BRITISH SPONSOR WITHDRAWS BACKING

George Ward, one of British horse racing's most generous supporters, has withdrawn his backing of two major events at Kempton Park in protest against the British Horseracing Board's stance on advertising. Ward, whose photographic company has supported the Masaka and Easter Stakes under the Bonusprint banner since 1983, will cease those sponsorships this year. He is also threatening to withhold money from the Tripleprint Temple and Bonusprint Henry II Stakes at Sandown, plus Kempton's September Stakes and the same track's King George VI Tripleprint Chase, one of England's most important jumping events. Ward's complaint is based on the belief that race sponsors no longer receive value for money since the BHB allowed individual horses to carry advertising on rugs and silks. He was involved with a heated public exchange with the Board's marketing director Lee Richardson last weekend and said yesterday, "It is with great regret that we cannot renew our contract to support these two important races, but our position as race sponsors is untenable and commercially unsound."

ANOTHER SNOWSTORM HITS NORTHEAST

The Northeast's 13th snowstorm of 1996 hit Friday, covering the region with up to a foot of snow. As a result, live racing was cancelled yesterday at Aqueduct, Suffolk Downs, Laurel Park and Garden State Park. Laurel, whose cancellation was the eighth of the year, remained open for full-card simulcasting. Aqueduct plans to make up for lost days due to inclement weather with an 11-race live card this Sunday. "While needing to make up for some of the many days lost during the winter, we decided that running 11 live races Sunday would be one way to make up for lost revenue," said New York Racing Association Vice President of Operations Terry Meyocks. "If we would have run a makeup day of racing the product might have been diluted, and we don't think that is in the best interests of racing and our fans."

News cont.**SCHEDULE CHANGE MARK OJC STAKES**

PROGRAM The Ontario Jockey Club has tentatively released its 1996 Woodbine stakes schedule, which features 104 races worth \$21.56 million including \$10 million for the seven Breeders' Cup races. The meet will be highlighted by the October 26 Breeders' Cup, the first time the event will be held outside of the United States. A significant change in the calendar this year sees the Queen's Plate, first leg of the Canadian Triple Crown, slated for a Saturday instead of its traditional Sunday running. The \$400,000 event, set for 10 furlongs on the dirt, has been tentatively scheduled for July 13 to coincide with the expected appearance of Princess Margaret as the race's royal representative. In the event the Princess is unable to attend, the OJC will consider moving the Queen's Plate back to its original July 7 date. The last time the race was run on a Saturday was believed to be 1981, according to Queen's Plate historian Lou Cauz. Also on the schedule are two races renamed for Canadian Horses of the Year--the \$100,000a Dance Smartly S., formerly the Woodbine Budweiser Breeders' Cup, set for nine furlongs on the grass July 21; and the \$75,000a Play The King H., formerly the Toronto Budweiser Breeders' Cup, at seven furlongs on the grass September 14--and the newly created \$100,000a Sky Classic S. will be run at a mile and a half on the turf October 25. The \$1 million Canadian International, formerly the Rothmans International, for turf horses going 12 furlongs will be run September 29; and the \$1 million Woodbine Million, formerly the Molson Million, for three-year-olds will be held September 15. The Woodbine meet is currently scheduled to run from March 23 to December 5, but the OJC will attempt to lengthen the season to December 31. The Ontario Racing Commission has heard an appeal on the matter, but the decision is still pending.

CLASSY MIRAGE RETIRED Joseph and William Stavola's top sprinter **Classy Mirage** (Storm Bird) has been retired and will be bred in 1996 to Gulch. The six-year-old won 13 of 25 starts, finishing in the money 22 times, for earnings of \$716,712. Her graded stakes victories came in the GI Ballerina H. and GII Genuine Risk H. in 1995, GII Distaff H. and GII Bed o' Roses H. in 1994, and GII Prioress S. in 1993. In her final career start, Classy Mirage took on the boys in the GII Fall Highweight H. Nov. 23, finishing second. A half-sister to MGI winner Missy's Mirage (Stop the Music) and MSW Joey's First Jove (Northern Jove), Classy Mirage is now at Taylor Made Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky.

AKSARBEN BOARD OF DIRECTORS VOTE TO SUSPEND 1996 MEET

The Board of Directors of AKSArben in Omaha, Nebraska voted 4-1 Thursday in favor of suspending the track's 1996 live race meet. In order for the suspension to become official, it must be approved by the Douglas County Commissioners, who are scheduled to vote on the matter this Tuesday. Although financial troubles may prevent AKSArben from conducting its live race meet this year, track officials plan to keep the facility open for simulcasting.
