CIGAR'S BAR SHOES REMOVED Three days after trainer Bill Mott put a specially built pair of bar shoes on reigning Horse of the Year **Cigar** (Palace Music), he had them removed. "He was having problems with them," Mott said Wednesday. "So we took them off last night. He worked a lot better this morning--he's 90 percent--and he went a lot better this morning than he went yesterday with them on." The six-year-old galloped a mile and a half yesterday morning at Gulfstream with assistant trainer Ralph Nicks aboard. Mott originally said he thought Cigar would breeze this Saturday, but that plan is not definite. "We'll see," was Mott's response when asked about Saturday's work. Meanwhile, Nicks confirmed that the March 27 Dubai World Cup is still a big possibility for the champion. "He missed a little time before (last year's) Hollywood Gold Cup and was able to handle it," Nicks said. "If he is back on track this weekend, I don't think it will be a big issue. If he is not back on track this weekend, it might be another story." If all goes well, Cigar will leave for Dubai March 16.

KEENELAND CATALOGS 230 TWO-YEAR-OLDS FOR APRIL SALE Keeneland's fourth annual April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, to be held Tuesday, April 16, 1996, has attracted 230 juveniles. Two "preview days" will be held leading up to the auction. Beginning at 10:30 a.m. both April 8 and 15, sales horses will gallop or breeze through the Keeneland stretch. Among those catalogued are a half-brother by High Brite to 1982 Horse of the Year Conquistador Cielo; a half-sister by Summer Squall to champion Law Society; a filly by Gulch out of Champion Older Mare Track Robbery; a half-brother by Forty Niner to Grade I winner Quiet American; a half-brother by Capote to GSW French Deputy; and a half-brother by Deputy Minister to Grade I-winning millionairess Top Corsage. The first three April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sales at Keeneland have produced 38 stakes winners, including 1995 Kentucky Derby winner **Thunder Gulch** (Gulch) and 1995 Kentucky Oaks winner **Gal in a Ruckus** (Bold Ruckus). Other stakes-winners from the first three auctions include **Evansville Slew** (Slew City Slew), **Jambalaya Jazz** (Dixieland Band), **Lake George** (Vice Regent), **Smilin Singin Sam** (Smile), **Supremo** (Gone West) and **Twice the Vice** (Vice Regent).

SANTA MARGARITA INVITATIONAL H.-GI, \$300,000, 4yo/up, f/m, 1 1/8m

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas neither confirmed nor denied that last year's Champion Three-Year-Old Filly **Serena's Song** (Rahy) will run in the Santa Margarita. The four-year-old, who finished seventh against the boys in last Saturday's GI Santa Anita H., would be making her second start in eight days if she runs Sunday. "That's way premature," Lukas said yesterday when asked if **Serena's Song** will run in the Santa Margarita. "We're just getting her back galloping. We won't make a decision until Friday." Probables for the race include **Jewel Princess** (Key to the Mint), **Twice the Vice** (Vice Regent), **Sleep Easy** (Seattle Slew), **Top Rung** (Seattle Slew), **British Bauble** (Kris S.) and **Biltmore Breeze** (Saratoga Six).

CROWN ROYAL PAN AMERICAN H.-GII, \$300,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/2mT

HELMSMAN GETS TIME OFF Helmsman (El Gran Senor), fourth as the 5-2 favorite in last Saturday's GI Santa Anita H., suffered a displaced soft palate during the race and will require some time off, trainer Wally Dollase said yesterday. Dollase added that he hopes to have the GI Strub S. winner back to full speed in time for the \$1 million Hollywood Gold Cup (GI) June 30.

KENTUCKY OAKS ATTRACTS 136 NOMINEES

A Kentucky Oaks record purse of \$500,000 has helped to attract a banner list of 136 nominees to the three-year-old filly classic, to be held Friday, May 3. The Grade I race is the second largest attended day in Thoroughbred racing in the U.S., behind only Kentucky Derby day. This year's nomination total surpasses 1995's 126 and represents the largest since 1991, when 139 fillies were made eligible. The record, 191, was established in 1986 and tied the following year. Four of the top six highweights on the 1995 Experimental Free Handicap are Oaks nominated: **My Flag** (Easy Goer), **Cara Rafaela** (Quiet American), **Antespend** (Spend a Buck) and **Birr** (Farma Way). In addition, the nominees for the 1996 Early Times Triple Turf Series are in, and a record 158 horses have been made eligible. Inaugurated in 1993, the Early Times Triple Turf Series includes three of America's most prestigious turf events for ages three and up: the GI Early Times Turf Classic at Churchill Downs May 4; GI Early Times Dixie at Pimlico May 18; and GI Early Times Manhattan at Belmont June 8.

MILLKOM SET FOR COMEBACK

Millkom (GB) (Cyrano de Bergerac), a MG1 winner in France before coming to the U.S. to win last September's GI Man o' War S. at Belmont Park, is taking his first steps back to the races after suffering a leg injury which kept him out of the Breeders' Cup. The five-year-old turf runner was trained up to the Man o' War by Claude Rouget. After his Belmont win, owner Gary Tanaka transferred the horse to the barn of the late Rodney Rash. The horse is now training toward his comeback in the Payson Park barn of trainer Bill Mott. A spokesman for Mott said, "Millkom has been in light work for around three weeks, perhaps a little longer. There is no pressure to get him back. But that's the idea and, if things go well, he should be ready for some faster exercise in about a month."

THOROUGHBRED AND HARNESS HORSEMEN REACH AGREEMENT IN ONTARIO

Following a meeting at Woodbine Racetrack yesterday, members of the Ontario Harness Horse Association (OHHA) and the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA) announced they had reached agreement on several important issues. Thoroughbred racing in Southern Ontario will take place Thursday evenings from the beginning to the end of the 1996 Thoroughbred season, which opens March 23 at Woodbine. In addition, both horsemen's groups have agreed to run 12 hours a day of combo cards at all of The Ontario Jockey Club tracks. The 12-hour period of racing will include six hours each of live racing and simulcast racing, subject to product availability. In the period between afternoon and evening racing, two signals (one Thoroughbred and one Harness) will be introduced. Total revenue from the two "bridge signals" will be split on a 50-50 basis. The split in revenue from the combo cards will be on a breed-to-breed basis, with the OHHA collecting revenue from Standardbred racing and the HBPA revenue from Thoroughbred racing. "I am extremely encouraged by the fact that the two horsemen's groups and The Ontario Jockey Club were able to work together to provide our fans with a greater variety of quality product throughout the afternoon and evening," said David Willmot, president and CEO of the OJC. The agreements reached at the meeting are subject to Ontario Racing Commission approval.

FIRST HOLY BULL FOALS ARRIVE

The first two foals by 1994 Horse of the Year **Holy Bull** (Great Above) arrived within hours of each other at Jonabell Farm in Lexington, Ky. The first to arrive was a half-sister to 1993 Champion Two-Year-Old Filly **Phone Chatter** (Phone Trick) out of **Passing My Way** (Pass The Glass), who was foaled March 2. Another filly, out of MSW **Second Glance** (Big Burn), arrived March 3. The filly out of Passing Way is owned by a partnership. Second Glance, a stakes winner in New York, is owned by Fred Papert, who races under the name of Sugartown Stables.

BROAD BRUSH FULLY RECOVERED

Graham J. Beck's Gainesway announced yesterday that **Broad Brush** (Ack Ack), the Leading Sire of 1994, has made a full recovery from colic surgery last year. "The first four mares bred to Broad Brush this year have been tested in foal," said Michael Hernon of Gainesway. "Broad Brush looks and feels great. We are delighted with him." The 13-year-old stallion stands for a 1996 fee of \$25,000.
