SHERGAR'S REMAINS DISCOVERED? Scientists in Ireland hope to determine whether the remains of a horse recently exhumed from a grave in Donegal, Ireland are those of the kidnaped English three-year-old champion **Shergar (Ire)** (Great Nephew {GB}), according to a report in Wednesday's *Times of London*. John Flynn, head of Ireland's Weatherby's blood-typing laboratory in County Kildare told the *Times* that the scientists hoped to extract DNA from the remains and compare the sample with two hairs taken from Shergar by two veterinary students during a visit to his stable while he was still alive. Two years after his 1991 English Derby win, Shergar was stolen from a farm in Ballymany and, despite exhaustive searches, no trace of the horse was ever found. Although a \$3 million ransom was demanded from his owner, the Aga Khan, rumors circulated that the horse was kidnapped by the Irish Republican Army and killed within hours of the theft. According to Wednesday's *Times*, scientists at the lab have been told by "genuine contacts" that they are sure the remains are those of Shergar.

QUEENS PLATE ATTRACTS 139 NOMINEES The 137th running of The Queen's Plate, to be contested Saturday, July 13 at Woodbine, has attracted the nominations of 139 three-year-olds. Among those pointing to the race are **Firm Dancer** (Affirmed), winner of last year's Coronation Futurity, Canada's richest two-year-old stakes race; last year's undefeated Champion Two-Year-Old Filly in Canada **Silken Cat** (Storm Cat); GIII Tropical Park Derby winner **Ok By Me** (With Approval); and **Kristy Krunch** (Varick), winner of last Sunday's Friar Rock S. (GIIC) at Woodbine. For those horses not yet nominated, a supplemental payment of \$15,000 can be made on or before May 15.

ILLINOIS RACING BOARD MEETS The Illinois Racing Board voted Tuesday to turn down Arlington International Racecourse's request to reduce its racing week from six to five days during its upcoming May 12 through Oct. 13 meet. "No persuasive evidence was presented to substantiate Arlington's claim that it will experience a horse shortage this summer," said Board member Lorna Propes, who moved to deny the request. It passed by a 7-0 vote. In another matter, the Board sided with Arlington and voted 6-1 to allow it and the other Illinois tracks to recapture Thoroughbred and harness purse money awarded in 1995. The "recapture clause" is a part of the revised racing law that took effect in June and allows full-card simulcasting from out of state at Illinois tracks. If betting on live races is less than 75 percent of the 1994 amount, tracks are entitled to take back two percent. Thoroughbred and harness horsemen had argued that 1995 was an aberration for three reasons: Arlington had a 55-day meeting instead of its normal 130+ days; Arlington and Sportsman's Park raced five days weekly instead of the Chicago Thoroughbred circuit's traditional six days; and Arlington closed its Peoria off-track betting parlor. "An administrative body is not allowed to circumvent mandates of the legislature, and cannot search for a subtle non-articulated intent of the legislature," said Board Chairman Gary Starkman. Thoroughbred horsemen owe the tracks \$3,016,375 and harness horsemen owe \$1,218,546. Arlington is owed the most -- \$1,928,452.

BEAUCHAMP KING SET FOR RETURN

Beauchamp King (GB) (Nishapour {Fr}), currently quoted as third favorite for the British 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 4, will start next in the G3 Craven S. April 18. The John Dunlop-trained colt won four of five starts at two, including the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster October 21. Success in that race has often translated into future racing glory. G1 King George and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. winner and Irish and English Derby runner-up of 1994 **King's Theatre** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and 1995 French Derby winner **Celtic Swing** (GB) (Damister) both scored victories in the Racing Post Trophy. Marcus Hosgood, racing secretary to Dunlop commented, "We are very pleased with him. The horse has grown and thickened out over the winter and he will run in the Craven S." Hosgood also confirmed that stablemate **Bint Salsabil** (Nashwan) will start in the G3 Nell Gwyn S. "That should tell us if she is a 1000 Guineas filly. The Oaks must be a possibility as her breeding (her dam, Salsabil {Ire}, won the race in 1990) suggests she will get the trip."

PACK HIRED BY SPORTSCHANNEL Television personality Harvey Pack, who accepted a buyout offer from the New York Racing Association in early March, will remain the host of New York racing's replay program after coming to terms with SportsChannel, which carries the show. "It's an act of mercy for Joy Pack," said Pack, referring to his wife. "If we didn't work this out, she'd have to spend all day with me and she doesn't deserve that." Pack, a fan favorite, was a NYRA employee and would not have been able to remain with the show unless SportsChannel stepped in. He said his deal is on a year-to-year basis. There are no current plans for Pack to resume his other duties in Saratoga, which included the hosting of the popular Paddock Club.

CHANGE OF MANAGEMENT AT EQUIBASE The Management Committee of Equibase Company has regretfully accepted the resignation of CEO Richard LeBer, it was announced Wednesday. LeBer, who joined Equibase in 1994, is returning to Atlanta, Georgia, where he formerly worked with the consulting firm of McKinsey & Company Inc. Making the announcement, Management Committee Chairman James E. "Ted" Bassett III said there were no immediate plans to add new resources to the company, established as a partnership between The Jockey Club and the Thoroughbred Racing Associations of North America in 1990. Instead, the Management Committee appointed The Jockey Club's Vice President and Chief Financial Officer Alan Marzelli, who also serves as Treasurer of Equibase, to the position of President on an interim basis.

His close friend and partner, former state senate majority leader Phil Rock, was one of the leaders in the passage of Illinois racing reform bills in the 1970's and 1980's. Although Rock and Garvey were Democrats, former Republican Governor James Thompson appointed Garvey to the Board and he was retained by the current Republican governor, Jim Edgar.
