MCCARRON TOPS PINCAY AS WORLD'S

LEADING RIDER Jockey Chris McCarron yesterday surpassed Laffit Pincay Jr. as the world's leading rider in money won. McCarron took the title away from Pincay after booting home **Ski Dancer** (Baldski) to win Santa Anita's sixth race Monday, boosting his earnings to \$190,315,569, as compared to \$190,312,529 for Pincay, who is also still active on the Southern California circuit. "The only dreams I ever had were to be riding in the big time and to win the Kentucky Derby," said McCarron after the feat. "I've been fortunate to have those dreams fulfilled. I never thought that one day I would eventually be the world's richest rider. I'm privileged and it feels nice."

LANDO NAMED GERMANY'S HORSE OF THE

YEAR Lando (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}), retired to stud after winning last November's Japan Cup, has been voted the German Horse of the Year for the second straight year. The six-year-old, also fourth in last year's Arc de Triomphe, picked up two-thirds of the 65,000 public votes cast. **All My Dreams** (Ire) (Assert {Ire}), winner of the German Derby, was second with 19 percent of the ballot. Lando, a winner of 10 of his 23 career starts, is now based at Ittlingen Stud near Dortmund, Germany.

FASIG-TIPTON ANNOUNCES DATE CHANGE

This year's Fasig-Tipton Preferred Yearling Sale in Saratoga Springs, New York will be moved forward from its originally scheduled date of August 12 to Saturday evening, August 10. The Preferred Yearling Sale is a single-session auction which prominently features New York-breds. "We have been looking for ways to enhance this sale and to make the format more attractive for sellers and buyers," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "After discussions with several of New York's leading commercial breeders and Lou Salerno, president of New York Thoroughbred Breeders, we agreed on this date change. Unraced since taking the 10-furlong Rejoy S. by nine lengths December 29, Windsharp came back to take on the colts for the first time since coming over from Europe and proved ready for the mile-and-a-half test. On-the-board in eight of nine prior tries at the distance, the Kentucky-bred mare was sent off the crowd's second choice; she rallied with a three-wide move at the top of the lane and got up in time despite a midstretch bump from Virginia Carnival. Wandesta (GB) completed the distaff exacta. "It was a perfect ride by Mr. Eddie Delahoussaye--it couldn't have been better," said winning trainer Wally Dollase. "He saved ground along the rail and then swung out--I knew she would finish good. She's got tremendous stamina." Dollase added that Windsharp would make her next start in the GII Orchid H. at Gulfstream March 10. Even-money chalk **NORTHERN SPUR** (IRE) (Sadler's Wells) raced in contention all the way and made a bid at the leaders as they straightened for home but weakened late to be fourth. "It's been a long time since he had run," said trainer Ron McAnally. "(Jockey Chris McCarron) didn't kill him after he started to get tired. We'll go forward...(Chris) said he'll do nothing but improve." The San Luis Rey at Santa Anita March 24 is likely for the champion's next start.

Bet down to 2-5 to pick up his third straight stakes and his first in a graded event, Meadow Monster saved ground just off the leaders to the final bend, then switched to the outside and moved up to challenge for the lead, drawing away in the drive under jockey Rick Wilson. "He wasn't getting hold of the track early on," said Wilson. "But I just let him settle in. After that, it was just a matter of timing and when to move on him." The field was reduced by two at the last moment after an incident in the backstretch left two of the runners injured. According to the Laurel stewards, SEA EMPEROR (Naked Sky) and FINDER'S FORTUNE (Buckfinder) had to be scratched after Sea Emperor broke loose from his groom on the way to the paddock and collided with Finder's Fortune. "Apparently someone came out of a dormitory room and slammed the door," said Manny Tortora, trainer of Sea Emperor. "It was so loud that (Sea Emperor) jerked loose and went backward and fell. He got a cut on his shoulder and a little cut on his leg. But I think he'll be all right." There was no immediate report on Finder's Fortune's injuries.

WOOD MEMORIAL RUNNER-UP DQ'ED In a decision released by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board just yesterday, it was revealed that **Knockadoon** (Dixieland Band) tested positive for the banned substance Lidocaine after running second to Talkin Man in last year's GII Wood Memorial and has now been disqualified from the purse money. Lidocaine is used as a local anesthetic. Trainer Tony Reinstedler received a seven-day suspension and a \$3,000 fine; the suspension runs from February 21-February 27.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH S.-GII, \$200,000, 3yo, 8.5f

Editor's Note (Forty Niner), runner-up in the GII Hutcheson S. in his first start this year, breezed five furlongs in 1:02 yesterday morning. "He went the last eighth in :11 2/5. We put a good stout work into him last week. This morning we were just looking for something to polish him off and keep him sharp," said Dallas Stewart, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. Also prepping for the Fountain of Youth, **Frisco View** (Mt. Livermore) went six furlongs in 1:14 4/5 yesterday. The colt, winner of back-to-back Gulfstream allowance tests, makes his stakes debut Saturday. "This is a huge step," said trainer Frank Brothers. "Normally, I wouldn't take a horse that had just won a 'two other than' and run him in a race like the Fountain of Youth. But the timing is fine and it is early in the year. It is an extremely tough race. One thing that is good about it is that we will find out how we stand. The question is his ability to run with these horses; we're going to have to run him to see."

RAMPART H.-GII, \$200,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 8.5f

Port Plaisance (Woodman), stakes-placed in her 10 races in France, makes her second Stateside start. The five-year-old scored a 5 1/2-length Gulfstream allowance victory in her dirt and American debut January 25. "It is awful hard to think that she won't run well in the Rampart," said trainer Mike Puype. "It will be a lot tougher, but she won like she can get tested with a lot tougher." **Conquistadora** (Seeking the Gold), who will join stablemate **Recognizable** (Seattle Slew) in the starting gate Sunday, went five-eighths in 1:01 1/5 Monday.
