BIG 'CAP WEIGHTS RELEASED With **Cigar** (Palace Music), assigned highweight of 129 pounds, out of the March 2 Santa Anita H. with a stone bruise in his right front foot, the starting highweight at 121 pounds looks to be **Helmsman** (El Gran Senor), winner of the GI Strub S. at the Big 'Cap distance of 1 1/4-miles. **Soul of the Matter** (Private Terms), also assigned 121, will likely skip the Grade I race in favor of the March 27 Dubai World Cup. **Alphabet Soup** (Cozzene), winner of the GII San Antonio H. and GII San Pasqual H. in his last two starts, is likely to be the second starting highweight at 120 pounds. Other probable starters, with weights, include: **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms), 119; **Dare and Go** (Alydar), 118; supplemental entrant **Urgent Request** (Ire) (Rainbow Quest), 117; **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister), 115; **Score Quick** (Northern Score), 115; **Luthier Fever** (Mt. Livermore), 114; supplemental entrant **The Key Rainbow** (Ire) (Rainbow Quest), 114; **Cezind** (Ferdinand), 112; and **Just Java** (Java Gold), 111. Considered possible for the race is last year's Champion Three-Year-Old Filly **Serena's Song** (Rahy), assigned 114 pounds. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas has said **Serena's Song's** chances of running depend partly on her assigned weight, as she has never won over the distance.

FASIG-TIPTON'S SELECTED TWO-YEAR-OLDS IN TRAINING SALE BEGINS TODAY A total of 236 two-year-olds in training breezed over the main track at Calder Racecourse Sunday in Fasig-Tipton's under-tack preview for their Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale at Calder, to be held tonight and tomorrow. "We had beautiful weather for the show," commented Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "There was a pretty strong breeze blowing against our workers down the stretch and, between the wind and a dying track, these horses worked entirely on their own merit." Twelve horses breezed a quarter-mile in under 23 seconds, with the fastest time at the distance being :21 3/5. That was for hip number 268, a gray colt by **Danzatore** from the consignment of Indian Prairie Ranch. There were 46 juveniles who worked sub-11 second eighths, with hip numbers 284 and 337 sharing the fastest time of :10 2/5. Hip 284 is a bay colt by **Mining**, offered by Quarter H Farm, and 337 is a chestnut filly by **Crusader Sword** from the consignment of Jerry Bailey Sales Agency. The first session of the two-day sale begins this evening at 7:30 p.m.

Lightly raced but regally bred **Mackie** was backed down to 9-5 for her stakes and two-turn debut and gave dam **Glowing Tribute** her sixth graded-stakes winner with an impressive performance. Shipping in from **Gulfstream** after taking a seven-furlong allowance January 21, the dark bay was reserved for a half, moved to challenge on the far turn and ran away from the field down the stretch. "She's a special filly," said trainer W. Elliot Walden. "She's an over-achiever...(but) I found out today that she's better than I thought. She just blew them away." The filly will return to Florida and be pointed for either the GIII **Fair Grounds Oaks** March 16 or the GI **Ashland** at **Keeneland** April 20.

TRAINER SKIPPY SHAPOFF DEAD Trainer Stanley "Skippy" Shapoff passed away Sunday morning at St. Francis Hospital in Roslyn, New York due to heart failure. Shapoff, 78, trained numerous stakes winners over the years including Hudson County, who won the Bay Shore S. and finished second to Cannonade in the 100th running of the Kentucky Derby in 1974. Among his other stakes winners were Bolinas Boy, Forever Silver, Expensive Decision, Perfect Spy, Silver of Silver and Stately Wager. A native of Louisville, Kentucky, Shapoff was destined for West Point after graduation from the Kentucky Military Academy. However, he had to turn down the appointment after finding out he was color blind. He briefly attended Harvard University, but the lure of the track proved too great. Shapoff was instrumental in the formation of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation. He is survived by his wife, Mary Louise, and twin sons Edward and Cary. Visitation will be held at the Fairchild Sons Funeral Home in Garden City today between 7-9 p.m. and Tuesday from 2-5 p.m. and 7-9 p.m., with a service at 8 p.m. Burial will be in Flushing Cemetery Wednesday morning at 11 a.m. Donations can be made to St. Francis Hospital or the Backstretch Chaplaincy at Belmont Park.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH WRAP-UP Built For Pleasure (Homebuilder), winner of Saturday's GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream, has a new schedule for his three-year-old season following his upset victory at odds of 144-1. "They'll have him to beat (in the March 16 Florida Derby)," said owner-trainer Thomas H. Heard, who added, "His victory was no fluke. This horse has not run a bad race. He had run second to Hennessy in the Sapling S. and was second to Seacliff in the Spectacular Bid following a layoff." Trainer Jim Ryerson seemed pleased with the second-place effort of 4-5 race favorite **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled). "He came back good," Ryerson said. "It wasn't smooth for him early and it hurt him, but he still finished halfway decent. This horse has had all the hype, but he ran three times as a two-year-old and he has run five times now. He is not a seasoned veteran by any means." George Weaver, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas, said yesterday of third-place finisher **Victory Speech** (Deputy Minister), "He is doing fantastic. There are a lot of three-year-old options. We're pleased because we now know he can run with the big boys." As for **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner), the other Lukas-trained Fountain of Youth starter who finished fifth, beaten two lengths, Weaver noted, "We'll probably stick to the Florida Derby/Blue Grass schedule with him." **Gold Fever** (Forty Niner), seventh in the Fountain of Youth, will make his next start in a sprint, according to trainer Shug McGaughey. "He came back fine," McGaughey said. "He is not going to run in the Florida Derby, that is for sure. I think he is a come-from-behind sprinter."

ALPHABET SOUP BREEZES FOR BIG 'CAP

Alphabet Soup (Cozzene), winner of his last three starts, all graded stakes, breezed seven furlongs in 1:31 3/5 over Hollywood Park's good main track yesterday. The five-year-old is scheduled to run in Saturday's \$1 million Santa Anita H. "He worked nice and easy; it was what we wanted," said trainer David Hofmans. "That was his final exercise for the Big 'Cap. We'll van him over (to Santa Anita) Wednesday, school him a couple of times, and run him." The roan's regular jockey, Chris Antley, has signed a contract with owner Mrs. B.J. Ridder that ensures Antley will ride Alphabet Soup in the Grade I event. Mrs. Ridder insisted on the unique arrangement after last Saturday's GI Las Virgenes S., in which Antley took off Ridder's **Raw Gold** (Rahy) to ride eventual winner **Antespend** (Spend a Buck) for trainer Ron McAnally and owner Jack Kent Cooke. "Chris feels bad about last week's circumstances and he has no problem with this arrangement," said Antley's agent Harry Hacek. "Basically, Chris has promised Mrs. Ridder he will ride Alphabet Soup, and a contract has been signed and filed with the stewards that guarantees he will ride the horse."

GULFSTREAM RAISES PURSES AGAIN

Gulfstream Park will again increase all overnight purses by five percent, Director of Racing Robert D. Umphrey announced yesterday. The second increase of the meeting will become effective Wednesday, February 28. Purses were previously increased by five percent February 17. Both increases will remain in effect through the meet's March 16 closing. "Gulfstream's large simulcasting network continues to generate increased handle and is responsible for our being able to again boost the purses," Umphrey said.

LUTHIER FEVER NEEDS TRAINER Cuadra TYT's **Luthier Fever** (Mt. Livermore) is without a trainer just six days away from the biggest race of his career--the \$1 million Santa Anita H. Gary Jones announced Saturday he is no longer training the 1995 California Cup Classic winner, and would give no specifics when asked what had caused the split between him and Cuadra TYT, which is the nom de course for Alfonso and Jose Antonio Lanzagorta of Mexico City. Sunday morning, Luthier Fever took to the main track at Hollywood Park and breezed six furlongs in 1:16 1/5. The Lanzagortas, who supervised the drill, hope to name a new trainer quickly. For now, Luthier Fever, a winner of six of 21 starts for earnings of \$440,852, is housed in Barn 54 at Hollywood Park and is being cared for by his regular groom, Vinnie Castaneda.

MOONHELL ECLIPSED Moonshell (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) finished third in a four-horse field in a one-mile conditions contest on sand at Nad Al Sheba Racecourse in Dubai Sunday. Last year's G1 Epsom Oaks winner appeared to have an easy opportunity to score on her first outing since suffering a training injury after her classic success in June. However, she failed to sparkle and came home 8 1/2-lengths behind the Kentucky-bred winner **Airport** (Lear Fan), trained by Dhruva Selvaratnam. Lack of firm track condition following Moonshell's long layoff was said to be a contributing factor in her defeat. Round Two of the Maktoum Challenge, held on the same card, went to **Larrocha** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). The four-year-old filly, a MSW in England last year, was partnered by Britain's champion jockey Frankie Dettori for the Godolphin stable. She breezed home an easy 10 lengths in front of runner-up **Learmont** (Lear Fan).
