IMPERIAL CALL TAKES CHELTENHAM GOLD CUP

Imperial Call (Ire) (Callernish {GB}) gave Ireland its first Cheltenham Gold Cup victory in 10 years with a brilliant display of jumping Thursday. The seven-year-old gelding, trained in County Cork by Fergie Sutherland, took his time making a move. But, once eased into the lead by jockey Conor O'Dwyer with six of the 22 fences still to jump, he was never troubled to win by four lengths from **Rough Quest (Ire)** (Crash Course {GB}). Hot favourite **One Man (Ire)** (Remainder Man {GB}) threatened to take a hand in the finish under Britain's reigning champion jump rider Richard Dunwoody, but he did not appear to stay the extended three-and-a-quarter miles and faded tamely in the closing stages to finish sixth of the seven to complete the race in a field of 10. Sutherland, a 64-year-old Korean war veteran, was overwhelmed by the loud and excited welcome his stable star received from the huge Irish contingent which always assembles for the three-day Cheltenham Festival. He said, "I've felt he was a Gold Cup horse since he was five. He jumped like a buck today and I reckon he rather enjoyed his afternoon's work. It would be marvelous to think he could come back and win it again next year."

DANEWIN IN DUBAI BREEZE

Danewin (Aus) (Danehill) did his first serious work in preparation for the \$4 million Dubai World Cup, jointly sponsored by Emirates Airline and Al Naboodah Group, over the Nad Al Sheba turf Friday. Breezing in company with stablemate **Matelot (Riverman)**, trainer Bob Thomsen clocked the Australian champ going a mile in 1:42, with the last three furlongs in :38. "That's just what he needed," said Thomsen. "He's a very big eater and has been doing very well since his arrival; he settled in like he's been here all his life. I'm very pleased with him and the times were good on turf which was cutting up. I plan to give him another hit out next Monday, and at the moment everything is going as planned."

Thoro-Graph Analysis

Today's Florida Derby is a very strong race, with several contenders having already run Grade I level Thoro-Graph figures. From a betting point of view, it's interesting because of the three favorites, **Louis Quatorze** (Sovereign Dancer) is a few lengths too slow going in, and **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled) has a weak pattern.

When horses run an enormous race off a layoff, they sometimes react dramatically, or tail off. Unbridled's Song ran a lifetime best figure (4 1/2) in his seasonal debut, then went back a couple of points in the Fountain of Youth, just as Talkin Man did last year when he put in a huge effort for the Gotham but ran a slower figure in the Wood Memorial. Unbridled's Song looks ready for a bad race at a short price.

Cobra King (Farma Way) also ran a lifetime top (5) in his seasonal debut, but trainer Mike Puype has wisely given him eight weeks to recover from the stress. He is clearly the most likely winner, and since we don't like two of the favorites, we'll look for value in exactas. The Thoro-Graph play is a box of **Cobra King**, **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) and **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner), doubling up with **Cobra King** on top. *The Thoro-Graph handicapper's line offers analyses and suggested plays for six major tracks daily. THREE CHIMNEYS TO HOST CAMP FOR JOURNALISTS

The journalists will spend time with the stallions, broodmares and yearlings, and will also be offered "electives" in Sales Preparation, Office Operations, Veterinary Operations, Equine Surgery, Maintenance/Equipment, Mating Services and Farrier. "Camp Three Chimneys" will also coincide with the Keeneland Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale April 16. "We'll equip writers who want to see a foaling with a beeper to alert them to any mares foaling on the farm, we'll send them on the van to an off-the-farm breeding shed...they'll really get a feel for what goes on here," said General Manager Dan Rosenberg. Patton, who ended his four-year-old season with a sixth-place finish in this event last year, was winless since taking a Gulfstream allowance event in January, 1995, but had shown signs of life in his last two starts. Beaten only a neck when second in his return after nearly 11 months on the bench, the five-year-old came back to finish a rallying third in the six-furlong Deputy Minister H. last out. The dark bay was overlooked at the windows stretching out, but the added distance did the trick; rated midpack through opening fractions of :21.92 and :44.30, Patton found room to run in the stretch and came on under jockey Robbie Davis for his first graded stakes score. **MEADOW MONSTER** (Meadowlake), the 4-5 choice bidding for his fifth straight, was bounced around at the start, rushed up to reach contention at the top of the stretch, then faded in the drive to finish sixth. Robert Shepard and Sebastien Farms' **Dixie Poker Ace** (Patriotically) became the all-time leading Louisiana-bred money earner with a rallying victory in Friday's 10th race at the Fair Grounds. The nine-year-old scored a half-length win in the mile starter allowance event on the grass, and the \$12,600 winner's share of the purse boosted his career earnings to \$848,326, passing the old mark of \$841,270 set by GI Super Derby winner Free Spirit's Joy, who was retired last year. Dixie Poker Ace was trained by the late Archie Sebastien until March, 1995, and is now handled by Archie's son, Tim; purchased by Sebastien for \$800 as a two-year-old, he has now won 27 of his 85 lifetime starts.
