State Dinner) and **Satin Sunrise** (Mr. Leader), who took the fifth and sixth races Feb. 1, paid the lowest at \$3.

Winning trainer Wally Dollase remarked, "I'm surprised he pulled away from that group of horses. I expected it to be nip and tuck right down to the line. It was an incredible win." Trainer Richard Mandella said of Afternoon Deelites' finish, "It was a tough situation, buried down on the rail with no way to get out or go on with it. He was in quite a tangle all the way. But he finished strong, and so that sets him up for the (Santa Anita) Handicap." He will face Helmsman again in that March 2 race.

Appealing Skier, a speedster who suffered the first defeat of his career when trying a distance beyond seven-and-a-half furlongs and a muddy track for the first time in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, was making his first start since that 12th-place finish. The second choice of the crowd, the Florida-bred bay once again jumped out of the gate on top, set moderate fractions of :23.48 and :47.26 with 1-2 Unbridled's Song rating comfortably in second, then had enough left in the tank to turn back the challenge of the Breeders' Cup champ in the stretch drive. "I knew the grey horse (Unbridled's Song) would come running. I also knew that our horse trained beautifully up to this race," said winning trainer Ben Perkins Jr. "He is a big strong horse, and I knew he would fight back when they came to him." The runner-up, also making his first start since his Breeders' Cup victory, finished well but could not get past the top one. "Nobody likes to get beat, especially with a horse of this ability," said his trainer, Jim Ryerson. "You always are concerned their first time out. I wanted him to take back today--if they go chasing down the backstretch so that they labor too much at the finish, that's when injuries occur. Our horse ran a good race. He relaxed and he finished strong. There are things that he came away with today." The Fountain of Youth February 24 is next for the top two.

HOPE FOR AKSARBEN'S '96 MEET According to a report in Sunday's *Daily Racing Form*, Alan and Ted Baer, owners of Brandeis Food Management, the AKSarben concessionaire, and the Omaha Lancers, a Nebraska hockey team, have offered to loan AKSarben \$1.5 million, which would enable the financially troubled track to hold its 1996 meet. The loan would have to be accepted by the Douglas County Board of Commissioners, who defeated a resolution January 16 which would have prevented the track from holding a live race meeting this year. Another vote is set for tomorrow; it is expected to be delayed for an additional two weeks. Clare Duda, Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, said that, while he will vote against the offer, he believes that the majority of the Board will vote to accept it. Explaining his opposition, he told the *Form*, "We're projecting losses to the tune of \$2 million, with a 20 percent drop in attendance and handle this year. Traditionally, the racetrack contributed a lot in taxes and charitable giving. Now, it can't pay its own operating expenses." AKSarben is run by Douglas County's Douglas Racing Corporation.

MIDLANTIC WINTER MIXED SALE RESULTS

Heartful Star (Star de Naskra), the dam of graded-stakes winner and GI Preakness runner-up **Oliver's Twist** (Horatius), brought a bid of \$40,000 to top yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Winter Mixed Sale in Timonium, Maryland. The 14-year-old mare, who is believed in foal to Private Terms, was consigned by Becky Davis, agent; she was purchased by Tyson Gilpin, agent. A total of 135 horses sold Sunday for \$646,700; the average of \$4,790 was down 18.8 percent from 1995's sale. Last year, 111 hips brought \$655,400, averaging \$5,905.

ARCTIC BLAST CANCELS SUFFOLK, PHILLY

PARK With temperatures never getting higher than the teens and wind chill factors well below zero, live racing was called off at Philadelphia Park and Suffolk Downs Sunday. The entire Philadelphia card was scrapped, while Suffolk did run the first race before canceling. Both tracks are scheduled to resume action today.

Former jockey Don Meade Jr., who captured more than 1,000 races while one of the leading riders on the New England circuit, died Wednesday at Memorial Hospital in Hollywood, Florida from injuries suffered in an accident at his home two weeks earlier, it was reported in yesterday's *Daily Racing Form*. Meade, 45, was the son of Don Meade Sr., best known for his Kentucky Derby-winning ride aboard Broker's Tip in 1933, when he fought with jockey Herb Fisher, riding Head Play, down the stretch in a battle that was captured in one of racing's best-known photos.

Coming off a powerful record-setting performance in the El Conejo H. January 7, Lit De Justice ran his '96 record to two-for-two. Content to sit off the pace early, the grey moved up from the inside on the far turn, angled to the outside for the stretch drive and finished with authority to win going away under jockey Eddie Delahoussaye. "Boy, he's nice to ride--and what a turn of foot he has," said Delahoussaye. "He didn't have as dramatic a move as he's shown before, but he still ran pretty fast that last eighth. He's a remarkable little horse, running 1:08 and change on a track like this."
