COBRA KING ARRIVES IN KENTUCKY Cobra King (Farma Way) arrived in Louisville Thursday morning and seems to be adjusting to the drastic change in temperature, according to trainer Mike Puype. "This is the coldest weather I've been around," said Puype, a 29-year-old native of Arizona. "I wanted to get here and give my horse time to get acclimated. He seems to be responding well to the temperature. When I walked him (Friday) morning, he was kicking and bucking and carrying on." Eighth as the favorite in the GI Florida Derby March 16, the colt could try to redeem himself in the GII Jim Beam March 30, but is likely to await the Toyota Blue Grass April 13. "Depending on the week he has, the Beam is possible," said Puype. "We'll measure the race and the timing of it to the Derby. Right now, the Blue Grass is a little better for us."

NATIONAL GETS AGA BACKING The Curragh's G1 National S. is to become the richest unrestricted juvenile event in Britain or Ireland following news that the Aga Khan's Irish Studs will support the race for a minimum of three years. This seven-furlong contest--to be run this year on September 21--is to have its value doubled and will be worth Ir£200,000 (\$300,000 plus) and is now set to attract the very best of European two-year-olds. The Aga Khan, whose colt Manntari captured the National Stakes in 1993, said: "Three generations of my family have been associated with Irish racing and it is as a tribute to that happy association that I wish to sponsor the race." Subsequent classic winners El Gran Senor, Law Society, Storm Bird and Roberto have all taken the Curragh event, which will now be called the Aga Khan Studs National Stakes and will figure on the undercard for the Irish St. Leger.

WOODBINE OPENS TODAY Woodbine will celebrate its 40th season of racing when it opens for the 1996 meet today. A total of \$38,250,000 in overnight purses and an additional \$20,000,000 in stakes races will be offered, including the first running of the Breeders' Cup Championship outside of the U.S., set for Saturday, October 26. The stakes program kicks off with this afternoon's \$43,800 Thorncliffe H., headed by Highland Vixen (Highland Ruckus). Woodbine will be open for racing Wednesdays through Sundays as well as holiday Mondays, with night racing Wednesdays and Thursdays; the extended meet closes December 14.

THORO-GRAPH ANALYSIS By Jerry Brown

With five horses in the field eligible to win, this looms a top betting race. One major player is **Semoran** (Phone Trick), who has been posting sharp figures in California since returning to action in December and earned a lifetime best 8 taking the Foster City S. at Bay Meadows last out. Three-year-olds often put in big races back-to-back; the speedster looks tough from the rail.

Devil's Honor (Devil's Bag) took the Great West S., the event's traditional prep race, and is the morning-line choice. His figures are the best in the field, with a 6 ½ in each of his last two starts, but after two straight top efforts, could be ready for less than his best, and is chancy at a short price. Watch for him next time out.

Connecting Terms (Private Terms), purchased by Prestonwood Farm last December on our recommendation after winning for a \$50,000 tag at Laurel, proceeded to make us look less than astute by running off the board in his first two starts under new colors. But trainer Elliot Walden then found that the colt was suffering from a lung infection, and since getting treated for the ailment he has run back-to-back seconds in stakes company. He looks ready to jump up another notch, and is the Thoro-Graph play for this race. *The Thoro-Graph handicapper's line offers analyses and suggested plays for six major tracks daily. DUBAI UPDATE Soul of the Matter (Private Terms), who arrived in Dubai Wednesday morning, had his first canter at Nad Al Sheba yesterday, prepping for the \$4 million Dubai World Cup. "The horse looks great and he traveled over here really well," said trainer Richard Mandella. "He's a kind horse and is always happy wherever he goes. He has no problems with the track and went through it really well." L'Carriere (Carr de Naskra) is scheduled for a breeze under the floodlights this morning. Danewin (Aus) (Danehill) worked in company with stablemate Matelot (Riverman) yesterday, going nine furlongs in 1:58.4 with the last three-eighths in :36.8. "The track condition is not worrying him one iota...he is improving and is going the way he should be before a \$4 million race," said trainer Bob Thomsen. A 50-percent interest in the Australian champ has been sold to an Arab partnership, and the colt will be retired to stud after the World Cup. Danewin will stand at Emirates Park in New South Wales, Australia.

KEENELAND SALE ON SATELLITE Keeneland's fourth annual April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale will be televised live via satellite Tuesday, April 16. The sale, which starts at 1:30 p.m., will be shown on Telestar 402R/Channel 18. "We're doing this for the convenience of horsemen throughout the country," said Jim Williams, director of publicity at Keeneland. "Anyone with a satellite dish will be able to pull down the signal." The 1996 auction has attracted 230 juveniles.

SHIRLEY HEIGHTS BEGINS COVERING Shirley Heights (GB) (Mill Reef), the 1978 Derby winner whose life was twice threatened by colic in January, is due to resume stud duties tomorrow. The 21-year-old stallion underwent two major operations on his intestines, but he has made such a remarkable recovery that Michael Oswald, manager of the Royal Studs at Sandringham in Norfolk, has arranged for a first test mating of 1996 this weekend. Oswald said: "He has made excellent progress and put on about 30 kilos in weight since he came back from Newmarket after the second lot of surgery. He has had three subsequent bouts of colic--we were told he might--but, touch wood, he has very quickly recovered from them." Reaction to antibiotics administered during Shirley Heights' recovery are now Oswald's main concern. He explained: "The horse is in excellent shape physically and I would be very confident of him being capable of covering a full book in 1997. But there is still an outside possibility that he is currently firing blanks, due to the medication and the trauma of surgery, so we'll just see how he gets on this Sunday before going any further."

RECORDS FALL AT TURFWAY With two weeks remaining in Turfway Park's 1996 Winter/Spring Meet, jockey Tony D'Amico has established a new track record for most purse earnings by a rider in a single race meet. Through last Sunday, D'Amico's mounts had earned \$1,030,929, making him the first Turfway jockey ever to exceed \$1 million in a meet. The previous record of \$895,330 was set by Brent Bartram in 1993. D'Amico, 39, is also well in front of the field on his way to a third Turfway riding title. Also looking at a record-breaking season, trainer John Parisella tied a 15-year-old record for most wins in a single meet when he saddled Clamity to win in the seventh race Thursday night. It was Parisella's 31st win of the meeting, tying the previous mark set by Tom Dorris in 1981.

TESTS FOR BIANCOME TEAM Every horse in the Hong Kong stables of Patrick-Louis Biancome is to be drug tested after samples taken from three of the French-born trainer's team were found to contain the prohibited substance Sputolosin. Biancome has been called to face a Royal Hong Kong Jockey Club investigation Monday because a trio of his string, including a comfortable winner and a second, tested positive for the decongestant medication at Sha Tin. Chemists from the Club's security department will now be examining the other 57 horses in the handler's championship-chasing string. Sputolosin is designed to work on the respiratory system and is used by many stables in Hong Kong. But it cannot be administered to a horse within a week of it being due to run in public.

W. T. Young's Overbrook Farm, D. Wayne Lukas and Willie Martinez have won the sixth annual Kentucky Thoroughbred Media Awards as the winningest owner, trainer and jockey in Kentucky for 1995. The awards, given in conjunction with The Jockey Club Information Systems, will be presented at Turfway Park March 30, Jim Beam Day. Young, a native of Lexington, led the owners with 53 victories and topped the standings at Turfway's fall and holiday meetings and Keeneland's fall meet, and tied for first at Churchill's spring meet. Lukas took the trainer's award for the fifth time in six years; he captured 102 races and the titles at Turfway's fall and holiday meets, Churchill's spring meet and Keeneland's fall meet. Martinez, who led the rider standings at Turfway's fall meet, earned the KTM Jockey of the Year by winning 156 races.

Retama's 1996 stakes schedule will offer 21 added-money races worth a total of \$735,000. The program is highlighted by two early-closing stakes for two-year-olds--the \$100,000 El Joven at a mile on the turf September 2, and the \$75,000 La Senorita for fillies going a mile on the grass September 14. Nominations for the two races close April 24. The 1996 Retama meet runs June 8 through September 28, and daily purse distribution, boosted by the track's strong simulcasting handle, will be approximately \$53,000.

Britain's bookmakers have removed **Coldstream (GB)** (Shareef Dancer) from the early betting on the 2000 Guineas after reports from Dubai that the colt has a leg injury and is expected to miss the Newmarket classic May 4. Coldstream figured prominently in the winter 2000 Guineas market following a two-race juvenile campaign for trainer Luca Cumani which ended with a win by a length and a half in a Newcastle maiden event last August. He was subsequently purchased by the Godolphin team and transferred to Dubai along with the rest of their hopefuls for 1996. But it has now been revealed that the bay is unlikely to reappear for some time due to his setback.
