CIGAR RESTING ON HIS LAURELS It was a justifiably tired Cigar that greeted Bill Mott yesterday morning when the trainer arrived at the quarantine barn at Nad Al Sheba racetrack in Dubai. Mott will give his superstar a few more days to relax before he begins the 6,500-mile journey back to Belmont Park Sunday. "He's tired," said Mott. "I suppose everything was compounded by the trip, the race and all the activities. He's certainly not jumping around this morning." Cigar picked up his 14th straight with a hard-fought half-length victory over **Soul of the Matter** (Private Terms) in Wednesday's \$4 million Dubai World Cup before an estimated crowd of 15,000. Because he was unsure of what quarantine arrangements must be made once he returns to the U.S., Mott did not know exactly when Cigar would arrive at Belmont Park. Before mapping out an exact schedule, Mott wants to see how Cigar recovers from the arduous journey back and forth to the Middle East and what was a difficult race. But as long as Cigar bounces back within a reasonable period of time, it appears that the globe-trotting horse will race next in the June 30 Hollywood Gold Cup. "If everything works out well, we all know that Hollywood is an important race and there's also Belmont in the fall," Mott said. Cigar could conceivably finish out the year looking to become the first horse to take a second Breeders' Cup Classic. If so, he would end his career at Woodbine, 23 years after Secretariat bowed out with a victory at the same racetrack in the Canadian International.

KRONE TO CALIFORNIA Julie Krone, the winningest female jockey in history, plans to begin riding in Southern California on a permanent basis this fall, according to agent Vince DeGregory. DeGregory said Krone, 32, would begin riding in California the week after the Oct. 26 Breeders' Cup at Woodbine. That would allow her to ride the final week of the Oak Tree meeting and then ride the entire Hollywood Park Autumn meeting. "It's a situation I never expected but it just happened," said DeGregory, who said he would also continue to book mounts for Goncalino Almeida. "She said she's getting antsy to ride out here." DeGregory said he met Krone and her husband, Matthew Muzikar, when the jockey was at Santa Anita last weekend to compete against Gary Stevens in The Great Match Race. "She had an absolute blast, and I think she was taken by the weather, the fans, the purses and just about everything else," DeGregory said, adding that he hadn't met Krone and Muzikar prior to their visit last weekend. Muzikar, it turns out, won the "Vince DeGregory Award" for basketball excellence in 1989 at Saratoga Springs High School. DeGregory is also a graduate of the upstate New York high school.

ARKANSAS HBPA AND OAKLAWN PARK

REACH AGREEMENT The Oaklawn Jockey Club and the Arkansas Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association have entered into a long-term contract intended to preserve and enhance live racing at Oaklawn Park. The term of the agreement is 10 years with an option to renew the same for an additional five-year term. The intent of the parties is that other forms of wagering that Oaklawn might be permitted to offer will not negatively impact purse levels at the track. Oaklawn has agreed to provide purse guarantees and guarantees in the number of days of live racing at the track. In addition, Oaklawn agreed that a portion of the revenues from other such forms of wagering will be used to supplement purses. The Arkansas HBPA, in turn, agreed to support the proposed amendment which would permit other forms of wagering at Oaklawn. It is believed this is the first time horsemen and the track ownership have entered into an agreement concerning the interaction between Thoroughbred racing and casino gambling. Bill Walmsley, president of the Arkansas HBPA, commented, "While this concept is certainly new, we feel it can work to keep Oaklawn a premier racing facility. The horsemen have realistic guarantees and the chance for unprecedented success if the experiment works."

ODYLE TO SKIP SANTA ANITA DERBY There was good news and bad news for GII San Felipe S. winner **Odyle** (Alleged) yesterday. The good news was that the X-rays on the three-year-old colt's left front ankle were negative, and trainer Paco Gonzalez said the entire leg was cool and apparently sound. In fact, Odyle galloped fluidly without medication Thursday morning. The bad news is that he will likely remain in the barn for the \$1 million Santa Anita Derby April 6. The ankle had some heat earlier in the week and Gonzalez said it would make no sense to run such a promising horse under the circumstances. "The leg is clean, but I don't want to push him," said Gonzalez. "He's too nice a horse. It's too bad this happened, especially before such a big race. But it's the right thing to do. There will be plenty of races for him." Gonzalez planned to call co-owner John Toffan in Vancouver yesterday afternoon and recommend the horse be turned out for 60 to 90 days.

TEJANO RUN PROBABLE FOR OAKLAWN

HANDICAP Tejano Run (Tejano) is being pointed to the GI \$750,000 Oaklawn H., to be run Saturday, April 6. Trainer Ken McPeck said, "The Oaklawn Handicap is definitely in our plans, but I won't confirm it officially until I see the weights. Right now he is as good as he has ever been. I am amazed at how well he has come back from all of his problems." Tejano Run, winner of the GII Breeders' Futurity and GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile at two, came back as a three-year-old to finish second in last year's Kentucky Derby and Jim Beam S. and third in the GII Blue Grass S. The chestnut returned to his winning ways in his last start, taking the March 23 Pioneer S. at Turfway Park by two lengths. Others expected for the Oaklawn H. include GI Gulfstream Park H. winner **Wekiva Springs** (Runaway Groom) and Santa Anita H. runner-up **Luthier Fever** (Mt. Livermore).

MARIA'S MON ON COMEBACK TRAIL Last year's Champion Two-Year-Old Colt **Maria's Mon** (Wavering Monarch) is scheduled to arrive at Belmont Park within the next 10 to 14 days and is being readied for a return to the races in May, trainer Rick Schosberg said Thursday. "I saw him a week ago and he looks fantastic," said Schosberg of the MGI winner, who spent the winter at Hart Farm in Ocala, Florida recuperating from surgery to insert screws in his right ankle. "He's been jogging two miles a day and doing some galloping. The preliminary target date is when Belmont opens, but we're going to wait out this next winter storm before bringing him up here."

CLARK'S ATTORNEY DEFENDS 'MISTAKE'

Douglas Otto, the attorney defending former California Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association President Chris Clark on grand theft charges, said yesterday that the allegations made against his client "stem from nothing more than a simple mistake in a business transaction made in a climate in which there are those who would look to exploit it for political gain." Clark was arrested for grand theft March 13 on charges that he overbilled the CHBPA for a directors' liability insurance policy which his Clark Insurance Services purchased for them. That CHBPA board, including Clark, was replaced soon after following a bitter dispute for control of the organization. "The CHBPA was mistakenly invoiced for the incorrect amount, and paid that incorrect amount to Clark Insurance Services," said Otto in a prepared statement. "When Clark Insurance Services independently discovered the mistake, the funds were returned to the CHBPA with no official demand from them or from any other organization. The monies in question had been in the CHBPA's hands for over six months when Chris was arrested. The manner in which this entire matter has been handled by those in charge make it clear than industry politics have played a major role in it."

"He's scheduled to fly into Aqueduct (from Florida) Monday morning," trainer Jim Ryerson said. "We have him set to work Thursday, with (regular jockey) Mike Smith up. He's trained fine since the (March 16) Florida Derby, going two-minute licks."

In Contention (Devil's Bag), winner of the GIII Cherry Hill Mile in his last start March 15, will arrive for the April 13 Wood Memorial on the day of the race, said James Reese, who trains the colt with his wife, Cynthia. "He worked an easy mile at Philadelphia Park Tuesday, going in 1:41 4/5," he said. Jockey Ronald Ardoin won his fourth straight riding title at the recently concluded Fair Grounds meeting. Ardoin, a 38-year-old native of Carencro, Louisiana, capped a season in which he was inducted into the Fair Grounds Racing Hall of Fame with 131 wins from 612 starts and earnings of \$2,112,320 -- believed to be the first time a Fair Grounds rider has eclipsed the \$2 million plateau. Trainer Tom Amoss captured his third straight local training championship and his fifth in the last six years by saddling 42 winners from 176 starts and earnings of \$696,174. Dwight Jones, second in the owners standings for the past two seasons, led the standings this year with 16 wins from 66 starts.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

PEDIGREE SHORTS...North American bloodlines were to the fore in Japanese graded stakes last weekend. The G2 Fuji TV Sho Spring S. went to last year's champion two-year-old **Bubble Gum Fellow (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence--Bubble Company {Fr}, by Lyphard). Sunday Silence has already sired 12 graded stakes winners from his first two crops and six of these are out of Northern Dancer line mares, while another has a third dam by Northern Dancer. Of course, Sunday Silence is by Halo, and both Halo and Northern Dancer are grandsons of Almahmoud. So, almost 60 percent of Sunday Silence's stakes winners to date have a duplication of Almahmoud via Halo and Northern Dancer. Doubtless Sunday Silence has been covering considerable numbers of mares carrying Northern Dancer, but it seems highly unlikely that they have made up 60 percent of his book...**Taiki Fortune** (Seattle Dancer--Patently Clear, by Miswaki), winner of the G3 Mainichi Hai, has an intriguing pedigree with the own-sisters Striking and Busher, and their three-parts sister Busanda, 5x5x5 (all three by War Admiral out of daughters of La Troienne). He is also yet another example of the growing list of horses who combine *Nijinsky II (sire of Seattle Dancer) with Tom Fool, who appears twice in the dam. Taiki Fortune's third dam is Tamerette, dam of Known Fact and Tentam and granddam of Gone West.
