CIGAR INJURED Plans for 1995 Horse of the Year Cigar (Palace Music) were put on hold yesterday after the six-year-old suffered a stone bruise in his right front foot. The injury was discovered Wednesday, and Cigar has not been to the track for the past two days. "There are no immediate plans," said trainer Bill Mott. "You don't make any plans when you have a problem." As for how long the champ will be out, Mott said, "It could be two days, it could be two weeks, it could be two months. All of these things are a little different. I don't think there is any way to tell." Mott removed an abscess from Cigar's right front hoof Thursday afternoon to let it drain. The trainer performed the procedure in Cigar's stall, assisted by Dr. Jim Prendergast. Mott had arranged for a farrier to be flown in from Hot Springs, Arkansas, but when inclement weather delayed the flight, he decided to perform the procedure himself. Cigar had been pointing to the March 2 Santa Anita H., but it is now unlikely he will make the \$1 million race. Mott indicated that even if Cigar is forced to miss the Big 'Cap, the injury is not deemed career-threatening and the champion should race again this year.

GENUINE RISK FOALS CHIEF HONCHO COLT Genuine Risk (Exclusive Native), named Champion Three-Year-Old Filly of 1980 after winning that year's Kentucky Derby, foaled a chestnut colt by Chief Honcho (Chief's Crown) at 10 p.m. Wednesday, February 21, at Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky. "The foaling was uneventful and Genuine Risk has a very nice, attractive, good-sized colt by the millionaire Chief Honcho," said Three Chimneys General Manager Dan Rosenberg. Genuine Risk, the second filly ever to win the Kentucky Derby, made headlines three years ago when she delivered her first live foal at the age of 16. She was bred one time to Chief Honcho in 1995 and experienced an uneventful pregnancy. "We bred Genuine Risk to Chief Honcho knowing that the foal would have a cross of the 'blue chip' broodmare Exclusive on both the top and the bottom," said Diana Firestone, who owns Genuine Risk along with her husband Bert. "Plus, Chief Honcho raced for our son Matthew, who picked out Genuine Risk as a yearling." The 19-year-old mare will be bred back to Chief Honcho this year. Genuine Risk's first foal, a three-year-old colt by Rahy named Genuine Reward, is in training in Florida with Bill Mott. After several minor setbacks as a two-year-old, he is training forwardly and is expected to make his racetrack debut in Florida this spring.

THREE-YEAR-OLD CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES CREATED

The Thoroughbred Racing Associations and Triple Crown Productions jointly announced yesterday the formation of a series of three-year-old stakes events sponsored by Visa USA, the sponsor of the Triple Crown Challenge. The series will include 46 stakes for three-year-olds held between January 1 and the August 24 running of the Travers S. All main-track, non-restricted graded races and stakes worth more than \$150,000 conducted at TRA tracks during that time span have been included. "We hope this series will provide a storyline for the three-year-old division that will increase the fans' familiarity and interest in these horses and races," TRA President Cliff Goodrich said. Featured in the series will be the three Visa Triple Crown Challenge races--the Kentucky Derby, Preakness S. and Belmont S., important Triple Crown preps like the Santa Anita Derby, Florida Derby, Wood Memorial, Arkansas Derby and Blue Grass S., and post-Triple Crown classics like the Haskell Invitational H., Swaps S. and Travers S. In total, there will be seven Grade I races, 16 Grade II races, 20 Grade III races and three ungraded stakes worth a minimum of \$150,000. In each Visa Three-Year-Old Championship Series race, horses will receive points for finishing in first, second or third place. The number of points will be awarded in the following manner:

Triple Crown events score 15-10-5

Grade I races score 10-7-5

Grade II races score 7-5-3

Grade III and ungraded races score 5-3-1

At the conclusion of the series, the horse with the most points will be crowned the first Visa Three-Year-Old of the Year. Five Visa Three-Year-Old Championship Series races have already been run, with five different winners: **Seacliff** (Valid Appeal), **Cavonnier** (Batonnier), **Cobra King** (Farma Way), **Appealing Skier** (Baldski) and **Afleetaffair** (Afleet). The current leader with seven points is Appealing Skier, winner of the Gil Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream. While 1996 marks the inaugural year for the Series, a review of the last five years reveals that the champions would have been Thunder Gulch, Tabasco Cat, Prairie Bayou, A.P. Indy and Hansel.

DEL MAR ANNOUNCES RECORD STAKES

SCHEDULE Del Mar has announced its richest stakes schedule ever, a 24-event program worth a record \$5 million for the 1996 summer season slated from July 24 to Sept. 11. Highlighting the seaside stakes program once again will be the \$1 million Pacific Classic. The sixth running of the 1 1/4-mile event is scheduled for Saturday, August 10. In addition to the Pacific Classic, the track will offer three other Grade I headliners, nine Grade II stakes and six Grade III's. The other Grade I tests will be the \$300,000a Ramona H. for fillies and mares August 3; the \$300,000a Eddie Read H. August 4; and the \$250,000 Del Mar Oaks August 18. All three of those races will be showcased at 1 1/8-miles on the Jimmy Durante turf course. "We think we have a winning program at Del Mar," noted Director of Racing Tom Robbins, "and because of that we've made only minor adjustments to our stakes schedule from last year." Among changes from 1995 are an upgrading of the July 27 \$100,000a San Clemente H. at a mile on the turf for three-year-old fillies from a Grade III to a Grade II; and the enhancement of the six-furlong Bing Crosby H. from \$150,000a to \$200,000a. The GIII dash for three-year-olds and up is now part of the revised Breeders' Cup stakes schedule, and will carry the title Bing Crosby Breeders' Cup H. for its 51st running.

ROBERT BRENNAN TO SELL ITB STOCK

Robert E. Brennan, currently appealing a \$75-million stock fraud ruling against him, will cut all remaining ties to International Thoroughbred Breeders Inc. by selling his 25-percent interest in the company, it was revealed in yesterday's *Asbury Park Press*. The *Press* reported that Brennan, who resigned as ITB chairman and CEO November 2, will sell his 2.9 million shares of ITB stock in a deal worth \$20.3 million to Cambridge Partners, which consists of five members of the ITB board of directors as well as unnamed partners independent of the company. The sale was announced at Wednesday's annual ITB stockholders meeting at Garden State Park; according to the *Press*, plans to build a \$1 billion Las Vegas casino and hotel were also announced at the meeting and there was speculation that Brennan's decision to sell was influenced by a potential investigation by Nevada gaming regulators. Brennan told the *Press* that ITB "just can't afford the kind of controversy that surrounds my presence." The deal will have to be approved by the federal bankruptcy court overseeing Brennan's case.

MORE MONEY FOR MOYGLARE The purse of Ireland's richest juvenile fillies race will be increased by 50 percent for its 1996 running. The G1 Moyglare Stud S., to be run Sept. 8, will be worth approximately \$210,000. Stan Cosgrove, Moyglare manager, said, "The race has been won by many good fillies and we have decided to increase the prize money to ensure we continue to attract the best." The Curragh race was lengthened from six to seven furlongs in 1992, with immediate success. That year, four of the first five finishers went on to win classic races. That race produced the British, Irish and Italian 1000 Guineas winners in Moyglare victress **Sayedati (GB)** (Shadeed), fifth place finisher **Nicer (Ire)** (Pennine Walk {Ire}) and fourth place finisher **Ancestral Dancer (GB)** (Siberian Express), respectively. Also coming out of the Moyglare that year was runner-up **Bright Generation (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest), winner of the Oaks d'Italia.

MARYLAND-BRED CHAMPIONS ANNOUNCED

Cigar (Palace Music) has been unanimously voted the 1995 Maryland-bred Horse of the Year in the annual poll conducted by the Maryland Horse Breeders Association. Owned and bred by Allen Paulson, he was foaled at the Pons family Country Life Farm in Bel Air, Maryland, and included the GI Pimlico Special in last year's unblemished 10-for-10 campaign.
