JACQUES WERTHEIMER DEAD AT 84 Jacques Wertheimer, one of France's most successful owner-breeders, has died at the age of 84, it was reported in yesterday's *Racing Post*. Wertheimer owned two Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winners, **Ivanjica** (Sir Ivor) (1976) and **Gold River (Fr)** (Riverman) (1981), both trained by Alec Head. He inherited his father Pierre's famous blue and white colors in 1965, and his horses, nearly all trained by the Head family, continued to win top prizes in France. Last year Wertheimer won 43 races and over \$1.8 million in prize money. He is survived by his sons Alain and Gerard, who will continue to run the family Chanel perfume business as well as the racing stable.

SEATTLE SONG EUTHANIZED *Seattle Song* (Seattle Slew), a Grade/Group 1 winner in both France and the U.S., was euthanized Saturday, Feb. 3, at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Kentucky. The 15-year-old stallion suffered a fractured pelvis and massive hemorrhaging in a paddock accident at Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Jones Jr.'s Domino Stud. *Seattle Song* sired the earners of over \$11 million, including European champions **Lucky Song** and **Dictator's Song**. His progeny also include graded stakes-winners **Irish Linnet** (\$1,220,179), **Cudas**, **Whadjathink**, **Amal Hayati**, **Hold Old Blue**, **Sahib's Light** and **Lioubovnik**.

SERENA'S SONG TO SANTA MARIA *Serena's Song* (Rahy), ½-length winner of the GI Santa Monica H. in her last start Jan. 27, will bypass Sunday's GII La Canada S. and instead run in the GI Santa Maria H. Monday, February 19. "We get an extra week, a Grade I and a mile and a sixteenth," explained trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "Considering how tough the La Canada has come up, it's in our best interest to go a sixteenth of a mile shorter following the seven-furlong Santa Monica." Also pointing to the Santa Maria are Grade I winners **Twice the Vice** (Vice Regent) and **Alpride (Ire)** (Alzao). **Twice the Vice** breezed a mile in 1:42 4/5 Tuesday at Santa Anita. **Alpride**, winner of the GI Yellow Ribbon Invitational over the Santa Anita turf last November, will be making her main track debut.

Cigar (Palace Music) breezed a half-mile in :48 2/5 Wednesday morning under regular exercise rider Judy Nicks in his final preparation for the Donn. Asked whether the six-year-old would be ready to run his best race Saturday, trainer Bill Mott responded, "I hope he wins and I hope it is not his best race. I can see that he is as good going into this race as he was going into part of his races last year. I think any one of them should be enough. When you look back at his last 12 races (all wins), if he runs back to any of them, he should be more than competitive." **Cigar**, who will be carrying his career heaviest impost Saturday, will be breaking from post position one. "He has won from there before," Mott said. **Cigar** won the Hollywood Gold Cup and the Pimlico Special from the one hole last year. Commenting on the prospect of another of his charges, **Wekiva Springs** (Runaway Groom), defeating **Cigar** in the Grade I event, Mott said, "I suppose it is possible with **Wekiva** getting enough of a weight concession and **Cigar** running in his first race in 3½-months. **Cigar** has run well fresh before, but by the same token, the other horse has had a race." **Wekiva Springs** was second by a nose in the GIII Broward H. at Gulfstream in his last start Jan. 13.

Sunday, Santa Anita:

LA CANADA S.-GII, \$200,000a, 4yo, f, 1 1/8m

Urbane (Citidancer) breezed five furlongs in 1:01 at Hollywood Park Tuesday. The winner of last year's GI Ashland S. at Keeneland finished third in the GII El Encino S. in her four-year-old debut Jan. 20. Trainer Bobby Frankel sent his pair of La Canada probables to the Hollywood Park track for six-furlong works Tuesday. **Privity** (Private Account), a G2 winner in France last year, worked in 1:14 4/5, while El Encino runner-up **Sleep Easy** (Seattle Slew) covered the same distance in 1:15 2/5. Also confirmed for the race are El Encino winner **Jewel Princess** (Key to the Mint) and D. Wayne Lukas-trainee **Sharp Point (Ire)** (Royal Academy).

FREEDOM CRY RETIRED Freedom Cry (GB) (Soviet Star), runner-up in last year's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and Breeders Cup Turf, has suffered a serious tendon injury and has been retired. His owner Daniel Wildenstein said in Paris yesterday, "The training tracks at Chantilly have been frozen and the horse knocked a tendon. It is an injury which would keep him off the racecourse for at least a year, so we have definitely retired him. No plans have yet been made about his stud career. I'm very sad. He is quite a loss. He has been a very brave horse and proved himself at the very top level. I hope we can find a good stud at which to stand him." The five-year-old, who had been an intended starter in the March 27 Dubai World Cup, won five of 12 career starts, with five second-place finishes, for earnings of \$1,084,411. He was a group stakes winner in both France and Germany.

L'CARRIERE TO SKIP DONN L'Carriere (Carr de Naskra), runner-up to Cigar in the Breeders' Cup Classic in his last start Oct. 28, was notably absent from yesterday's Donn H. draw, but fans will probably be able to see the five-year-old in action in the GI Gulfstream Park H. March 2, according to trainer James Bond. "I really didn't want to hook Cigar until Dubai," Bond said. "Hopefully someone else will soften him up first, if that is possible. The Gulfstream Park Handicap is most likely. If there is any change, it would be the Santa Anita Handicap or an allowance race. Our goal is to get one race into him before Dubai." Bond also commented on his GIII Tropical Park Derby winner **Ok by Me** (With Approval), saying "He may run in the Fountain of Youth S. (Feb. 24) or the Palm Beach S. (March 3)."

ROMAN DIPLOMAT DEAD Roman Diplomat (Roberto), who was scheduled to stand his first season at Doug Arnold's Buck Pond Farm in Versailles, Kentucky in 1996, was euthanized Jan. 22. The 15-year-old stallion had developed a tumorous growth in his small intestine, and was sent to Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, where he had the tumor removed in surgery performed Jan. 22. However, after the surgery, when Roman Diplomat tried to stand, he broke both of his front femur bones and had to be destroyed. Roman Diplomat's best runner is MGSW Roman Envoy, a winner of 14 of 49 starts to date for earnings of \$700,220. He is also the sire of MGSW Diplomatic Jet, stakes-winner Diploman and stakes-placed De Medici.

PURE GRAIN TO BE BRED IN 1996 Pure Grain (GB) (Polish Precedent), winner of last year's Irish and Yorkshire Oaks, will be fit to begin her career as a broodmare this spring. The filly fractured a leg while finishing tenth in last November's Japan Cup. After a lengthy stay in Tokyo to recover, Pure Grain was returned to Michael Stoute's Newmarket stables in early January and is now healthy enough for covering. Owner Robert Barnett explained, "Pure Grain is walking now and I am fairly sure she will be covered this year. We have not decided on a stallion as yet -- it is obviously short notice -- but we have a few ideas and will be inquiring about their availability very soon."

ECONOMIC IMPACT STUDY ENTERS NEXT PHASE An economic impact study being conducted on behalf of the American Horse Council "to promote the industry and educate people" will enter its next phase later this month when tens of thousands of individual questionnaires are mailed out to racetracks, owners, breeders, rodeos, show horse associations and a multitude of other "economic entities" in the horse world. The five organizations funding the study, entitled "The Economic Impact of the United States Horse Industry," are the American Quarter Horse Association, Breeders' Cup Ltd., The Jockey Club, Keeneland Association and the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association. The Washington D.C.-based Barents Group has been retained to conduct the study, while Racing Resource Group Inc. of Virginia will serve as a liaison between Barents Group and the horse industry. Tom Aronson, president of Racing Resource Group, believes the study will become "a very important tool" in dealing with Congress and state legislatures. But Aronson also believes it will serve important purposes beyond the legislative arena. "It will have some marketing applications as well," he said. "The industry can use it to educate people (about the sport), attract sponsorships and gauge markets for horse products."

Diffident (Fr) (Nureyev), winner of last year's G3 Prix de Ris-Orangis at Evry, heads a field of six set to contest Friday's running of the President Cup at Abu Dhabi Racetrack. The four-year-old colt, formerly trained by Andre Fabre, is now being handled by Saeed bin Suroor. Among Diffident's rivals in the seven-furlong race will be Irish G3 winner **Heart Lake (GB)** (Nureyev) and **Ihtiraz (GB)** (Soviet Star), who is stakes-placed in the United Arab Emirates.
