VISA SPONSORS RACING ACROSS AMERICA

VISA, U.S.A. will expand its participation in Thoroughbred racing by serving as presenting sponsor of ESPN's Racing Across America series. ESPN and Winner Communications last week announced that VISA has entered into a multi-year agreement to sponsor ESPN's award-winning series of live telecasts of many of the top stakes races in the country. VISA's Racing Across America presenting sponsorship complements its five-year agreement for sponsorship of the Triple Crown series. "We're delighted to be joining the list of prominent sponsors of Racing Across America on ESPN," said Jan Soderstrom, senior vice president of advertising and marketing for VISA, U.S.A. "VISA is committed to its partnership with Thoroughbred racing, and our presenting sponsorship of Racing Across America is a perfect vehicle for reinforcing our involvement with the three premier races that make up the Triple Crown." The first 1996 Racing Across America telecast to be sponsored by VISA was a Feb. 4 doubleheader featuring the Strub S. and the Hutcheson S. "It's great to see a prestigious company like VISA International come on board as presenting sponsor of our Racing Across America series," said John Wildhack, senior vice president of programming for ESPN. "Along with Thrifty Car Rental (title sponsor of the series) and Budweiser, VISA's sponsorship enables us to continue the presentation of the best in Thoroughbred racing on ESPN." Racing Across America has been a fixture on the ESPN schedule since 1985. This year, ESPN will present more than 40 top Thoroughbred races in the series as well as 15 hours of expanded coverage on both ESPN and ESPN2 of the events and activities surrounding the Kentucky Derby.

ROBERT J. QUIGLEY NAMED ITB PRESIDENT

International Thoroughbred Breeders Inc. announced this week that Robert J. Quigley has been named President of the Company effective February 12, 1996. Quigley has served in management positions at Atlantic City Race Course, Meadowlands Racetrack, Garden State Park, Philadelphia Park and Retama Park. He has been a director of ITB since its inception in 1980 and previously served as ITB President from March 1988 to June 1992. "I'm looking forward to rejoining ITB," Quigley said. "With its recent acquisition of a 21 acre site on the strip in Las Vegas, Nevada and the recent success of its racing operations, there is great opportunity for moving the company to greater heights."

RACING LEGISLATION INTRODUCED IN MARYLAND

After much debate, legislation has been introduced into the Maryland House of Delegates with the full support of the state's entire racing industry. The Racing Reform Act includes provisions which would offer the Maryland Jockey Club the option of closing Bowie Training Center, transfer \$1 million in drug-testing expenses from the tracks to the state, and shorten Pimlico's current 90-day live racing season. According to a report in Thursday's *Washington Post*, the Racing Reform Act gained the support of the state's Standardbred industry after Maryland Jockey Club Chief Executive Officer and President Joe De Francis agreed to eliminate a request to abolish the current 6:15 curfew on live racing at his tracks. Members of the Standardbred industry were concerned this would cause a decline in their own attendance. The racing industry dropped a request for \$35 million in annual state subsidies from the bill when it became obvious there was no chance of it being accepted. Also missing from the bill are any provisions for slot machines. De Francis has claimed that slot machines at nearby Delaware tracks threaten the solvency of Maryland tracks, but added that he would consider adding a provision on slot machines to the act by Feb. 23 if he thought it would be supported by legislators.

DRAMA SCHOOL HUMANELY DESTROYED

Windfields Farm's homebred Drama School (Northern Dancer) was humanely destroyed February 6 after suffering an apparent heart attack. The 30-year-old mare had been a pensioner at Windfields since producing her last foal in 1987, according to farm manager Bernard McCormack. One of 10 stakes winners from Northern Dancer's first crop, Drama School won five races at two and three, including the 1969 Star Shoot S. and Selene S. She produced seven winners from 10 named foals, including Canadian Horse of the Year Norcliffe. A 1973 foal by Buckpasser, Norcliffe won 14 races and \$433,978, including two legs of the Canadian Triple Crown. Norcliffe sired 33 stakes-winners including Eclipse Champion Sprinter Groovy and Grade I winner At the Threshold. Drama School's other winners include stakes-placed Stagetime and Vaguely Dramatic, the granddam of 1994 Argentine Champion Two-Year-Old Colt El Sultan (Arg).

Local News, Australia:

Two North American graded stakes-winners, **Johann Quatz (Fr)** (Sadler's Wells) and **Supremo** (Gone West) have joined the ranks of shuttle stallions. Seven-year-old Johann Quatz, winner of the G1 Prix Lupin in France in 1992 and second in the 1994 Breeders' Cup Mile, will stand the 1996 Southern Hemisphere breeding season at Widden Stud in Australia for a fee of \$7,538. Supremo, winner of the 1994 GII Norfolk S. at Santa Anita, will stand his first Northern Hemisphere season at stud in 1996 at Lane's End Farm in Kentucky. The four-year-old will then fly to Australia to stand the Southern Hemisphere breeding season at Wakefield Stud for a fee of \$5,654.

Byron Rogers has joined the team at Arrowfield Stud in Australia as Marketing and Promotions Manager. He succeeds James Bester, who is pursuing other bloodstock interests.

Arrowfield Stud in Australia announced yesterday that **Flying Spur (Aus)** (Danehill) will be retired after the end of the current Southern Hemisphere racing season. He will commence his stud duties at Chatswood Stud in Victoria after finishing his current campaign, which should include the G1 Australian Guineas over a mile. Flying Spur, a three-time graded stakes winner in Australia, won the richest two-year-old race in the world last season, the G1 Tooheys Golden Slipper S. over six furlongs.

Local News, Japan:

Tikkanen (Cozzene), winner of the 1994 GI Breeders' Cup Turf, has been sold to the JS Company for an undisclosed sum. Narvick International had previously arranged for the JS Company to lease the five-year-old stallion to stand the 1996 breeding season in Japan. Narvick International was also responsible for arranging Tikkanen's sale. Formerly owned by George Strawbridge, Pennsylvania-bred Tikkanen will stand the 1996 season at Arrow Stud in Shizunai, Hokkaido, Japan.

NEW STALLIONS FOR THORN HILL Thorn Hill Farm of Greenville, Georgia, has announced three new stallions for the 1996 breeding season. Purchased privately by Crown Stud Inc., the trio includes stakes-winner **Bypasser** (Buckpasser), **Jig Away** (Jig Time) and first-year stallion **Vote Me Out** (General Assembly), a half-brother to New York's top sire of 1995, Cure the Blues.
