**KEENELAND OPENS TODAY** Keeneland opens its gates for the 1996 spring meeting this afternoon, offering a record stakes schedule with 16 added-money events, 12 of them graded, over the 15-day meet. Stakes purses total \$2,660,000 for the spring season, which will be highlighted by the \$700,000 Toyota Blue Grass April 13 and the \$500,000a Ashland S. April 20; the track's daily average purse distribution of \$466,433, a 20-percent increase over 1995, is also a Keeneland record. The opening-day feature is the GII Beaumont for three-year-old fillies; there will be at least one stakes a day through the meet. Keeneland will also feature "Breakfast With The Works" Saturday mornings throughout the meet, providing expert commentary on the morning workouts from 8:15-9:00 a.m. The Keeneland spring meeting ends April 26; Mondays, Tuesdays and Easter Sunday, April 7, will be dark days. Post time is set for 1:10 p.m. with the exception of Toyota Blue Grass Day, when the first race will go off at 12:30 p.m.

**UNBRIDLED'S SONG WORKS BIG AT BIG A** Early Kentucky Derby favorite **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled) worked a sparkling six furlongs in 1:10.65 at Aqueduct yesterday morning under jockey Mike Smith as he prepares for the GII Wood Memorial April 13. The work was over two seconds faster than any six furlong race run at Aqueduct yesterday. Clockers caught the colt in fractions of :12.01, :23.56, :35.18, :47.21 and :59.27; he galloped out seven furlongs in 1:22.86. "He went very nicely and comfortably," said trainer Jim Ryerson. "We got what we wanted out of it--he was blowing a little bit, he got a significant work over the track and it put us where we want to be." The three-year-old will have his final work for the Wood next week, going "an easy half-mile."

Jockey Gary Stevens, when asked why he chose to ride GII San Rafael S. winner Honour and Glory in the Santa Anita Derby over Santa Catalina S. winner Prince of Thieves, responded, "Well, they're very difficult to separate. They both had great works last Monday, they're both coming up to the race great, and it was a decision I was hoping I wouldn't have to make so soon. But I did have to make a decision, and I'm confident in the horse I'm on this weekend. But I'm also confident in Prince of Thieves. I'm worried about him. I think he's going to be difficult to outrun, but I think I'm sitting on the right horse this weekend, especially with the way the draw went. Sometimes it's much easier to get a horse to relax when you draw the outside. Fortunately, that's where we're at." Stevens will be attempting to win the Santa Anita Derby for a record fourth straight year Saturday.

**L'CARRIERE LANDS IN NEW YORK** L'Carriere (Carr de Naskra), third in the Dubai World Cup March 27, arrived back in the States Wednesday night and was bedded down at the Belmont Park Quarantine barn by 10:30 p.m. "It was a 22-hour trip, including a seven-hour layover in Amsterdam," said his groom, Homero Hernandez, who accompanied the H. James Bond charge on the trip. "It was a terrific trip--they treated us all like kings." Once released from quarantine, L'Carriere will head north to Bond's farm in upstate New York for a month's vacation before returning to Belmont for a summer campaign.

**OJC BIDS FOR TELEPHONE WAGERING** The Ontario Jockey Club is seeking permission from the Canadian Pari-Mutuel Agency to begin telephone account betting. The OJC had hoped to institute the telephone betting in conjunction with the 24-hour horse racing television channel it is spearheading, which could go on the air next year. The OJC will have its application for the television channel heard by the Canadian Radio/Television & Telecommunications Commission next month; in the event the CRTC rejects the application, the OJC is hoping to launch the telephone account wagering in the interim. The OJC is also applying for an injunction to deal with its locked-out mutuel employees, who have been out of work since Feb. 26. Picket lines have caused problems since opening day, March 23, limiting access to the track and causing dwindling attendance; hostilities have also sent some to the hospital.

**RIVER DOWNS DENIED DERBY SIMULCAST** Officials at Churchill Downs have denied River Downs in Cincinnati, Ohio the right to simulcast the 122nd running of the Kentucky Derby May 2, 1996 or to take advance wagering the day before. It is believed to be the only track in North America to have such a restriction. "After careful consideration, we felt for a lot of reasons that creating an exclusive distributorship for the Cincinnati market was in our best interest," said David Carrico, senior vice-president of Churchill Downs. River Downs General Manager Jack Hanessian said, "The Kentucky Derby has always been one of our best days. Then, in 1994, we were restricted to advance wagering only, and still the fans wagered over \$245,000. Last year we were able to wager and watch the Derby live and the local fans wagered over \$416,000." For the first time, Churchill Downs has also denied River Downs the right to simulcast the Kentucky Oaks Friday, May 1.

**MR. LEADER PENSIONED** Mr. Leader (Hail to Reason), who had been standing stud at Nuckols Farm in Midway, Kentucky, has been pensioned. The 30-year-old stallion, who set a new track record at Arlington Park in 1970 when he won the 1 1/8-mile Stars and Stripes H. in 1:47 2/5, sired 78 stakes-winners and the earners of over \$38 million. His best runners include GI Santa Anita H. winners Ruhlmann and Martial Law, GI Travers S. winner Wise Times, and additional Grade I winners Quiet Little Table and Hurry Up Blue. Charles Nuckols Jr., owner of Nuckols Farm, said Mr. Leader was pensioned because of a recently developed pituitary gland problem that hindered his fertility, along with temporary foot problems.

**JOHN HARRIS ELECTED PRESIDENT OF CTBA** John C. Harris, owner of Harris Farms in Coalinga, California, was elected president of the California Thoroughbred Breeders' Association following the resignation of the CTBA's entire executive committee during a CTBA Board of Directors meeting April 3. Harris said, "The Board regrets the resignations but feels the CTBA is well-positioned to move forward for the good of the industry." Other new officials elected include Edwin J. Gregson, vice president; F. Jack Liebau, secretary; and Myron Johnson, treasurer.

Trainer Ben Perkins Sr. reports that there is a 50-50 chance GII Hutcheson S. winner **Appealing Skier** (Baldski) will run in the GII \$700,000 Toyota Blue Grass S. April 13. The three-year-old colt drilled a sharp five furlongs in :59 2/5 at Keeneland Thursday. "He worked beautiful today, magnificent," Perkins said.

Ashland S. candidates **My Flag** (Easy Goer) and **Mackie** (Summer Squall) worked four furlongs in :47 3/5 and :48 respectively Thursday at Keeneland. My Flag, winner of the GII Bonnie Miss S. March 13 at Gulfstream, was timed in :24 for the first quarter and galloped out five-eighths in 1:00 3/5. Mackie's trainer Elliott Walden was pleased with his filly's work. "I'm real happy--it's just what I wanted," he said. Mackie was second in her most recent start, the GIII Fair Grounds Oaks March 16. The GI \$500,000a Ashland S. for three-year-old fillies will be contested April 20.

**Local News, Turfway Park:**

Turfway Park established a new wagering record on Jim Beam Stakes Day, March 30, when \$12,416,995 was wagered on-track, at Kentucky intertrack and off-track facilities and at outlets around the country conducting betting on all or part of the track's racing program. The 1996 total shattered the prior mark of \$11,102,651 set on Jim Beam Stakes Day in 1994. In addition to establishing a new betting mark, Turfway recorded the second largest attendance in its history on Jim Beam Day, when 19,552 fans turned out. The record stands at 20,189, set in 1994.
