GULFSTREAM SEEKS EXTENDED MEET IN

1997 After attempting unsuccessfully to reach a dates agreement with Hialeah Park, Gulfstream Park announced yesterday that it has applied for a 76-day meeting in 1997. If approved, next year's Gulfstream season will run January 3-March 31, 12 days longer than the 1996 meet; it will overlap the Hialeah meet, which is set for March 17-May 22. The track has notified the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering of its intention to operate 72 regular racing days and four charity days in 1997. Gulfstream President and CEO Douglas Donn had submitted a proposal to Hialeah March 14 which called for an agreement that the two tracks maintain the 1996 schedule, which awarded the winter dates to Gulfstream, for the next three years in exchange for a legislative "cease fire." Hialeah did not respond to the proposal. "If Hialeah executes the three-year agreement, Gulfstream will on April 1 amend its dates application to revert back to its previous request for 63 days," Donn said, but added "Repeated efforts to work with Hialeah for the benefit of the industry have failed."

CIGAR DUE HOME SUNDAY World traveler Cigar (Palace Music) is expected to complete the final leg of his 14,000-mile journey Sunday afternoon, arriving at his barn at Belmont Park by 5:00 p.m., if all goes well. The six-year-old is booked on KLM Flight #641 out of Frankfurt, which is scheduled to arrive at JFK International Airport at 3:35 p.m. Sunday.

TOBA AWARD TO MARTHA AND RICHARD STEPHEN Martha and Richard Stephen, who have been involved in racing for more than 20 years, have been named the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association Owners of the Month for February. The residents of Manhattan Beach, California collected victories in The Bart H. with **Southern Wish** (Lyphard's Wish {Fr}), the GII La Canada with **Jewel Princess** (Key to the Mint) and the GII San Luis Obispo with **Windsharp** (Lear Fan) in February; Stephen runners accounted for four wins, four seconds and two thirds in 12 starts during the month. Richard Stephen acquired his first race horse in 1975, and the \$8,500 claimer went on to win \$300,000 within a year of the purchase. The Stephens currently have 14 horses in training with Wallace Dollase; as February's TOBA Award winners, they will be featured on ESPN's *Racehorse Digest*.

Angel Cordero Jr., who took the Gotham three times as a jockey, will try to pick up his first as a trainer, sending out **Feather Box** (Cherokee Colony) for his second start as a three-year-old. The Buckland Farm runner ended his two-year-old campaign with back-to-back fifth-place finishes in Grade I company, then came back from a five-month layoff to take a six-furlong Aqueduct allowance by four lengths. "I'm nervous, very nervous," said Cordero. "I can't sleep and I get up all the time and call my night watchman to see how the horse is doing. I'm driving him crazy. He said he doesn't want to be the night watchman anymore if this horse goes to the Derby." But Cordero is also realistic about his Derby prospects. "Feather Box has to put up a good race in the Gotham to keep the dream alive," he said. **Gold Fever** (Forty Niner) blew out for the race yesterday, going three-eighths in :39.75. **Appealing Skier** (Baldski) will be scratched from the Gotham, according to trainer Ben Perkins Sr. "With the weather, it doesn't look like it will be the kind of track he favors. Instead, we're looking at either the Bay Shore (April 13) or a race at Keeneland," said Perkins.

SANTA ANITA DERBY NOTES A field of six looks likely to go to the gate for this year's GI Santa Anita Derby, set for April 6. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas will send out **Honour and Glory** (Relaunch) and **Prince Of Thieves** (Hansel); they will be challenged by **Smithfield** (Halo), **Alyrob** (Alysheba), **Matty G** (Capote) and **Cavonnier** (Batonnier). The Charlie Whittingham-trained Smithfield worked five furlongs in 1:00 1/5, handily, yesterday; jockey Kent Desormeaux has picked up the mount. Alyrob also breezed yesterday, going seven-eighths in 1:25.69 before Friday's first race, galloping out the mile in 1:39 2/5 with jockey Rene Douglas in the saddle. **Ready To Order** (Order), who has been on the shelf due to a bruised foot, will miss the race; **Odyle** (Alleged), declared out of the race Thursday, will be sent to Eskay Creek in Bradbury, California for a two-month vacation. Also out of the Santa Anita Derby is **Afleetaffair** (Afleet), who suffered a minor injury yesterday and had to miss a scheduled breeze at Bay Meadows. Freedman is also attempting to be only the second trainer to take the Melbourne Cup and Golden Slipper in the same season after winning the former with **Doriemus (NZ)** (Norman Pentaquad) in November. Danehill has sired the last two winners of the G1 scamper with **Danzero (Aus)** in 1994 and **Flying Spur (Aus)** in 1995, from his first two southern hemisphere crops. His strong hand in this year's event is completed by the colt **Magic of Sydney (Aus)** and the fillies **Dane Ripper (Aus)**, **Precious Glitter (Aus)** and **Cashier (Aus)**.
