TOYOTA TO SPONSOR BLUE GRASS

Officials from Toyota and Keeneland announced yesterday that the Japanese auto manufacturer, which operates a plant in Kentucky, will sponsor the 1996 GII Blue Grass S., and that the purse will be raised to \$700,000 for this year's 72nd running. The nine-furlong race, which will be run April 13, has been renamed the Toyota Blue Grass S., and the purse increase makes it the second richest race in Kentucky, behind only the Derby. Four of the last six Derby winners have used the Blue Grass as a stepping stone to the "Run for the Roses." "Even before the first car rolled off the assembly line in May, 1988 in Georgetown, Kentucky, Toyota has had a positive influence on the economy and quality of life throughout the region," said Keeneland spokesman Jim Williams. Williams added that the sponsorship is a four-way partnership between Keeneland, Toyota Motor Manufacturing of Georgetown, the Toyota Dealers Association of Lexington and Cincinnati, and Toyota Motor Sales, U.S.A. "Through the leadership of the local Toyota dealers, the three groups joined together to make this sponsorship a reality," he said. The Toyota Blue Grass will be televised live on ESPN from 4-5 p.m. (ET).

Fortunate Prospect has 12 two-year-olds scheduled to sell, more than any other sire. Also represented in the catalogue are leading sires Affirmed, Black Tie Affair (Ire), Broad Brush, Cozzene, Farma Way, Miswaki, Mt. Livermore, Phone Trick, Rahy, Relaunch, Storm Cat, Summer Squall and Valid Appeal. Scheduled to sell are half-siblings to graded stakes-winners Cut the Charm, Suave Prospect, Jackie Wackie, You and I and Chaposas Springs, Mountain Affair, Cat On Tour, Perfect Arc and Meritocrat, as well as full-siblings to last year's GIII California Juvenile S. winner Mountain Skier (Baldski), GSW Green Alligator (Gate Dancer) and GI Vosburgh S. winner Birdonthewire (Proud Birdie). All horses selling through this two-year-olds in training sale are eligible for, and will automatically be nominated to, the 1997 running of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Championship S.

DONN H.-GI, \$300,000, 3yo/up, 9f

Star Standard (Risen Star), who finished second to **Cigar** (Palace Music) in last year's GI Woodward, breezed five furlongs in 1:02 2/5 yesterday morning. The four-year-old makes his third start of the year in the Donn; he took a Gulfstream allowance in his latest start January 26. "It looks like everything is positive," said trainer Nick Zito. "The only negative is that we are running against Cigar." Zito's colt will get 15 pounds from the favorite Saturday; jockey Shane Sellers takes over for Pat Day, who will ride **Heavenly Prize** (Seeking the Gold).

SAN VICENTE S.-GIII, \$100,000a, 3yo, 7f

Honour and Glory (Relaunch) heads a probable field of five or six for Saturday's stake. Three-for-five lifetime and fourth in last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile, the bay came back after a three-month holiday to take the San Miguel S. January 18 in an eye-catching 1:08 4/5. Also expected for the San Vicente: San Miguel runner-up **Afleetaffair** (Afleet), who has never been worse than second in five starts; **King Of The Heap** (Allen's Prospect), a Santa Anita allowance winner in his '96 opener; **Odin's Primo** (Idabel); and **SW Ready To Order** (Order). **Slews Royal Son** (Slews Royalty) is possible for the race.

Sunday, Gulfstream Park

DAVONA DALE S.-GIII, \$100,000, 3yo, f, 1m 70yds

My Flag (Easy Goer), prepping for Sunday's feature, worked five-eighths in 1:01 at Gulfstream yesterday. The Shug McGaughey trainee makes her first start since winning last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Also pointing for the race, **La Rosa** (Wild Again) worked the same distance in 1:04. Fifth in the Breeders' Cup and second in her last start, a Gulfstream allowance January 25, the three-year-old ended her two-year-old campaign with an eight-length romp in the GII Demoiselle at Aqueduct.

NEW EVENT FOR DUBAI WORLD CUP CARD

The Dubai World Cup Committee has created a new race, the \$500,000 Emirates Airline Invitational, which will be run on the Dubai World Cup undercard March 27. Written at the same 10-furlong distance as the Dubai World Cup, the Emirates Airline Invitational is open to reserves for the World Cup and will precede that race on the program. It will not only give the reserves the opportunity to compete for a valuable purse in Dubai, but also ensure that there are reserves for the main event in the case of late scratches. The cost of shipping horses and their connections for the supporting feature will be funded by the Committee. Three horses have already accepted invitations: **March Hare (Aus)** (Marscay {Aus}) from Australia, **Dare and Go (Alydar)** from the U.S., and **Needle Gun (Ire)** (Sure Blade) from England. Clive Brittain, trainer of Needle Gun, said, "Our plan is to run. Needle Gun is very well, and it's a good prize to aim at. You always know you will be mixing with the best when there is that much on offer."

TRIPLE CROWN NOMINATIONS ON THE RISE

A total of 354 three-year-olds have been named to the early-nomination list for the 1996 \$5 million Visa Triple Crown Challenge. That represents an 11.5 percent increase over 1995. The early nominations, which closed January 20, are headed by last year's two-year-old champion **Maria's Mon** (Wavering Monarch), and Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled). **Maria's Mon**, on the shelf after undergoing ankle surgery last year, is expected to miss the series. The 354 nominees, which equals the number from 1994, is considered a dramatic upturn because of the continuing decrease in the foal crop and the downward trend that the nominations had shown in recent years. Included among the nominations are six from Europe and one from Japan. Nine American fillies are also nominated, including the 1-2 finishers from the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, **My Flag** (Easy Goer) and **Cara Rafaela** (Quiet American). D. Wayne Lukas leads the trainers with 17 nominations. **Forty Niner** and **Time for a Change**, who died just last week, top the sires with eight nominations each. "Our list of early nominees covers the major stakes winners of 1995 in the United States and offers fine competitive runners from overseas," said Edward P. Seigenfeld, executive vice president of Triple Crown Productions. "It's likely we'll have some late bloomers show up as the racing year progresses, and they will no doubt enter the fray during the late nomination period that closes March 30." This year's Kentucky Derby is scheduled for May 4, the Preakness is set for May 18, and the Belmont Stakes for June 8.

FIRST FOAL FOR NOVEMBER SNOW Multiple Grade I winner **November Snow** (Storm Cat), who was purchased by her owner, Fares Farm, for \$700,000 at the 1994 Keeneland November Sales, produced her first foal January 31. The foal, a bay filly, is by **Seattle Slew**. **November Snow**, who earned \$554,628 during her racing career, will be bred back to **Seattle Slew**.

LIGHT SCHEDULE FOR COBRA KING **Cobra King** (Farma Way), winner of the GIII Holy Bull S. in his last start Jan. 20, is unlikely to run in the Feb. 24 Fountain of Youth, trainer Mike Puype said yesterday. Puype is mulling what some would consider an unusual route to the Kentucky Derby, one that may include just two preps as a three-year-old. After a scheduled start in the March 16 Florida Derby, **Cobra King** may not run again until the May 4 Kentucky Derby. "This horse, when he runs, it takes a fair amount out of him," Puype said. "If we want to conserve him for the Kentucky Derby and the Triple Crown, I want to make sure there's enough gas in the tank when we get there. If he can win the Florida Derby at a mile and an eighth off an eight-week layoff, there's no reason to believe he couldn't come back in seven weeks and win at a mile and a quarter. Off the top of my head, I'd say that would be a great way of going." **Cobra King**, who has won five of seven starts to date, including four stakes, for earnings of \$256,825, breezed a half-mile at Gulfstream yesterday, going in :50 3/5.

FERRARA TO WALMAC Walmac International General Manager John T. L. Jones Jr. announced yesterday that multiple graded stakes-placed **Ferrara** (Capote) will enter stud this season at Walmac, where he will stand as property of a partnership for a fee of \$2,500, live foal. The five-year-old won or placed in 10 of 14 career starts, including six graded stakes, and earned \$237,400; at three, he equalled the track record at Hollywood for six-and-a-half furlongs, going the distance in 1:13 4/5. **Ferrara** finished second in the GII Mervyn Leroy H. in his final career start last May.

SO FACTUAL FOR AUSTRALIA Last year's impressive Group One Nunthorpe Stakes winner **So Factual (GB)** (Known Fact) is set to challenge for one of Australia's great races, the G1 A\$501,000 Newmarket Handicap over six furlongs at Flemington in Melbourne March 11. Owned and raced by the Maktoums' Godolphin racing operation and trained by Saeed Bin Suroor, **So Factual**, who has won half of his 16 career starts, is at present in quarantine in Dubai and is expected to arrive in Australia February 23.

FOAL REGISTRATION FEE INCREASED The Jockey Club yesterday announced an increase of \$15 in the basic fee for Thoroughbred foal registration, the first such increase since 1987. The new fee--\$175, including blood-test parentage verification--will come into effect for the foal crop of 1996. Fees for foals of 1995 and earlier remain unchanged. Said Jockey Club Executive Vice President and Executive Director Nick Nicholson. "For virtually a decade, we've been able to stabilize the basic fee by applying more and more advanced technology to our operations. During this period the cost of living index has gone up more than 30 percent and our registration revenues have declined as the size of the foal crop has declined, to the point that this decrease is now running at more than \$2.5 million each year." Only the basic registration fee is affected by the new charge.

INTERNATIONAL LIVESTOCK CONGRESS SET FOR FEBRUARY

The International Livestock Congress, which features several speakers from the Thoroughbred industry, will be held February 21-23 at the Sheraton Astrodome Hotel in Houston, Texas. The theme for the conference is "Looking Ahead to the 21st Century." The equine sessions begin Thursday, February 22 with seminars featuring Grayson Jockey Club and Research Foundation President Edwin L. Bowen, Kentucky Thoroughbred Association Executive Director David Switzer, and Dr. Terry D. Swanson, president-elect of the American Association of Equine Practitioners. Thomas Meeker, president and CEO of Churchill Downs, will speak on "Racing Into The Future" Friday, February 23; other speakers that day include Dennis Swanson, president of ABC Sports, on the topic "Horse Racing and Television," and Steven Crist, Director of Communications for the New York Racing Association. Thursday night's dinner party will showcase "An Evening with the Greats," with special guests Angel Cordero Jr., Cash Asmussen, Ron Turcotte and Johnny Longden.

Editor's Note (Forty Niner) worked a bullet six furlongs at Gulfstream yesterday, going the distance in 1:14 with jockey Donna Barton in the saddle. The Team Lukas colt, second to Cobra King in the Holy Bull S. in his most recent start, goes next in the Fountain of Youth February 24. He will be joined in the gate by stablemate **Victory Speech** (Deputy Minister), an 11 1/2-length allowance winner over the track Sunday.

Donna Barton returns to competition Wednesday; the jockey has been out since suffering a fractured collarbone during a morning workout December 15.

Jockey Pat Valenzuela, who has not ridden since January 14, passed his latest drug test and hopes to be back in the saddle as early as Thursday. "He'll be able to ride, but I don't think he has named an agent yet and I don't see him named on any horses," said Gulfstream steward Tommy Trotter. Valenzuela will be subject to random drug tests for the remainder of the meet, but will not be required to enter a drug treatment program.
