## HOLLYWOOD TO HOST '97 BREEDERS' CUP

James E. Basset III, president of Breeders' Cup Limited, announced Wednesday that Hollywood Park will be the site of the 1997 Breeders' Cup Championship. The seven Breeders' Cup races, worth a total of \$10 million, will be run Saturday, November 9, 1997. The Southern California track will be hosting the championship for the third time, having hosted the inaugural running in 1984 and again in 1987. "We are very pleased to bring the Breeders' Cup Championship back to Hollywood Park," said Bassett, who made the announcement following the approval of the selection by the Breeders' Cup Board of Directors. "We are also especially gratified that the California Horse Racing Board has agreed to adjust its traditional fall racing dates to coincide with our host track selection." This year's Breeders' Cup Championship will be held at Woodbine Racetrack in Toronto, Canada Saturday, October 26.

## CIGAR'S RETURN TO THE TRACK DELAYED

Horse of the Year **Cigar** (Palace Music) did not go to the track Wednesday morning at Gulfstream as expected. Trainer Bill Mott noted that a "slightly exaggerated pulse" is still being detected in the six-year-old's bruised right front foot. Mott is hoping a protective patch can be placed on the foot by Friday, enabling the champ to return to the racetrack Saturday.

The field of nine, in post position order, is as follows: **Powerful Punch** (Danzig Connection), 111 pounds; **Wekiva Springs** (Runaway Groom), 117; **Bound By Honor** (Woodman), 111; **Personal Merit** (Turkoman), 112; **Mecke** (Maudlin), 117; **Royal Mitch** (Homebuilder), 110; **Star Standard** (Risen Star), 112; **Silver Fox** (Pleasant Colony), 109; **L'Carriere** (Carr de Naskra), 117.

Royal Mitch drilled a half-mile in :47 4/5 at Gulfstream Wednesday. "He did it easy; he was just galloping," said trainer Dennis Ebert. The four-year-old colt, winner of last year's Holy Bull S., has won his last two starts by a combined 12 1/4-lengths. Both were 1 1/16-mile allowances over Gulfstream's main track. "We'll try them Saturday," Ebert said. "It is a tough group, but if he hits the board I'll be happy because I'll know he gave it his best."

## Saturday, Santa Anita:

**SANTA ANITA H.-GI, \$1,000,000, 4yo/up, 1 1/4m**

**Helmsman** (El Gran Senor), winner of the GII San Fernando S. and GI Strub S. in his last two starts, drilled a half-mile in :47 4/5 over Hollywood's muddy track yesterday in his final prep for the Big 'Cap. "The track was off a little bit and I told the boy to go the half in :49," said trainer Wally Dollase. "He went in :47 4/5, but he was just cruising. It was an impressive work; I was pleased. The track wasn't at its best, but it was adequate."

Also working four furlongs at Hollywood Park yesterday were Strub runner-up **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms) and 1995 Big 'Cap third-place finisher **Dare and Go** (Alydar). Afternoon Deelites was timed in :47 2/5, and Dare and Go was clocked in :47 3/5. Following the Santa Anita H., Dare and Go is scheduled to fly to Dubai. While the five-year-old has already accepted an invitation to run in the March 27 \$500,000 Emirates Airline Invitational on the Dubai World Cup undercard, trainer Dick Mandella hopes Dare and Go will get to participate in the world's richest race. "We're hoping he gets in the Big One," Mandella said. "There's a good chance he'll get to run there."

Mike Smith has been named to ride supplemental entrant **The Key Rainbow (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest) in the Big 'Cap for trainer Bobby Frankel.

**TEJANO RUN BACK AT THE RACES** Tejano Run (Tejano), away from the races since finishing ninth in last year's May 20 Preakness S., is scheduled to return in Saturday's \$60,000 Dust Commander S. for ages four and up over a mile at Turfway Park. The four-year-old colt won the GII Breeders' Futurity and GII Kentucky Cup Juvenile at two, then at three finished second in both the Kentucky Derby and GII Jim Beam S. During the running of the Preakness, Tejano Run bled in his lungs and sustained a chipped ankle. He underwent surgery for the chip and went back into training. Before long, however, he developed a breathing problem, caused by a throat condition known as a paralyzed flap. Last August, Tejano Run underwent surgery to tie back the flap; the next day, he became deathly ill with colic, and more surgery was required to remove the intestinal obstruction. The colt recovered at Longfield Farm near Louisville through the fall, then was sent to Ocala, Florida for his preliminary training. "He came into hand more quickly than we thought," said trainer Ken McPeck. "Physically he's fine, except that, with his throat, we don't know what level he's going to settle into. If he comes back to his previous form, we would love to run him in the Oaklawn H. April 6."

**CASSIDY LEAVES NYRA** Marshall Cassidy, the head announcer at the New York tracks from 1979 to 1990 and lately the director of the New York Racing Association's Equibase program operation, left the organization yesterday after accepting a buyout offer. Cassidy, 50, said he will move to Saratoga Springs and hopes to find a job in the Saratoga-Albany area. With his departure, the Cassidy name, associated with racing since the 1800s, is no longer an active part of the sport. His great-grandfather, Mars Cassidy, was a renowned starter and his grandfather, Marshall Cassidy, served as the director of racing for NYRA as well as executive secretary of The Jockey Club. "I'll move to Saratoga, have fun for a few weeks and then look for a job," Cassidy said. "I'm too young to retire. After having experienced the best of the best in racing here, I'd be selective about any racing jobs that might come up. But if it is an interesting opportunity, yes, I'd be interested."
