### DARE AND GO OUT OF DUBAI WORLD CUP

Dare And Go (Alydar), winner of the 1995 GI Strub S. and most recently victorious in the March 6 The Wicked North S. at Santa Anita, was due to fly from California to Dubai Wednesday, but did not make the journey. The decision to withdraw the five-year-old from the March 27 Dubai World Cup was made Tuesday after the horse suffered an injury to his left hind ankle. "Dare And Go is only 15 percent better and I do not feel it is fair to the horse or his connections to ship him to Dubai," said trainer Richard Mandella yesterday. "It is regrettable that Dare And Go won't be able to participate in the Dubai World Cup, but I am honored that he had the quality to be invited." With Dare And Go's defection, the Dubai World Cup field has been reduced to 12. In other news surrounding the \$4 million race, another Mandella trainee, **Soul of the Matter** (Private Terms), landed at Dubai International Airport at 8 a.m. (Dubai time) Wednesday. The GII San Antonio S. runner-up arrived at the International Quarantine Centre at 9 a.m. **Cigar** (Palace Music) cantered steadily over 1½-miles at Nad Al Sheba yesterday. "He went really well and worked in the same way as he does at home," said Tim Jones, assistant to trainer Bill Mott. "We will go a bit further tomorrow." **L'Carriere** (Carr de Naskra) breezed three furlongs in :38.31, while Australian champion **Danewin** (Aus) (Danehill) covered six furlongs in 1:15.80, going the final three panels in :37.50.

### DUCHOSSOIS & CARROLL POOL RESOURCES

Richard Duchossois, chairman of Arlington International Racecourse, and Jerry Carroll, chairman of Turfway Park, have joined forces to pursue entertainment strategies designed to more efficiently utilize their racetrack plants. The two men announced the formation of a joint venture, DC Enterprises, Ltd., created to develop innovative, non-regulated entertainment attractions that will turn their facilities into year-round operations. "Racetracks simply cannot survive by operating 10 percent of the time that competing gaming facilities do," Carroll said. "The most basic reason Dick and I have gotten together is to find ways to offset track under-utilization, which is driving racing out of business." DC Enterprises, with Duchossois as chairman and Carroll as president and chief executive, constitutes an independent venture and is not a merger. Duchossois observed that, "The future of any business always lies in giving its customers what they want and today's entertainment customer wants more than racing has offered in the past. Jerry and I are listening to our customers."

### Sunday, Santa Anita Park:

#### SAN LUIS REY S.-GI, \$250,000a, 4yo/up, 1 1/2mT

Last year's Champion Turf Male **Northern Spur** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) is questionable for the San Luis Rey, trainer Ron McAnally said Wednesday. "He left a little bit of feed (Tuesday) night, and when a horse leaves feed he's usually trying to tell you something," McAnally said. The five-year-old, who was scratched from the March 9 Pan American H. at Gulfstream after developing a mild case of colic, galloped yesterday and appeared to be okay, according to his trainer, who said, "Right now he doesn't seem like he has a care in the world. I'm a little more concerned than he seems to be. We'll watch him closely the next couple of days and then decide." In his only start this year, Northern Spur was fourth in the GII San Luis Obispo H. Feb. 19. **Windsharp** (Lear Fan), the five-year-old mare who beat the boys in the San Luis Obispo, will take on her male counterparts once again in the San Luis Rey. She worked six furlongs in 1:14 1/5 at Hollywood Park yesterday in preparation for the assignment. Also pointing to the Grade I race are **Flying Marfa** (Marfa), **Wandesta** (GB) (Nashwan), **Special Price** (Bering {GB}), **Silver Wizard** (Silver Hawk) and **Urgent Request** (Ire) (Rainbow Quest). **Big Sky Jim** (Private Terms) is considered possible for the race.

Saturday, March 30, Aqueduct:

**GOTHAM S.-GII, \$200,000, 3yo, 1m**

**Tiger Talk** (Phone Trick), undefeated in three career starts, including a tally in the \$65,900 Bolsa Chica S. March 1 at Santa Anita, will be looking for his fourth straight win when he makes the trip east for the Gotham. "He's a nice colt," said trainer Ron Ellis. "He's bred to sprint and I don't think a one-turn mile will be any problem for him." The Gotham will mark the first time the Southern California-based Ellis has ever shipped a horse to New York to run. **Gold Fever** (Forty Niner), whose last win came in the six-furlong Perpetuate S. at Aqueduct last November, will be shipped from Florida Monday for his engagement in the Gotham, according to Buzzy Tenney, assistant to trainer Shug McGaughey. "Right now, Shug thinks he's a come-from-behind sprinter and the one-turn mile should be right up his alley," Tenney said. Others pointing to the Gotham include **Gentle Inspiration** (Inspired Prospect) and **Feather Box** (Cherokee Colony), while GIII Cherry Hill Mile S. winner **In Contention** (Devil's Bag) will most likely sit out the race and wait for the April 13 Wood Memorial.

**BRITISH TURF ACTION BEGINS TODAY** Britain's 1996 flat-racing season bursts into life today when Doncaster stages the first turf action since last November. The highlight of the seven-race fixture is the Stones Bitter Mile (Listed), in which last year's Newmarket Craven S. third and British 2000 Guineas fifth **Nwaamis** (Dayjur) makes his long-awaited comeback following a pelvic injury. John Dunlop, champion trainer in Britain in 1995, said: "Touch wood he is over his problems and, generally, the team seems in good form." Line-up for the contest, in post position order, is as follows: **Nwaamis**, **Penny Drops** (GB) (Sharpo {GB}), **Star Talent** (Local Talent), **Wijara** (Ire) (Waaajib {Ire}), **Band On The Run** (GB) (Song {GB}), **Cadeaux Tryst** (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) and **First Island** (Ire) (Dominion {GB}). All seven starters will carry 124 pounds.

**MORE TURFWAY WEATHER WOES** For the 15th time since the beginning of the year, Turfway Park has been forced to cancel live racing due to adverse weather conditions. Overnight snowfall precluded racing at the Florence, Kentucky oval Wednesday night. Simulcasting was unaffected by the weather. A forecast calling for warmer temperatures has track officials expecting to resume racing Thursday evening with a first race post time of 7 p.m.

**RETAMA GETS CASH, FILES BANKRUPTCY**

The Retama Park Development Corporation announced yesterday that it has successfully reached an agreement with its bondholders to provide approximately \$1.5 million in funds. This agreement also stipulates, however, that in order for the track to receive that money and continue discussions with prospective buyers, the Retama Park Development Corporation must file under Chapter 9 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code March 20. Retama Park Manager of Reorganization and COO Lee N. Katz said filing for bankruptcy was unfortunate. "However, this was the only way we could receive the cash to continue operations and improve the viability of finding investors or a buyer for the facility." The agreement also guarantees live Thoroughbred racing in 1996, set to begin June 8, and the continuation of simulcast wagering at the facility seven days a week.

**LUKAS TO RUN PAIR IN SANTA ANITA DERBY**

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas said he plans to run both GII San Rafael winner **Honour and Glory** (Relaunch) and Santa Catalina S. winner **Prince of Thieves** (Hansel) in the \$1 million Santa Anita Derby Saturday, April 6. "It's a million bucks and it's right in our backyard," Lukas said. "We're leaning toward running them both." Prince of Thieves finished fourth at 2-5 odds in Sunday's GII San Felipe S., but lost his best chance after getting off a step slow then being squeezed back at the break. Honour and Glory worked a mile in 1:40 1/5 at Santa Anita Monday. Lukas added that **Dr. Caton** (Seattle Slew), who romped to a 6 1/2-length maiden victory Sunday at Santa Anita, will probably be shipped out of town for his next start. Others pointing to the GI Santa Anita Derby include San Rafael third-place finisher **Matty G** (Capote) and **Odyle** (Alleged), upset winner of Sunday's San Felipe S.

**JOCKEYS' GUILD TO FORM LABOR UNION**

The Jockeys' Guild will form a national labor union, it was announced at a special membership meeting of the Guild held in Hollywood, Florida March 5. Some 400 members overwhelmingly voted either in person or by proxy in support of unionization. According to the Guild's National Manager John Giovanni, the Guild seeks to "organize jockeys throughout the United States into a national labor organization for their mutual betterment, protection and advancement and to regulate and improve the working conditions, safety, compensation and health insurance available to all jockeys."

**BOSRA SHAM PREPARES FOR THREE-YEAR-OLD DEBUT** Ten-time British champion trainer Henry Cecil plans to give **Bosra Sham** (Woodman), the early favorite for this year's British 1000 Guineas, her first start of 1996 in the G3 Fred Darling S. at Newbury April 19. Bosra Sham, undefeated in two starts at two including the G1 Fillies Mile at Ascot last September, stepped up into stronger exercise about two weeks ago and is scheduled to be given another preparatory workout this morning. Cecil said, "She has been moving well and I am very pleased with her. No plan has definitely been made, but I hope to start her off in the Fred Darling. It would enable her to get away from Newmarket and she would not have to carry a penalty (for her Ascot success). She is already very well in herself." Latest betting on the 1000 Guineas (to be run at Newmarket May 5) is: 5-2 Bosra Sham, 7-2 **Blue Duster** (Danzig), 10-1 **Bint Shadayid** (Nashwan), 20-1 **Bint Salsabil** (Nashwan) and **Miss Tahiti (Ire)** (Tirol {Ire}), 25-1 others.

**PACKING IT IN?** Harvey Pack, host of the New York Racing Association's television replay show *Thoroughbred Action*, has accepted a buyout offer and may soon be off the air. As of April 1, Pack will no longer be a NYRA employee. His future now rests with SportsChannel, the cable network that airs the show. Pack currently receives no compensation from SportsChannel, but will be able to stay on the air if it picks up his appearance fees. "As of April 1, he won't be a NYRA employee, but he may be a SportsChannel employee," said NYRA Vice President Steve Crist. "Everyone wants Harvey to keep doing the replay show and if something can be worked out with SportsChannel, he'll stay on."

**AVERAGE UP AS OBS CONCLUDES** The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's March Open Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale in Ocala ended on a positive note yesterday. Wednesday's second and final session saw 121 juveniles sold for a gross of \$5,237,000 and an average of \$43,281, up 14.3 percent from last year's second session average of \$37,874. Yesterday's highest price of \$165,000 was paid for **Copper Sunset**, a chestnut filly by Diesis (GB)--Galletto (Nijinsky II). The half-sister to two stakes-winners, including G1 Irish St. Leger hero Authaal (Shergar), turned in two of the longer breezes during the sale's under-tack shows. She worked three furlongs in :35 flat March 9, and a half-mile in :47 4/5 March 18. Overall, 253 two-year-olds were sold during the two-day auction for a gross of \$9,913,500 and an average of \$39,184, up 5.8 percent from last year's average of \$37,019. "Overall, the sale was satisfying," commented OBS President Tom Chiota. "Several new buyers participated and we almost cracked the \$40,000 average while selling more horses compared to last year."

Another horse headed for Oaklawn, champion **Serena's Song** (Rahy), breezed five furlongs in 1:01 2/5 Monday at Santa Anita in preparation for the GI \$500,000 Apple Blossom H. April 12.

Big 'Cap runner-up **Luthier Fever** (Mt. Livermore) is likely to remain at Santa Anita for the \$150,000a San Bernardino H. (GII) March 30, trainer Ted West said yesterday. The five-year-old will also be nominated to the \$750,000 Oaklawn H. (GI) April 6. "The weights will have some bearing on whether we stay here or go to Oaklawn," West said. "But for the simple reason there's some important races coming up in California, we'd just as soon stay here." **Del Mar Dennis** (Dixieland Band), winner of the San Bernardino in '94 and '95, will be trying for an unprecedented third straight victory in the race, to be contested at 1 1/8-miles.
