CIGAR BACK ON TRACK Horse of the Year Cigar (Palace Music) had a patch applied to his right front hoof Friday evening and, after being shod with a specially made pair of bar shoes yesterday, the champ was expected to return to the track this morning. "The patch looks great," said trainer Bill Mott. "We will try to proceed to train with it. Hopefully, everything will work out and it will stay on. Our main objective is getting to the racetrack and seeing how the patch holds and how he handles the shoes and how the foot is. If Dubai falls into place, we'll go for it." If he makes the trip, Cigar will leave for Dubai in two weeks.

NORTHERN SPUR TO GULFSTREAM Eclipse Award-winner Northern Spur (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), fourth in the San Luis Obispo in his first start of the campaign February 19, is scheduled to fly from California to Florida Tuesday afternoon; the five-year-old will make his next start in the GI Crown Royal Pan American H. at Gulfstream Park Sunday, March 9. Last year's champion turf horse has won two of his five American starts, taking last year's GI Oak Tree Invitational, and the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at the 12-furlong distance of the \$300,000 Pan American.

DARE AND GO INJURED La Presle Farm's Dare and Go (Alydar), winner of the GI Strub S. and third in the Big 'Cap in 1995, was scratched from yesterday's GI Santa Anita H. after suffering a minor injury to his right hind ankle. "I just know he must have kicked a wall or twisted it," said trainer Richard Mandella. "It looked like he broke his leg, the way it swelled so fast and how sore he was. We took him right down for x-rays and everything came out clean. We iced him throughout the evening, and it's gone down about 90 percent. He was sound on it (Saturday) morning." Mandella added that he hoped to have the five-year-old back to the track as early as this morning, and that he will continue to prepare for the March 27 Dubai World Cup.

Mr Purple tried a mile and a quarter for the first time in the GI Strub S. last out and came away with a respectable third-place finish. A longshot off that effort despite the fact that the top two, HELMSMAN (El Gran Senor) and AFTERNOON DEELITES (Private Terms) were the first and second choices, the dark bay was content to trail early but kicked it into overdrive on the far turn; rallying five-wide, he galloped past the field to take the lead at the top of the lane and draw clear. "When the money is down, he is there," said trainer Ron McAnally. "He's a push-button horse that'll do anything you want him to do. We thought he was a good horse all the time. He's just got class written all over him." Favored Helmsman ran evenly to be fourth. "He didn't get away good; then I got kind of broadsided from Luthier Fever," said his jockey, Chris McCarron. "He just kind of gave up at that point." Afternoon Deelites and SERENA'S SONG (Rahy) closed from just off the pace to run head-and-head for the lead at the quarter-pole, but both weakened in the drive. While Afternoon Deelites' connections offered no excuses, trainer D. Wayne Lukas felt none were needed for his champ. "She didn't do anything to disappoint us," he said. "It was a tough race and we knew that going in. I thought she ran hard all the way."

Wekiva Springs, second to stablemate Cigar in the Donn H. in his last outing Feb. 10, had been the runner-up his last three and was looking for his first stakes win since the GII San Fernando H. more than a year ago.

The grey settled into fourth in the early going before rallying to take the lead in the stretch and drawing off authoritatively. Trainer Bill Mott, winning a record third straight Gulfstream Park H., said, "Today was his day. He has been knocking hard every time. He didn't disgrace himself last time and he had enough constitution to come back and run a good race today. He was due." Added winning jockey Jerry Bailey, "The only question was how he would handle the track...he had never really been on off footing before, but he had no problems at all." Star Standard, who tired to sixth after pressing the pace in the GI Donn H., led to the top of the stretch. L'CARRIERE (Carr de Naskra), making his first start since second in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, made a bid at the quarter pole but weakened late to be fourth. "It was a good tightener," said trainer H. James Bond. "Everything looks good for Dubai."

Honour and Glory began his 3-year-old campaign with a win in the San Miguel S. Jan. 18 and was second to AFLEETAFFAIR (Afleet) last time out in the GIII San Vincente S. Feb. 10. The colt led from the start here and pulled clear in the stretch for his second graded stakes win. "He more or less inherited the lead and was doing things very easily," winning jockey Gary Stevens explained. "He kicked on real nice from the three-eighths pole, and showed a lot of quality. He warmed up quieter today and was a lot more relaxed than in his last race. That's pretty much how he ran, too." Looking forward to the Kentucky Derby, trainer D. Wayne Lukas said, "As far as a mile-and-a-quarter, he was drawing off from those horses. They made a little run at him at the eighth-pole, but he was widening. He was in better shape at the wire than he was at the eighth pole, so that's a good sign." Lukas declined to speculate on Honour and Glory's next start, but said the colt will start in the GI Santa Anita Derby April 6.

OBS STAKES CLOSE MONDAY Nominations for three of the seven OBS Week of Champions stakes, to be run Monday, March 18, close tomorrow, March 4. Closing Monday are the \$35,000 Florida Breeders' Distaff S., for fillies and mares at a mile and a sixteenth; the inaugural \$25,000 Florida Thoroughbred Charities S., for three-year-olds going five furlongs and restricted to offspring of stallions whose seasons have been offered to the 1996 Charity Auction held at OBS and the silent auction at the Ramada Inn; and the \$10,000 SunTrust Starter H., for four-year-olds and up who have started for a claiming price of \$7,500 or less in 1995-96 going a mile and a sixteenth. The Ocala Breeders' Championship Stakes, four races restricted to three-year-old OBS graduates which offer a total of \$300,000 in purses, have already closed, but supplemental nominations will be accepted at the time of entry. Entries for the Week of Champions card, to be held the day before the start of the Ocala Selected Two-Year-Old-In-Training Sale, will be taken March 11.

SUFFOLK DOWNS SNOWED OUT Suffolk Downs ran two races Saturday before heavy snow forced the cancellation of the remainder of the card. Simulcasting continued as scheduled at the East Boston oval, and rain checks were issued for future admission, parking and programs. Live racing is expected to resume this afternoon, with first post at 12:45 p.m. Saturday's Floyd Duncan S. has been rescheduled for March 17.

Making his first start in more than three months, Ide was bet down to 2-5 but had to battle for his sixth consecutive victory.
