MASSCAP BONUS UNVEILED Suffolk Downs has devised a new bonus structure for the 1996 Massachusetts Handicap that could award an additional quarter-million dollars to a multiple Grade I stakes winner who wins the race. The bonus is designed to attract horses which have won Grade I and Grade II races in the last two years to compete in the \$250,000 event, set for Saturday, June 1. "Obviously we would like to attract Cigar and any of the top handicap horses. But it is in the long-term best interest to establish a bonus that rewards excellence," said Lou Raffetto, Jr., vice president of racing. Cigar earned a \$500,000 bonus last year after sweeping the Gulfstream Park H., Oaklawn H., Pimlico Special and MassCap. This year, in addition to the winner's share of the purse, the bonus will pay:

- *\$250,000 to winners of 3 or more Grade I stakes in 1995 and 1996 (by June 1)
- *\$200,000 - 2 Grade I stakes in '95-'96
- *\$150,000 - 1 Grade I stakes in '95-'96
- *\$100,000 - 3 or more Grade II stakes in '95-'96
- * \$75,000 - 2 Grade II stakes in '95-'96
- * \$50,000 - 1 Grade II stakes in '95-'96

ROCKINGHAM SUPPORTS NEW SENATE BILL

Rockingham Park management released a statement yesterday saying it strongly supports the passage of State Senate Bill 651, which would allow the breakage, or pennies left over when parimutuel payoffs are rounded off to the nearest dime, to be added to the purse structure rather than be paid to the State of New Hampshire. That would add approximately \$350,000 annually to the purses Thoroughbred owners compete for, and would enable stables to remain in New Hampshire rather than leave for more lucrative racing circuits. "The threat to the racing industry, which has a \$60 million annual economic impact on New Hampshire, is real," said Rockingham's Vice President and General Manager Edward Callahan. "But it's not too late to act. Other states are legalizing electronic gaming at racetracks, and that allows them to offer significantly higher purses to the horsemen. The survival of horse racing in New Hampshire is in jeopardy." Senate Bill 651 has passed through the Ways and Means Committee and is headed for the Finance Committee.

SWINBURN ON THE IMPROVE Jockey Walter Swinburn continues to make progress and is expected to be moved from the intensive care unit at Hong Kong's Prince of Wales Hospital this weekend. The rider, badly injured Sunday in a spill at Sha Tin racecourse, still suffers from badly congested lungs, but the swelling to his chest has diminished some it hoped he will soon be breathing without the aid of a tube and that pain-killing injections can be reduced in the next few days. Philip Johnston, Hong Kong's director of racing, said yesterday, "Walter seems to be turning the corner and the doctors are very pleased with him."

BORODISLEW READY FOR 1996 DEBUT

Borodislew (Seattle Slew), off since her eighth-place finish in the Oct. 28 Breeders' Cup Distaff, is scheduled to return to action in the six-furlong, Gill Las Flores H. at Santa Anita Saturday, February 24. The six-year-old mare, owned by Marshall Naify's 505 Farm, won five of 10 starts and \$414,900 in 1995. She reeled off four straight wins--including the Gill Chula Vista H. at Del Mar and the Gill Lady's Secret H. at Oak Tree--while under the care of trainer Eduardo Inda. When Inda parted ways with 505 Farms late last year, Borodislew was switched to trainer John Shirreffs, who has had the mare in steady training at Hollywood Park.

DEL MAR YEARLING SALE NOMINATIONS

DUE California Thoroughbred Breeders Association Executive Vice President and General Manager Ted Waite is promising there will be an emphasis on service to both consignors and sellers at the 1996 California Thoroughbred Sales Del Mar Yearling Sale, to be held August 12 and 13. CTS is the equine auction company of the CTBA. "CTS will strive to provide a profitable atmosphere at the Del Mar sale by offering more service and making the move to the more conducive layout of the Del Mar HorsePark," Waite said. "Everything is very convenient and close together at the HorsePark, so sellers will have a better opportunity to show their horses." Last year's sale was held at Del Mar Racetrack. The 1996 Del Mar Yearling Sale will be conducted in two sessions, a select session Monday evening, Aug. 12, and a preferred session the next day. 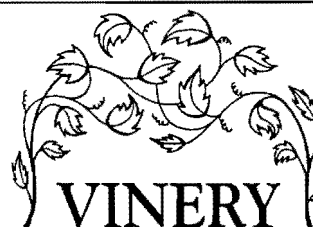
