HEAVENLY PRIZE RETIRED Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold), third to Cigar in Saturday's GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park, will not race again, trainer Shug McGaughey said yesterday. "Heavenly Prize bled through Lasix and after discussing it with (owner) Mr. (Ogden) Phipps, we have decided to retire her to breed her," McGaughey said. "She is in good health, but we are not going to take a chance. She came back okay and she was breathing okay, but (jockey) Pat (Day) told me after the race that she didn't fire and that made me decide to have her scoped." The five-year-old bay mare will be retired to Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky and will be bred to Storm Cat this spring. Named the Champion Three-Year-Old Filly of 1994, Heavenly Prize is the first foal out of the unraced mare Oh What a Dance (Nijinsky II). She never finished worse than third in 18 career starts, posting nine wins, six second-place finishes and three third-place efforts for earnings of \$1,825,820. Her triumphs included eight Grade I victories--the Frizette S. at two, the Beldame S., Alabama S. and Gazelle H. at three, and the Apple Blossom, John A. Morris H., Go For Wand S. and Hempstead H. at four. She raced in three Breeders' Cups, finishing third to Phone Chatter in the 1993 Juvenile Fillies, second by a neck to One Dreamer in the 1994 Distaff and second to stablemate Inside Information in the 1995 Distaff.

WALTER SWINBURN INJURED Top British rider Walter Swinburn is in intensive care at a Hong Kong hospital after taking a fall yesterday at Sha Tin Racecourse. Swinburn's mount **Liffey River** (Irish River {Fr}), drawn on the outside in a field of 14, became upset leaving the gate and collided with the railings. Fellow jockey Richard Quinn, also in action at the Sunday meet, said, "Liffey River swerved and hit the outside rails. Walter was unseated and was taken straight to the hospital. He's in intensive care and the reports I have heard suggest he has a swelling on his head and rib damage." Swinburn's father, former classic-winning jockey Walter, said of his son's injuries, "I understand he has broken ribs, a broken collar bone and a broken shoulder. But I am not sure about the full extent of the damage at this moment in time." Quinn added, "I understand he has been stabilized and they expect him to be out of intensive care within a day or two."

Jewel Princess, 2 1/2-length winner of the GI El Encino S. in her four-year-old debut Jan. 20, made it two in a row here, rallying from last to first under Alex Solis to win her fourth graded stakes as the 4-5 bettors' choice. "Coming into this race, she was training as good as she ever had," said trainer Wally Dollase. "She proved it today that she was a class filly because she had a rough trip. It was the best race she's ever run. When she got bumped at the start I said, 'Why do we have to give them that much of a head start?' On her pure ability, she gradually crept up. Then Alex moved her to the outside and she relaxed more. When you can get them to relax going 1 1/8-miles, they'll have something left at the end. We were fortunate." Dollase indicated that the \$300,000 Santa Margarita H. to be run at 1 1/8-miles March 10 may be next for Jewel Princess. **URBANE** (Citidancer), winner of last year's GI Ashland S. at Keeneland before becoming injured while finishing second in the GI Kentucky Oaks, pressed the pace early, dropped back to be sixth and last at the top of the stretch, then passed tiring rivals late to be fourth. "When she got hurt in Kentucky, it was in the middle of the turn," said Urbane's trainer Randy Bradshaw. "Every time I've watched her run lately and she gets in a crowd of horses, I think she gets a little tense--that's when she got bumped (in the Kentucky Oaks). She backed out of it, but at the end she came on running and finished very well."

FAIR GROUNDS ANNOUNCES MAJOR PURSE INCREASES

The New Orleans Fair Grounds has announced major purse increases for 17 stakes, including the track's four graded races, as well as all overnight races, according to Bryan G. Krantz, the track's president and general manager. The purse for the meet's premier attraction, the GIII Louisiana Derby, has been hiked from \$300,000 to \$350,000. The 1 1/16-mile event for three-year-olds is set for March 17. In addition, the purse for the March 10 GIII New Orleans H., for ages four and up at 1 1/8-miles, has been increased \$50,000 to \$250,000; the purse for the GIII Fair Grounds Oaks, a 1 1/16-mile event for three-year-old fillies March 16, has been increased \$25,000 to \$150,000; and the purse for the GIII Explosive Bid S., at about 1 1/8-miles on the turf for ages four and up March 24, has been raised \$25,000 to \$125,000. Two other listed races have been increased from \$100,000 to \$125,000--the March 9 Bayou Breeders' Cup H. and the March 23 Pelleteri H. Ten races have received increases ranging from \$10,000 to \$25,000 in order to hike their values to \$60,000. They are the Feb. 17 Whirlaway S., Feb. 24 Davona Dale S., Feb. 25 Risen Star S., March 2 Chou Croute S., March 3 Taylor's Special H., March 10 Harry Allsman Memorial H., March 17 Battler Star H., March 21 Victoria Lass S., March 22 Gentilly H. and March 25 Red Camelia H. In addition, the purse for the Feb. 20 Mardi Gras H. has been raised from \$35,000-added to \$50,000-added. All overnight races have been boosted from \$1,500 to \$4,000, effective with today's card. "This is our second purse increase this season and we're pleased to do it," noted Krantz. "We're pleased we can reward the horses in all classes. Hopefully, the purses will be at a level we can keep them next year." Krantz attributed the increases to the unlimited simulcasting now available to all Louisiana racetracks, the vast number of out-of-state locations taking the Fair Grounds signal and video poker revenues.

NORTHERN SPUR WORKS FOR RETURN Trainer Ron McAnally sent 1995 Eclipse Award-winning Turf Horse **Northern Spur (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) through an unusual 1 1/8-mile workout Sunday morning at Santa Anita in preparation for the GII \$200,000-added San Luis Obispo H., to be run Presidents' Day, Monday, Feb. 19. The five-year-old covered the distance in 1:54 handily with regular rider Chris McCarron aboard. "I was pleased," said McAnally. "On the way to the track, he was feeling good and was full of himself. The work itself was good and he came home strong. I had him in :11 and change for the last eighth." The only other time McAnally has ever worked a horse 1 1/8-miles was in John Henry's final work before the 1982 Santa Anita H. John Henry, in his first start of that year, won the Big 'Cap via the disqualification of Perrault to become the only two-time winner of the race. The San Luis Obispo, to be run at 1 1/2-miles on the turf, will be Northern Spur's first start since winning the Breeders' Cup Turf Oct. 28.

AUSTRALIAN STARS FALL Mahogany (Aust) (Last Tycoon {Ire}) and Jeune (GB) (Kalaglow {Ire}), nominated to represent Australia in the Dubai World Cup March 27, were unsuccessful in Saturday's C.F. Orr S. at Sandown, Melbourne. Mahogany, the 1994 Horse of the Year and Champion Three-Year-Old in Australia, finished fourth, beaten over four lengths. Jeune, last year's Australian Horse of the Year and Champion Older Horse, was seventh behind 12-1 winner **Racer's Edge (Aust)** (Rory's Jester {Aust}). But the seven furlong event was run at an extremely slow pace over wet ground. So the connections of Mahogany and Jeune at least have hopes of better things to come when bidding for the St. George S. at Flemington March 2. Leo Freedman, trainer of Mahogany, said, "I do not want to be over critical, but I think (jockey) Greg Hall might have led on him because they were going so slow." Peter Hayes, handler of Jeune, admitted, "You'd have to say he was very disappointing."

According to trainer Bill Mott, reigning Horse of the Year **Cigar** (Palace Music) came out of his victory in Saturday's GI Donn H. in good order. "He is doing real well," Mott said yesterday. "He didn't act tired this morning. We jogged him down the road and he strutted. He pulled old Harry (the hotwalker) around the barn. We are leaning toward California (the March 2 Santa Anita H.) and if he is okay, Dubai." Mott indicated that another of his charges, Donn runner-up **Wekiva Springs** (Runaway Groom), will likely start next in the March 2 Gulfstream Park H.

Last year's GI NYRA Mile and GI Pegasus H. winner **Flying Chevron** (Carson City), fifth in Saturday's GI Donn H. after setting the early fractions, collapsed from heat exhaustion after the race, but was reported to be in good condition yesterday by trainer James Toner. "He is okay today," Toner said. "We brought him back here (to Hialeah) last night. When we got him back to the barn, we iced him down and got some fluids into him. He is comfortable today. He won't run for a while. It was a traumatic experience for him."

Plum Country had finished worse than second only once in her career, showing a dislike for the grass when eighth in the Tropical Park Oaks New Year's Day. Bidding for her first graded stakes win off that start, the Florida-bred rebounded, rating near the back of the pack early but finishing fast to edge stablemate **Rare Blend** in the final yards. The runner-up took the lead at the top of the stretch but lugged in badly, then drifted out through the lane; she was disqualified and placed sixth. "I had the thrill of victory and the agony of defeat in one race," said trainer David Vivian. "Plum Country is the best

horse I have ever trained in my 50 years. She can run with anybody." Vivian, co-owner of the disqualified runner-up, claimed the winner for owner Dominick Vitte for \$50,000 from her second start, when she broke her maiden by nine lengths; she will be pointed for either the GII Florida Oaks at Tampa Bay March 24 or the GII Bonnie Miss at Gulfstream March 13. My Flag, the heavy 3-5 favorite in her first start since her Breeders' Cup win, was forced to alter course to the inside while rallying, then lacked racing room late and had to settle for the place. She will make her next start in the Bonnie Miss.
