### HOLLYWOOD, BOOMTOWN ANNOUNCE

**POSSIBLE MERGE** Hollywood Park, Inc. and the Reno, Nevada-based Boomtown, Inc. announced that they have entered into a Letter of Intent providing for the merger of the two companies. Under the terms of the agreement, each share of Boomtown common stock will be converted into .625 shares of Hollywood Park common stock and the 11-member Hollywood Park board of directors will include four members from the current Boomtown board. The completion of the merger is subject to the approval of the Board of Directors of both companies as well as stockholder and regulatory approvals. The transaction, which would create a company with five casinos in four states and three race-tracks in three different states, is expected to close in the fourth quarter of this year. "This merger will be a landmark step in furthering our goal of making Hollywood Park a leading national gaming, sports and entertainment company and will afford our shareholders many benefits," said R.D. Hubbard, CEO of Hollywood Park.

**PENNEKAMP OUT OF WORLD CUP** The field for the March 27 Dubai World Cup was reduced to 11 yesterday when **Pennekamp** (Bering {GB}), hero of last year's 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, was withdrawn. The colt has been suffering from a splint injury and trainer Andre Fabre announced that the injury has recently been aggravated. ### PIMLICO ANNOUNCES NEW DATE FOR

**PREAKNESS DRAW** Pimlico Race Course officials announced yesterday that there will be a new date for the 1996 GI Preakness S. and GI Early Times Dixie post-position draws. The post-position draws for both races, which will be run Saturday, May 18, will be conducted Wednesday, May 15. The draws will be held in the Pimlico Sports Palace at approximately 5:30 p.m. "The popularity of the post-position draw has grown dramatically," Pimlico President and C.E.O. Joseph A. DeFrancis said. "This change certainly enhances the Preakness and Early Times draws."

**HIALEAH PURSES DECLINE** Since Federal Judge Lenore Nesbitt signed a restraining order Monday preventing Hialeah from sending its simulcast signal out of state, purses at the South Florida track have been declining. For Wednesday's card, the first written after the court order, purses totaled \$88,520 for nine live races. Thursday's card listed eight live races with a total purse value of \$75,900. Friday's overnight listed eight live races worth \$73,400, and carried a warning that if Hialeah lost the simulcasting court case the daily purse average would drop to \$57,500 for eight live races. The court hearing was scheduled for yesterday.

**OJC GETS ADDED DATES** The Ontario Racing Commission has extended the Ontario Jockey Club's Thoroughbred schedule, which was supposed to end Dec. 6 but will now conclude Dec. 14. The OJC had applied earlier this year to extend the season to Dec. 31 at the recommendation of the local Thoroughbred association. However, the local harness racing association opposed the idea and it was left to the ORC to rule on the contentious matter. The ORC recently approved a plan to change the Thoroughbred schedule from Thursday afternoon to Thursday evening. The 1996 OJC schedule is set to start Saturday.

**DAZZLING FALLS INJURED** Dazzling Falls (Taylor's Falls), winner of last year's GI Arkansas Derby, Remington Park Derby and Alabama Derby, came out of his third-place finish in Saturday's GI Razorback H. at Oaklawn with a filling in his right ankle. "The X-rays taken Tuesday of Dazzling Falls were negative," said his trainer Chuck Turco. "We have scheduled an ultrasound. There is a little swelling, but the horse is in no pain. We have a problem. I just don't want to make too big a deal of it until we learn the extent of the injury. We have gone through this before with him and it turned out to be a strain."

**WORLD CUP WORKS** Trainer H. James Bond arrived in Dubai yesterday and watched as his Dubai World Cup hopeful L'Carriere (Carr de Naskra) was schooled in the paddock and then cantered 14 furlongs. Bond said, "L'Carriere looks tremendous and I couldn't be happier with the way his preparation has gone." The five-year-old gelding is scheduled to work under the floodlights Saturday morning. **Lively Mount (Jpn)** (Green Mount) worked 6½ furlongs Thursday morning and was clocked in :38 for his final three furlongs. He is expected to work again Sunday. **Needle Gun (Ire)** (Sure Blade) breezed six furlongs Thursday, covering the last three furlongs in :42. **Soul of the Matter** (Private Terms), who arrived in Dubai Wednesday morning, had his first outing on the Nad Al Sheba course when he jogged 10 furlongs. **Cigar** (Palace Music) cantered 14 furlongs.

### CHURCHILL DOWNS HOME WAGERING

**EXPERIMENT EXTENDED** The nation's first interactive home wagering system, developed by On Demand Services (ODS), began being tested last August in over 300 homes in Louisville, Kentucky. The experiment, which allows consumers to watch and bet on up to 60 races a day from tracks across the country, is being conducted by ODS in conjunction with Churchill Downs and TKR Cable of Greater Louisville. The results through Dec. 31 show that the trial participants overwhelmingly approve of the in-home wagering system. The results were encouraging enough for Churchill Downs and ODS to request and receive from the Kentucky Racing Commission Thursday an extension of the test through Churchill's live Spring Meet, which runs from April 27 through June 30. The ODS system smoothly handled over \$1 million in wagers in its first three months, and nearly 60 percent of the betting was accounted for by customers who were categorized as moderate or infrequent track attendees. "We have been and will continue to be focused on creating a first-class product that is exciting and attractive to people who don't generally pay attention to horse racing," said Churchill Downs Senior VP of Planning and Development Jeff Smith. "Our challenge is to create new fans, and interactive home wagering will only be meaningful if we accomplish that goal."

### NORTHERN SPUR OUT OF SAN LUIS REY

Trainer Ron McAnally yesterday officially declared **Northern Spur (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) out of Sunday's G1 San Luis Rey S. at Santa Anita, and said the Eclipse Award-winning turf horse will also miss the G1 San Juan Capistrano H. April 21. McAnally said the five-year-old hasn't eaten all of his grain the last few days, and he doesn't want to take a chance with a horse who might not have all of his strength for a 1½-mile race. "He jogged again today and he's feeling pretty good," McAnally said Thursday. "But he's been gorging on alfalfa and missing some of his grains, and the grains are much more important." It would be very difficult to bring Northern Spur up to the San Juan Capistrano on works alone, McAnally said, adding that the Breeders' Cup Turf winner probably won't race until the Hollywood Park Spring/Summer Meeting.

### STEVENS DRAWS FAVORITE IN "GREAT MATCH RACE"

Jockeys Julie Krone and Gary Stevens drew their mounts yesterday for Saturday's "Great Match Race" at Santa Anita. Krone will ride the even-money proposition **Richard of England** (Tri Jet), while Stevens has the call on 2-5 favorite **Busy Banana (GB)** (Insan). "We'll make this rule," Krone said with a chuckle. "If I beat him, that means girls are better than boys. If he beats me, he was on the best horse." Stevens was happy with his position in the 1 1/16-mile event. "She's in big trouble," he said. "Speed on the rail. Gotta love it." The \$40,000 race will be run as a Special Event between the fifth and sixth races, with win betting only.

### PENTIRE TEAM BOOSTED BY FIRST VICTORY

Connections of **Pentire (GB)** (Be My Guest) were given a wonderful boost in Britain's opening listed race of 1996 when **First Island (Ire)** (Dominion {GB}) cruised home ahead of **Wijara (Ire)** (Waajib {Ire}) and favorite **Nwaamis** (Dayjur) in yesterday's Stones Bitter Doncaster Mile. First Island had been operating as lead horse for Dubai World Cup hope Pentire before the Geoff Wragg-trained four-year-old was flown to the Middle East and, not surprisingly, jockey Michael Hills was pleased to see this result. He said, "It's obviously a good sign and Mr. Wragg and myself will be flying to Dubai Saturday with extra hope now. Pentire handles the Nad Al Sheba course really well and did a nice piece of work Monday. We know Cigar will be hard to beat, but we'll give him a tough race. I think there will be plenty of pace in Dubai. I hope so, because I want to come late on Pentire."

### KAMMTARRA ENTERS EPSOM DERBY

**PICTURE** Kammtarra (Zilzal), a half-brother to last year's Derby hero Lammtarra, has been added to the list of acceptors for this season's Epsom classic. The unraced colt, originally called Earth Shaker, was trained as a juvenile by Michael Stoute in Newmarket. He is now with the Godolphin team in Dubai and that move, combined with the name change, caused his omission from the list released earlier this month. Paul Khan, a director of the Jockey Club's secretariat Weatherbys, stated: "As there was no yearling engagement in the race for a horse under the name Kammtarra--only the one for Earth Shaker--he was omitted. That change has been noted and a correction made." The addition of the Godolphin colt means there are now a total of 150 horses eligible for the Epsom Derby. **JOCKEY CLUB ADDENDUM** The stewards of the Jockey Club have approved the addition of a new subsection to the Principal Rules and Requirements of The American Stud Book relating to the good standing of owners and breeders in matters concerning registration with the organization. The new rule allows the Jockey Club to decline to process materials received from members with outstanding fees owed.

### CHURCHILL DOWNS ANNOUNCES RECORD

**1995 RESULTS** Churchill Downs Inc. yesterday announced record earnings and revenue for fiscal year 1995, which ended Dec. 31. The figures were reported as part of the quarterly meeting of the Board of Directors. The Company reported net income of \$6.2 million, or \$1.64 per share, compared to \$6.1 million, or \$1.63 per share, in 1994. Revenues for fiscal year 1995 were \$92.4 million, an increase of 39 percent over the previous year's \$66.4 million. "In 1995, Churchill Downs presented the most competitive racing in the history of the racetrack," said President and CEO Thomas H. Meeker. In other action, Meeker was among four directors, including Charles W. Bidwill Jr., Carl F. Pollard and Darrell R. Wells, who were nominated for reelection as Class III directors to serve terms of three years.
